### RULES UNDER THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACTS.

RULES MADE BY THE WORKERS COMPENSATION BOARD UNDER THE Workers' Compensation Acts; Pursuant to the Workers' Compensation (Transfer of Funds) Act 1931 (No. 3952).

N these Rules, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter---

The word "Act" means the Workers' Compensation Acts and any amending Act.
The word "Board" means the Workers Compensation Board as

constituted from time to time. The word "Registrar" means a Registrar or Deputy Registrar of

the Board.

In these Rules words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females.

1. Where money is paid into the custody of the Board in Victoria under the Act for the benefit of any worker or dependants resident or about to reside in any of the parts of the Empire mentioned in the first column of the schedule to these Rules the Board may on the application of the worker or dependants order the money to be transferred to such part of the Empire in which the worker or dependants are resident or are about to reside there to be administered for the benefit of the worker or dependants in such manner as the competent authority in such part of the Empire may think fit and may in such order make any request regarding the administration of the money.

2. Where an order has been made for the transfer of money under the last preceding paragraph the Registrar shall transmit a sealed copy of the Order to the officer indicated in the second column of the said schedule and a crossed cheque for the amount held in trust for the worker or dependants to the officer indicated in the third column of the said schedule. The Registrar shall in forwarding the copy of the order inform the addressee that the money is being so transmitted, and also inform him of the name of the person to whom such money is being

3. Where money paid under the law relating to Workmen's Compensation in force in any of the parts of the Empire indicated in the first column of the said schedule is transferred in pursuance of an order of any competent authority in any such part to the Board for the benefit of a worker or dependants residing within the jurisdiction of the Board the Board shall receive and administer the money for the benefit of the worker or dependants as if it were compensation paid into the custody of the Board for his or their benefit under the Act and shall, so far as possible consistently with that object, take into account and act upon any request contained in the order of the transmitting authority regarding the administration of the money.

4. On the receipt of the money so transferred the Registrar shall send notice in writing thereof to the worker or dependants and may require him or them to attend the Board in order that he or they may give the Registrar such information as he may require and receive any

money payable to him or them.

5. The Board shall not charge any fees in respect of the administration of the money. SCHEDULE.

A By-law to provide for licensing, regulating, and limiting the number of motor cars used as backney carriages plying, kept, or let out for hire within the City of Melbourne and within the distance of 8 miles from the corporate limits of the said city, and the owners and drivers of such motor cars, and to amend By-law No. 239.

W HEREAS by the Carriage Acts power is given to the Council of the City of Melbourne from time to time to make By-laws for licensing, regulating, and limiting the number of hackney carriages within the said city and the vicinity within a distance of 8 miles from the corporate limits of the said city, and the owners and drivers of such hackney carriages: And whereas by the Motor Car Act 1928 it is provided that a motor car duly registered under that Act shall be deemed to be a hackney carriage if so used and that the law relating to hackney carriages and to the drivers and conductors thereof shall apply accordingly: Now therefore the said Council doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Acts and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

- 1. This By-law shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construct as one with By-law No. 239, initialled "A By-law to provide for licensing and regulating motor cars used as backney carriages and the owners and drivers thereof plying for hire within the City of Melbourne and within a distance of 8 miles from the corporate limits of the said city." limits of the said city
  - 2. By-law No. 239 shall be amended as follows:---
    - (i) In clause 1-
      - (a) The interpretation of motor taxi cab therein contained shall be deleted.
      - (b) The following interpretations shall be inserted therein immediately after the interpretation of "motor omnibus":-
        - "Public place" includes every public highway, road, street, stand, court, alley, passage, thoroughfare, or open place to which the public has or is permitted to have access within the metropolitan area.
        - "Motor taxi csb" means a motor car other than a motor omnibus, motor cab, or motor charabane which plies for hire in a public place.
        - "Private hire car" means a motor car other than a motor omnibus, motor cab, or motor charabane which is kept or let out for hire within the metropolitan area but which does not ply for hire in a public place. "Hire and drive yourself car" means a private hire car driven by the hirer.
  - (ii) For clause 3 there shall be substituted the following clause:
    - 3 (i) No person shall ply for hire with or keep or let out or use for hire any motor car within the metropoltian area unless and until such motor car is duly licensed by the Council the Council. ' ...

- (ii) No person shall apply for hire with any private hire car in any public place within the metropolitan area.
- (iii) In clause 9 there shall be added at the end thereof

the words following:-This clause shall not apply to the hirer of a hire and drive yourself car.

- (iv) Immediately after the words "motor car" where they first appear in clause 19 and where they appear in clause 20 there shall be inserted the words following -"other than a hire and drive yourself car."
- (v) There shall be substituted for clause 40 the following clause:

  40. Every driver of a motor car other than a hire and drive yourself car shall whilst acting as driver wears his badge in the lapel of his coat.

  (vi) In clause 41 immediately after the word "driver" there shall be inserted the words following—"other than the driver of a hire and drive yourself car."

  (vii) For clause 69 there shall be substituted the following
- (vii) For clause 62 there shall be substituted the following clause:
  - 62. (a) Every motor taxi cab shall be equipped

1. A taximeter having recording drums so arranged that the taximeter will register in "thirds of a mile" for distance and in "units of five minutes" for detention, and will record the fares in accordance with the scale prescribed by this By-law or any amendment thereof.

