SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS SEWERAGE FARM, WERRIBEE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the fourteenth day of March, 1922, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifteenth day of March, 1922, respecting the protection of native game at the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Sewerage Farm, Werribee, and in lieu thereof direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*:—

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO

Nineteen thousand eight hundred and forty acres, more or less, County of Grant, Parishes of Mambourin, Cocoroc and Murteaim: Commencing at the northern angle of Crown allotment 22A, Town of Werribee, Parish of Mambourin; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundary of Geelong-road to the western angle of Crown allotment 4, section 10, Parish of Cocoroc; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the last-mentioned Crown allotment to the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 2, section 12, Parish of Cocoroc; thence southerly by the eastern and westerly by the southern boundary of the last-mentioned Crown allotment for a distance of 3,802 links; thence southerly by a line bearing S. 11 deg. 26½ min. southerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned Crown allotment for a distance of 4,306 links; thence easterly by a line bearing N. 89 deg. 43½ min. E. for a distance of 7,949½ links; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of Crown allotment B, section 25, Parish of Murteaim, and a line in continuation to the northern boundary of Crown section 22, Parish of Murteaim; thence westerly by the last-mentioned boundary, and southerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned Crown allotment to the south-western angle thereof; thence westerly by a line to the north-eastern angle of lot 23 on plan of subdivision No. 7,173 lodged in the Office of Titles; thence westerly by the northern boundary and southerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned lot and the last-mentioned boundary produced to the northern boundary of lot 30 on plan of subdivision No. 7,173 aforesaid; thence westerly by the last-mentioned boundary, southerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned lot and a line in continuation to the northern boundary of Crown section 7, Parish of Murteaim; thence westerly by the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of 1,951½ links; thence southerly by a line bearing S. 0 deg. 6 min. West for a distance of 8,046 links; thence easterly by a line bearing N. 89 deg. 56 min. east to a line parallel to and 40 chains distant from the high-water mark on the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay; thence generally north-easterly by the last-mentioned line to the right bank of Werribee River; thence generally northerly by the right bank of Werribee River to the northern boundary of Crown allotment 3, section A, Parish of Mambourin; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the last-mentioned

Crown allotment to the eastern boundary of the Outfall Sewer Reserve; thence north-easterly by the last-mentioned boundary to the right bank of Werribee River; thence generally northerly by the right bank of Werribee River to the southern boundary of Lot 22 on plan of subdivision No. 4,509 lodged in the Office of Titles; thence south-westerly and north-westerly by the last-mentioned boundary to the western boundary of Crown portion 1, section 7, Parish of Mambourin; thence westerly by a line across a Government road to the western boundary thereof; thence northerly by the last-mentioned boundary to the eastern angle of Crown allotment 22A, Town of Werribee, Parish of Mambourin; thence north-westerly by the north-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned Crown allotment to the commencing point.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 6, 7, and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

NURSES BOARD.

AMENDMENTS TO THE NURSES REGULATIONS.

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 29 of the *Nurses Act 1928* and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations, which shall come into force on publication in the *Government Gazette*:—

1. Repeal Regulation 12.
2. Substitute therefor—

(1) Every trainee shall before commencing her training produce the Leaving, Intermediate, or Victorian Merit Certificate, produce evidence from the Head Master or Head Mistress of a public or secondary school that she has reached a standard above the Merit Certificate of Victoria, or shall pass the Board's qualifying educational examination.

(2) For the purposes of this Regulation the period within which evidence of educational qualifications shall be produced, prescribed in sub-clause (1), shall be deemed to include the first three months of the period of training.

HENLEY ON THE MARIBYRNONG.

NOTICE TO BOATMEN AND OTHERS.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that Henley on the Maribyrnong will be held on Saturday, 4th February, 1939, and that persons in charge of motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day and night shall observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand and carry a bucket for fire-extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit shall be exposed. An approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be carried.

Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

After sunset, rowing boats shall have a white light exhibited.

All boats must give way to racing boats going upstream to the start of the course.

Rating By-law for the Year ending 30th September, 1939.

THAT the Chiltern Shire Council, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of Twenty-one pence in the pound of the annual valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Chiltern Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building), be less than One pound fifteen shillings, and in respect of land on which there is no building, less than Eight shillings and nine pence.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year ending 30th September, 1939, and shall be payable on the 1st day of February, 1939, at the office of the said Council.

For water supplied by the Council for domestic as well as other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Council) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and nine pence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount which would be payable for lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

All water supplied by measure by the Council to be charged at the rate of One shilling and nine pence per 1,000 gallons. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

BOROUGH RIDING WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

Rating By-law for the Year ending 30th September, 1939.

THE Council of the Shire of Creswick, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Borough Riding of the Shire of Creswick Water Supply District.

On such lands and tenements a rate of Fifteen pence in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation not exceeding £45, and Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding £45 but not exceeding £99, and Ten pence in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding £99.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty-five shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Twelve shillings and six pence.

Such rates are made and levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said land and tenements for the year commencing 1st October, 1938, and shall be payable Saturday, 28th January, 1939, at the office of the Council.

For water supplied by the Council for domestic as well as for other than domestic use by measure (except in cases of special arrangement with the Council), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied other than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Council shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

The charge for water troughs shall be Twelve shillings and six pence per annum.

The charge for water supplied at stand-pipes shall be Nine pence per load of 180 gallons.

THE HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 41.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Hamilton Waterworks (hereinafter referred to as the Trust), the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby

pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act make the following By-law for such Urban District:—

1. During the period commencing with the twenty-eighth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, no person shall use or permit to be used or allowed to run on any premises any water for other than domestic purposes, manufacturing, or fire fighting purposes, or use a hose to convey water supplied by the Trust for other than fire fighting purposes.

2. Every person who shall use or permit or suffer water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

3. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongly does, causes, or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rates payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Forty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Twenty-five shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1939, and shall be payable on the 1st day of February, 1939, at the office of the Trust.

For water supplied by the Trust for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of rate which would be payable for lands and tenements so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Trust by measure in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to and including 1,000,000 gallons, any quantity in excess of 1,000,000 gallons to be charged for at the rate of Nine pence per 1,000 gallons.

Water supplied to public gardens and parks and the sanitary depot shall be charged for by special measure at Three pence per 1,000 gallons. The charge for water supplied by measurement shall be paid quarterly.

The Trust will, if it thinks fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Ten shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate charged for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due, and must be paid in advance on the 1st day of February, 1939.

Every person who shall use or permit or suffer water supplied by the Commission to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Commission.

5. If any person supplied with water by the Commission wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Commission may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Commission to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

A By-law of the City of Brunswick, made under section 197 (7) of the Local Government Act 1928, for appointing standing places for motor cars and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the above Act, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick order as follows:—

1. The streets or parts thereof set out in the schedule hereto shall be and are hereby appointed by the Council of the City of Brunswick as standing places for motor cars for the purpose of setting down and picking up passengers for picnics, sporting events, and the like where such motor cars are capable of carrying more than six passengers. No streets or parts thereof or public places other than those appointed by the Council shall be used for such purpose.

2. The person next driving or taking charge of any motor car or the registered owner of any motor car offending against this By-law shall, until the contrary is proved, be deemed to be the driver of such motor car.

3. The provisions of this By-law shall not apply to any standing places or stands already or hereafter appointed by any public authority as standing places or stands for vehicles licensed as hackney carriages or motor omnibuses.

4. Any person who without authority shall on any pretext pretend to be a parking area attendant or other officer appointed by the Council to receive fees from drivers or other persons for parking motor cars, or who shall in any way assume the duties of a parking area attendant or such other officer as aforesaid, or who shall otherwise obstruct, hinder, or delay any parking area attendant, or other officer as aforesaid, in the execution of his duty, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any wilful contravention of any of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

6. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. By-laws Nos. 73, 92, and 110 are hereby repealed.

