SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS SEWERAGE FARM, WERRIBEE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c.,

NURSES BOARD.

AMENDMENTS TO THE NURSES REGULATIONS.

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 29 of the Nurses Act 1928 and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations, which shall come into force on publication in the Government Gazette:—

1. Repeal Regulation 12,

2. Substitute therefor-

Substitute therefor—

(1) Every trainee shall before commencing her training produce the Leaving, Intermediate, or Victorian Merit Certificate, produce evidence from the Head Master or Head Mistress of a public or secondary school that she has reached a standard above the Merit Certificate of Victoria, or shall pass the Board's qualifying educational expenination examination.

(2) For the purposes of this Regulation the period within which evidence of educational qualifications-shall be produced, prescribed in sub-clause (1), shall be deemed to include the first three months of the period of training. Dated this 31st day of December, 1938.

MARIBYRNONG RIVER.

HENLEY ON THE MARIBYRNONG.

NOTICE TO BOATMEN AND OTHERS.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that Henley on the Maribyrnong will be held on Saturday, 4th February, 1939, and that persons in charge of motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day and night shall observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand and carry a bucket for fire-extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit shall be exposed. An approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be carried.

All non-competing boats shall be kept off the course during the racing programme, and the direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

Passengers on any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark, and no boat deemed by the River Officer; or his deputy, to be too large, or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly, shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

No fireworks or firearms are to be discharged from any boats, unless permission of the River Officer or his deputy has been given for so doing.

After sunset, motor boats shall have a red light exhibited, and shall go slow.

Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

After sunset, rowing boats shall have a white light exhibited.

All boats must give way to raving boats going upstream to the start of the course.

 - 39. (c) The last preceding clause shall not apply 'to any wooden building erected prior to the coming into force of the principal By-law, nor to any addition or alteration hereafter made to any such wooden building.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the parts of the municipality described in the schedule hereto.

- 2. The person next driving or taking charge of any motor car or the registered owner of any motor car offending against this By-law shall; until the contrary is proved, be deemed to be the driver of such motor car.
- 3. The provisions of this By-law shall not apply to any standing places or stands already or hereafter appointed by any public authority as standing places or stands for vehicles licensed as hackney carriages or motor omnibuses.

Any person who without authority shall on any pretext pretend to be a parking area attendant or other officer appointed by the Council to receive fees from drivers or other persons for parking motor cars, or who shall in any way assume the duties of a parking area attendant or such other officer as aforesaid, or who shall otherwise obstruct, hinder, or delay any parking area attendant, or other officer as aforesaid, in the execution of his duty, shall be guilty of an offence.

(c) The Council may appoint from time to time such officers as it thinks proper to supervise such parking areas, and every driver shall pay to such supervising officer a fee of One shilling per day or portion of a day for each motor car parked by such driver in any such parking area or areas within the hours so prescribed. The person next driving or taking charge of any such motor car or the registered owner of any such motor car parked as aforesaid shall until the contrary is proved, be deemed to be the driver who parked such motor car on any such parking area.

2. The days and hours during which such parking areas shall be available for parking shall be as follows:—

On days upon which football matches are being played on the football ground at Brunswick Park Recreation Reserve between the hours of two and six o'clock in the afternoon.
