Factories and Shops Acts. FURNITURE DEALERS TRADE TRIBUNAL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that section 40 of the said Act shall extend and apply to and in respect of any trade specified in such Proclamation other than the trade of making or baking bread, or in the trade of delivering bread: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council by such Proclamation may appoint a trade tribunal of the name, style, or designation stated therein, to have, exercise, and perform in relation to the trade specified as aforesaid the powers and duties conferred upon the Bread Trade Tribunal by section 40 of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Proclamation hereby declare that section 40 of the said Act shall, from the date hereof, extend and apply to and in respect of the trade relating to persons employed in the business of a seller of furniture or floor coverings.

And doth by this Proclamation appoint a trade tribunal styled the Furniture Dealers Trade Tribunal, to have, exercise, and perform in relation to the trade above specified, the powers and duties conferred by section 40 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, upon the Bread Trade Tribunal.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Dandenong has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved and used as a road by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved and used as a road hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Dandenong aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.—PUBLIC HIGHWAY.

All that piece of land, being part of Crown allotment A, section 12, Parish of Dandenong, County of Bourke: Commencing at a point distant from the intersection of the east side of Springvale-road and the south boundary of Lightwood-road south 0 deg. 32 min. east 292 ft. 1½ in., south 0 deg. 9 min. east 184 ft. ¼ in.; thence bounded by lines respectively as follows:—South 80 deg. 59 min. east 323 ft. 11 in., south 0 deg. 22 min. east 10 feet, north 89 deg. 59 min. west 158 ft. 11½ in., south 44 deg. 56 min. west 14 ft. 1½ in., south 0 deg. 9 min. east 267 feet, south 45 deg. 4 min. east 14 ft. 2 in., south 89 deg. 59 min. east 159 ft. 11½ in., south 0 deg. 22 min. east 10 feet, north 89 deg. 59 min. west 180 feet, north 0 deg. 9 min. west 287 feet, north 45 deg. 4 min. west 14 ft. 2 in., north 89 deg. 59 min. west 140 feet, north 6 deg. 9 min. west 10 feet along the east side of Springvale-road back to the point of commencement.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1923* (No. 3720), sections 518 and 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Melbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter named and described, and situated within the City of Melbourne aforesaid, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act. viz.:—

(b) on the wharf or part of the wharf affected by such Resolution if vessels can berth on one side only of the wharf.

In this and the next succeeding paragraph of this Regulation any two or more wheels joined together or spaced less than two feet six inches apart from centre to centre, either laterally or otherwise, shall be deemed to be one wheel.

(2) By inserting in paragraph 18 after the words "move the same on" the words "or allow the same to stand upon."

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF CARLTON AND FLAGSTAFF GARDENS, FLEMINGTON AND KENSINGTON PUBLIC PARK, CURTAIN SQUARE, AND POWLETT SQUARE.

WHEREAS the lands known as the Carlton Gardens, the Flagstaff Gardens, the Flemington and Kensington Public Park, Curtain Square, and Powlett Square, and particularly described in Crown grants entered in the register-book, volume 600 folio 119905, volume 600 folio 119907, volume 2441 folio 488130, volume 887 folio 177273, and volume 4505 folio 900953 respectively, have been permanently reserved from sale for public purposes by the Governor in Council, and are vested in the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne: And whereas the Council of the City of Melbourne has erected in each of the said Carlton Gardens, Flagstaff Gardens, Flemington and Kensington Public Park, Curtain Square, and Powlett Square a shelter for old men: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Melbourne do hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of the said gardens, park, and squares, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said gardens, park, and squares:—

1. The said shelters for old men shall be open daily from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m.

2. No person shall at any time take into any such shelter any liquor of an intoxicating nature.

3. No person shall, whilst in a state of intoxication, enter or remain in any such shelter.

4. No person shall in any such shelter play or take part in any gambling or unlawful game or sport.

5. No person shall permit or suffer any dog or other animal under his control to enter or remain in any such shelter.

6. No person shall take a bicycle into any such shelter.

7. No person shall whilst in any such shelter use any indecent or offensive language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

8. No person shall leave in any such shelter any bottles, fruit peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or refuse of any kind.

9. No person shall whilst in any such shelter deliver any public address.

10. No person shall whilst in any such shelter wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of such shelter, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any officer or servant of the Council.

11. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage, or destroy any lock, tap, furniture, or fittings in or about any such shelter, or write upon or deface the walls or partitions of any such shelter.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the trustees or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL PARK IN THE PARISHES OF WANDILIGONG, TOWAMBA, DONDANGADALE, AND EURANDELONG.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations and to rescind Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind clause 13 of the Regulations made on the 22nd day of January, 1929, and doth hereby make the following additional Regulations in respect of the Reserves set out hereunder:—

Two thousand eight hundred and eighty acres reserved by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, in the Parish of Wandiligong, as a site for a National Park; and 23,100 acres reserved by Order in Council of the 6th October, 1908, in the Parishes of Wandiligong, Towamba, Dondangadale, and Eurandelong for a National Park, in addition to and adjoining the land temporarily reserved therefor by Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, both of which are together hereinafter called "The National Park."

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS.

No person shall park a motor car, motor cycle, charabanc, motor truck, or other motor vehicle within the National Park except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management, and every person parking any motor propelled vehicle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Committee of Management, pay the under-mentioned fees:—

- (a) For a motor car or motor cycle, a fee not exceeding 1s. per day;
- (b) for a charabanc or motor truck, a fee not exceeding 2s. per day.

The road to the Horn from the gate at Dingo Dell and the road to the Crystal Brook Reservoir from its junction with the main road shall be closed to all vehicular traffic except that under the control of the Railways Department.

The Reserves have been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly or wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act 1928* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognized.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette* purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling or other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all noxious weeds on the land, and on the half-width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of noxious weeds under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

16. The licensee shall keep the land free from vermin, and, should he fail to do so, the licence shall be liable to forfeiture.

The Minister may grant permission to the licensee to remove any internal fencing to complete the boundary fences.

NOTE.—No provision has been made for the supply of water to these areas, consequently each licensee will be required to make his own arrangements.

3. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty of not less than One pound, nor more than Twenty pounds for each such offence.