2. A sign not exceeding 7 inches x

2½ inches in dimension having the words "For Hire" thereon in plain block letters at least 2 inches high and of an adequate breadth and in clear contrast with the background. Such sign shall be capable of being illuminated and shall be fixed to the cost of such motor, taxi, each or put is roof of such motor taxi cab or put in such position as shall be approved by the inspector. Every motor taxi cab plying for hire after sunset and before sunrise shall have such sign illuminated. illuminated.

(b) Every private hire car shall, unless equipped with a speedometer approved by the inspector, be equipped with a taximeter.

- (viii) For clause 75 there shall be substituted the following clause:
  - 75. As from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation the number of motor taxicabs licensed to ply for hire in a public place within the metropolitan area shall be limited to 550 and the number of private hire cars licensed to be kept or let out for hire within the metropolitan area sept or let out for hire within the metropolitan area shall be limited to 450: Provided that the Council may license as a private hire car any private hire car which, prior to the sixteenth day of February, 1939, was kept or let out for hire within the metropolitan area and may from time to time renew any such licence notwithstanding the said limitation of the number of private hire cars licensed as aforesaid. aforesaid.
- (ix) Paragraphs (c) and (f) of clause 2 of Schedule B shall be deleted.
- (x) In Schedule C there shall be inserted before the words "taxi cab" wherever appearing the word "motor."
- 3. The charge for the hire of a private hire car other than a hire and drive yourself car shall be calculated as follows:—

  (i) According to the distance travelled by such car from the place of picking-up to the place of setting-down the hirer at a rate of not less than 1s. for one-third of a mile, or any part thereof, and for each additional one-third of a mile, or any part thereof.
  - (ii) According to the time that such car shall be detained by the hirer and not be in motion during such hiring, at the rate of 3½d, for each five minutes, or any part thereof.
- 4. No private hire car'shall have the top of its roof painted except with a colour approved by the inspector.
- 5. The hirer of a hire and drive yourself car shall not use such car for the purpose of carrying passengers for reward.
- 6. Clause 88 of By-law No. 239 is hereby repeated.

Suppressing Noisy Animals.

A By-law of the City of Heidelberg made under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1928, and particularly under and with reference to sections 197 (x) and 197 (xxxiii), and numbered 125, for "Suppressing nuisances and generally for maintaining the good rule of the Municipality."

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg hereby order as follows:-

- 1. No person shall have or allow within or about any house, building, or premises any noisy animal or bird which shall be or cause a nuisance or annoyance to any person residing in the neighbourhood of such house, building, or premises, provided that no proceedings for a breach of this By-law shall be taken until a complaint in writing has been lodged with the Town Clerk, signed by at least three householders residing within hearing of such noisy animal or bird, and until the expiration of fourteen days from date of notice served by the Town Clerk after receiving such complaint on such person having or allowing such noisy animal or bird upon such house, building, or premises as aforesaid notifying such person of such nuisance or annoyance and requiring him to abate the same. abate the same.
- 2. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £20, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

This By-law shall have force and apply throughout the municipal district of Heidelberg.

### BY-LAW NO. 126.

### Preserving Good Order in Council Buildings.

- A By-law of the City of Heidelberg made under the Local Government Act 1928, and particularly under and with reference to Part VII., and numbered 126, for preserving good order and decency in any building belonging to the Municipality or under the control and management of the Council, or preventing damage to such building or to the furniture and fittings thereof, and for preserving public decency and for preventing and extinguishing fires.
- I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg order as follows:—
- City of Heidelberg order as follows:—

  1. In this By-law the word "building" shall mean a building belonging to the Municipality or under the control and management of the Council, the word "Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Heidelberg, the word "Municipality" shall mean the Municipality of the City of Heidelberg, and the words "fire prevention appliance" shall mean any appliance, plant, machinery, or thing, whether part of attached to or placed in any building and used or intended to be used for the purpose of preventing, controlling, extinguishing, or preventing the extension of fire, and includes without affecting the generality of the foregoing any safety curtain or smoke flue to any stage and the ropes, tackle, windlass, and other gear thereof or relating thereto or any hoses, taps, hydrants, sprinklers, or portable fire extinguishers.

  2. No person shall in any building—
  - 2. No person shall in any building-
    - (a) behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening, insulting, violent, quarrelsome, or disorderly manner.
    - (b) use any threatening, abusive, obscene, indecent, or insulting words.
- 3. No person shall enter into or remain in any building while in a drunken or intoxicated condition.
- 4. No person shall expectorate upon the floor, walls, furniture, or fittings of any building.
- 5. No person shall cut, mark, deface, or otherwise damage or injure any building or any part thereof or the furniture or fittings of any building.

- 6. No person shall in any building stand on any chair, seat, or table, or stand or sit on any window sill, parapet, roof, gutter, gable roof, or parapet cornice of any building.
- .7. No person shall use any stair handrail otherwise than for support or assistance by hand in ascending or descending such
- 8. No person shall in any way interfere with or destroy, damage, or injure any fire prevention appliance of or in any building.
- 9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the municipality.
