IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and the *Police Offences Act 1928*, the Shire Councillors and the Ratepayers of the Shire of Seymour order as follows:—

That between the hours of 6 a.m. and 12 midnight—

1. No person shall leave, or cause, or permit to be left standing (whether unattended or not) for a greater period than thirty minutes any motor car or other vehicle on the north side of Station-street, Seymour.

2. The driver of a motor car or other vehicle in Station-street shall—

(1) Not stop opposite any railway subway or within 5 feet of any entrance from the street to such subway.

(2) Not leave or allow to remain (whether unattended or not) a motor car or other vehicle in any of the following places:—

(a) in front of a private driveway;

(b) in front of any railway subway or within 5 feet of any entrance from the street to such subway.

3. The driver of a motor vehicle in Station-street, Seymour, shall not turn to the right for the purpose of proceeding in the opposite direction in Station-street, Seymour, between Tallarook-street and Crawford-street.

4. Every person leaving any motor car or other vehicle unattended on the north side of Station-street, Seymour, shall leave such vehicle in such a position that the left or near side wheels are parallel with and not more than 12 inches from the edge of the kerb of the footway and such motor car or other vehicle is not less than three (3) feet from any other vehicle.

5. No person shall stop, stand, or leave a motor car or other vehicle in Station-street, Seymour, in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave less than 15 feet of the width of such street available for the free movement of traffic.

6. The southern side of Station-street, Seymour, to a distance of 21 feet from the railway fence forming the southern boundary of such street, excluding thereout that portion of the said street described in clause 8 hereof, shall be and is hereby appointed by the Council as a standing place for motor cars excepting commercial goods vehicles or commercial passenger vehicles within the meaning of the Transport Regulation Acts, and a driver shall in such parking area park his motor car at an angle of 45 degrees to such fence and no closer than 2 feet from such fence or any seat erected on the said southern side of such street or from any other car in such parking area and in such a manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to other motor cars already parked and also in such a way as will permit the latter to leave their respective positions without difficulty and not otherwise.

7. Notwithstanding anything herein contained no person shall leave or cause or permit to be left standing in Station-street, Seymour, any commercial goods vehicle within the meaning of the Transport Acts (whether unattended or not) except for the purpose of loading or unloading goods and then not for a greater period than 20 minutes.

8. No person shall leave or permit to be left standing any commercial passenger vehicle within the meaning of the Transport Regulation Acts in Station-street, Seymour, except in that portion of the said street being 185 feet from the eastern entrance to the most easterly railway subway in the said street and on the same side of such street. Provided always that such commercial passenger vehicle shall be left in such a position that the left or near side wheels are parallel with and not less than 3 feet or more than 5 feet from the fence forming the southern boundary of such street and such vehicle is not less than 3 feet from any other vehicle.

9. No person shall drive a motor car or other vehicle in Station-street, Seymour, in such a manner as to create at any point a third line of traffic proceeding in the one direction.

DETERMINATION OF THE CEMENT ARTICLES BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons (other than persons under the jurisdiction of the Fibrous Plasterers Board) employed in the trade of making portable articles of cement or concrete," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 20th June, 1940, the adjusted determination which came into force from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in May, 1940, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) ALLOWANCES.—The following allowances in addition to the rates provided in clause 2 (b) shall be paid:—

(a) Lumpers of cement or concrete articles (in and out of tanks) 2d. per hour in respect of such time actually spent in tanks containing water.

(b) For work done away from the employer's place of business—

(i) The fares, exceeding 3d. per day, necessarily expended in going from and to the employee's residence to and from his work.

(ii) For work done at a distance from the employer's place of business if the employee is unable to return to his home the same night, 6s. per day extra for the first seven days, and thereafter 30s. per week extra.

(c) An employee having under his control two or three men and being responsible for the work done by them shall be paid the rate prescribed for the highest class of work over which he is directed to exercise his supervision and take the responsibility, with an addition of 6d. per day.

(4) TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK—

Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.
7 a.m.	1 p.m. on Saturdays, or the day on which the half-holiday is locally observed.
7 a.m.	5.30 p.m. on each of the other five working days of the week.

(5) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done, except where shifts are worked:—

- (a) Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work } Time and a half for first three hours'
- (b) Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed as a week's work } work in any one day and thereafter double time in that day.

(6) SHIFTS.—Where a person is employed on shift work outside the hours of beginning and ending work he shall for each hour while so employed be paid 2d. an hour in addition to above rates.

A shift worker called upon to work overtime in excess of ordinary shift hours shall receive overtime at the rate set out in Clause (5).

(7) TIME WAGES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall be paid, for each hour worked up to 22 hours, as follows:—

- (a) in any week in which two or more public holidays occur At the ordinary wages rate, with an addition of fifty-five per centum;
- (b) in any other week At the ordinary wages rate, with an addition of thirty-eight per centum;

and for each hour worked beyond the 22 hours aforesaid shall be paid the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work.

