PROCLAMATION

No. 4658. "An Act to validate the Appointment and Constitution under the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* of the Body known as The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board, and for purposes connected therewith."

NATIONAL SECURITY ACT 1939 OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Regulations intituled the National Security (Fair Rents) Regulations made by the Governor-General in Council under the *National Security Act 1939* of the Commonwealth of Australia it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council of a State may, for the purposes of the said Regulations, constitute Fair Rents Boards in the State at such places as he thinks fit and that each such Board shall consist of a Police, Stipendiary or Special Magistrate and, if the Governor in Council thinks fit, two other persons: And whereas it is desirable that Fair Rents Boards be constituted throughout the State of Victoria consisting of a Police Magistrate sitting alone: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, for the purposes of the said Regulations do hereby constitute a Fair Rents Board at each place in the State of Victoria at which a Court of Petty Sessions has been or may hereafter be appointed to be holden under the provisions of the Justices Acts of the State of Victoria and do hereby appoint any Police Magistrate for

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the time being assigned to adjudicate at any such Court of Petty Sessions to constitute the Fair Rents Board at the place at which the said Court of Petty Sessions is appointed to be holden as aforesaid.

NATIONAL SECURITY ACT 1939 OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Regulations intituled the National Security (Fair Rents) Regulations made by the Governor-General in Council under the *National Security Act 1939* of the Commonwealth of Australia it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council of a State may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of that State, declare that the rent payable by the lessee of any dwelling-house or shop in that State shall not, during the period commencing on the twenty-seventh day of September, 1939, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1939, exceed the rent payable in respect of that dwelling-house or shop as at the thirty-first day of August, 1939: And whereas it is desirable that a Proclamation as aforesaid should be made for and with respect to the State of Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim that subject to the said National Security (Fair Rents) Regulations within the State of Victoria and during the said period the rent payable by the lessee of any dwelling-house or shop as defined in the said Regulations shall not exceed the rent payable in respect of that dwelling-house or shop as at the thirty-first day of August, 1939.

Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the area of Crown land comprised in Class 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF HAWTHORN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Hawthorn has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Hawthorn aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Rule 29 of the Rules of the Council of Legal Education made the 29th day of December, 1932, as amended by the Rules of the Council made the 21st day of May, 1936, is amended by omitting paragraphs (a), (b), and (c), and inserting in their place the following paragraphs:—

"(a) on duty for any period as a member of any naval, military, air, civil, or other force or service (howsoever designated) raised or formed by or under the authority of any Government for or in connexion with the defence of the Commonwealth of Australia or any other part of the British Empire;

(b) for any further period not exceeding thirty days in each year with the consent of the person to whom he is bound."

Motor omnibuses shall for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers, stop at such points on the near side of cross streets upon the route, as may be convenient and desirable and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads, or the safety of passengers in motor omnibuses.

FARES TO BE CHARGED.

The fares prescribed under the heading "Fares to be Charged" shall be the fares to be charged for adults. The fares to be charged for children under twelve years of age (other than children under three years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers calculated to the nearest higher penny.

LICENSING AUTHORITY.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 15 (1) (c) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742) the Governor in Council by this Order confers upon the Licensing Authority full power and authority for carrying into effect by the said Licensing Authority of the foregoing provisions of this Order.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following additional Regulations in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council, dated the 8th February, 1887, as a site for Racecourse and other purposes of public recreation in the Parish of Tallarook, and known as the "Seymour Racecourse Reserve."

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by an officer or employee of the Committee of Management to leave the same.
2. The Committee of Management shall have power to let the Reserve or any portion thereof, to any club or association for the purpose of laying out golf links and playing golf, subject to the payment of such rent and/or fees, and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, nor any other person shall play, practise, train, or engage in any game of sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, unless any such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve at such time: Provided that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the Reserve and play golf thereon on paying to the club or association for the time being leasing the Reserve, or to the Committee of Management, a green fee not exceeding Three shillings per day or part thereof; or of Five shillings per week.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5) and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

- (b) *Posts* shall be not less than 4 x 4 inches in cross sectional area for corner and gate posts, plated and strutted on all four sides, and intermediate posts shall be not less than 4 x 3 inches, plated and strutted on two sides and spaced not more than 9 feet apart.
- (c) *Rails* shall be 4 x 2 inches for top rail and not less than 3 x 2 inches for lower rail, or both rails may be two out of hardwood timber of dimensions 4 x 4 inches.
- (d) *Plinth* shall be not less than 6 x 1½ inches.
- (e) *Depth in Ground* shall be not less than 2 feet.
- (f) *Height* above ground level shall be not less than 4 ft. 6 in.
- (g) *Gates* must be properly framed and constructed and hung with suitable hinges and must not open on to footpaths.