8. By-law No. 108 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) Paragraph 61 is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof, the following paragraph is inserted:—

61. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a maximum penalty as follows:—

- For a breach of paragraphs 7, 9 (1), 9 (18), 11 (1), 12, 17, 22, 24, 25, 26, 27, or 43 (1)—Five pounds.
- For a breach of paragraph 8—Twenty-five pounds.
- For a breach of paragraph 9 (2) (3) (4)—Twenty pounds.
- For a breach of any other paragraph—Ten pounds.

Provided that such repeal shall not prejudice or affect any prosecution for any act or omission prior to the coming into operation of this By-law.

A By-law of the City of Brunswick made under section 197 (7) of the Local Government Act 1928, for appointing standing places for motor cars.

1. (a) The public places or parts thereof set out in the schedule hereto (hereinafter called "Parking Areas") shall be and are hereby appointed by the Council as standing places for motor cars.

(b) A driver may park his car in any parking area within such times only as are prescribed by the Council upon payment of the prescribed fee and not otherwise.

(c) The Council may appoint from time to time such officers as it thinks proper to supervise such parking areas, and every driver shall pay to such supervising officer a fee of One shilling per day or portion of a day for each motor car parked by such driver in any such parking area or areas within the hours so prescribed. The person next driving or taking charge of any such motor car or the registered owner of any such motor car parked as aforesaid shall, until the contrary is proved, be deemed to be the driver who parked such motor car on any such parking area.

2. The days and hours during which such parking areas shall be available for parking shall be as follows:—

On days upon which football matches are being played on the football ground at Brunswick Park Recreation Reserve between the hours of two and six o'clock in the afternoon.

3. A driver shall, in any parking area, park his motor car as directed by the officer of the Council in charge of such parking area, or if no such officer is present, in the order of his arrival thereat and in such a manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to other motor cars already parked, and also in such a way as will permit the drivers of other parked cars to leave their respective positions without difficulty.

4. Any wilful contravention of any of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

5. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE REGISTRATION OF DANCING ROOMS OR SALOONS, WITHIN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* power is given to the Council of the City of Melbourne to register on the application of twenty householders resident in the immediate locality for such term on payment of such sum and subject to such conditions as the Council may direct any room or saloon within the City of Melbourne (not in the premises of a licensed publican) as a dancing room or saloon where payment may be received or taken for admission thereto.

Now therefore the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890* and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

1. The Regulations and conditions for the registration of dancing rooms or saloons adopted by the Council of the City of Melbourne on the twenty-third day of April, 1877, are hereby repealed.

Provided that such repeal shall not affect any registration made under the said Regulations and conditions before the commencement of these Regulations and conditions.

2. On the application of twenty householders resident in the immediate locality the Council may register any room or saloon within the City of Melbourne (not in the premises of a licensed publican) as a dancing room or saloon where payment may be received or taken for admission thereto.

3. The term for which each such registration shall be made shall be twelve months dating from the first day of January in each year.

4. (a) The sum to be paid to the Town Clerk for the registration of each such room or saloon for any such term or part thereof shall be—

Accommodation shall be calculated according to the floor space of each room or saloon on the basis that eight square feet of floor space is required for each person.

(b) The sum to be paid for the transfer of any such registration shall be two shillings and six pence.

5. The conditions of registration and of every renewal thereof are as follows:—

(i) Every dancing room or saloon, must comply with all regulations under the *Health Act 1928* or any Act amending the same relating to public buildings.

(ii) Any authorized officer of the Council may enter and inspect any dancing room or saloon at any time during the day time or at any time when such dancing room or saloon is open to the public at night.

(iii) No dancing room or saloon shall be open to the public on a Sunday.