(8) MIXED FUNCTIONS.—An employee engaged for not less than half of one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If for less than half of one day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

(9) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

(10) TEA MONEY.—An allowance of 2s. for tea money shall be made where work extends for more than two hours beyond the usual time of ending work provided the employer has not given notice of intention to work overtime.

(11) TOOLS, BOOTS, ETC.—The employer shall supply the employee with all requisite tools and gloves for the performance of his duties, and when the employee is called upon to work in water he shall be provided with suitable boots and waders.

Where a man's place of work is outside the factory buildings and he is required to carry on such work in the rain, his employer shall furnish him with a waterproof overcoat whilst so employed.

(12) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—Wages shall be paid during working hours.

(13) HEALTH PROVISIONS.—The employer shall provide and maintain in a satisfactory state—

- (a) proper latrine services;
- (b) suitable change house accommodation with provision for drying clothes;
- (c) suitable accommodation for employees to have their meals.

(14) ANNUAL HOLIDAYS.—Any employee who has been in the service of the same employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted the following holidays on full pay, viz:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, and all intervening working days. Should an employee's services be terminated before the expiration of twelve months' service or before the completion of any subsequent year of service, he shall be entitled in lieu of holidays to two and a half hours' pay for each completed month of service.

(15) RIGHT OF ENTRY OF UNION OFFICIALS.—For the purpose of interviewing employees on legitimate union business, a duly accredited representative of the Australian Workers' Union shall have the right to enter, during the midday meal hour, the portion of any employer's establishment in which any of the classes of labour covered by this Determination are employed.

If any representative is unduly interfering with, or is creating disaffection amongst his employees, or is offensive in his methods, such employer may refuse the right of entry.

(16) PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.—The wages rates set out in clause (2) (b) are based upon the following basic wage and pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time as such basic wage. Provided that the wages of apprentices and improvers shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage, such adjustments to be to the nearest 3d., half or less than half of 3d. to be disregarded.

The basic wage shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause (17).

(17) ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.—(a) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1940, the amount of the basic wage shall be as prescribed in clause (16).

(b) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in an August, a November, a February, or a May, the amount of the basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" retail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician:—

- (1) The index number set to be applied is that assigned to Melbourne.
- (2) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period of thirteen weeks for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.

Provided that outside the Metropolitan District another holiday may be substituted for Melbourne Cup Day in Clauses 6 and 7.

(8) MEAL INTERVALS.—

- (a) Males.
 - (i) In places where work is done on Saturdays—
A lunch period of not less than three-quarters of an hour shall be allowed on each working day except Saturday.
 - (ii) In places where work is not done on Saturdays—
A lunch period of not less than half an hour shall be allowed on each working day.
- (b) Females.
All female employees shall be allowed the following meal intervals with permission to leave the shop for the whole of such interval, viz. :—From Monday to Friday one hour for lunch and, in addition on the usual late shopping night, three-quarters of an hour for tea.

NOTE.—Section 117 (3) of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677) provides that no person shall be employed in any shop more than five hours without an interval for a meal.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 18 (MISCELLANEOUS SHOPS).

NOTE.—(a) This Determination on the 21st June, 1940, applies to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included within the said district; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

(b) On 13th May, 1932, this Board was given power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in flower shops.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board, which now has the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in any shop other than shops of the following classes, that is to say:—

- (a) a butcher's shop, a bookseller's and news agent's shop, a confectionery and pastry shop, a cooked meat dealer's shop a fish and oyster shop, a fruit and vegetable shop, a hairdresser's shop, a tobacconist's shop;
- (b) a boot dealer's shop, a boot repairer's shop, a chemist's shop, a dairy produce dealer's shop, a draper's shop, a dyer's and clothes cleaner's shop, a fuel and fodder dealer's shop, a furniture dealer's shop, a grocer's shop, a haberdasher's shop, a hardware shop, a hatter's shop, a men's clothing shop, a mercer's shop, a milliner's shop, an underclothing shop;
- (c) a bread shop;
- (d) shops for the sale of petrol, benzine, or other motor spirit, motor oils, or motor car or motor cycle accessories;
- (e) shops for the sale of electrical goods, wireless (radio) sets, parts, or accessories—

- (b) Other shops and departments of shops—
 - (i) Within the times fixed for beginning and ending work in excess of 46 hours.
 - (ii) Outside the times of beginning and ending work.

* NOTE.—Section 117 (2) Act 3677 provides that:—Any person may, if notice in writing has previously been sent to the chief inspector, be employed in any shop or at any work in connexion with a shop for any time not exceeding three hours in any one day beyond the ordinary working hours, provided that the total number of days in any one year on which in any shop or at any work in connexion with a shop any such person is so employed shall not exceed twenty-five.

Section 105, however, makes it an offence for any employer to detain an employee later than half an hour on a half holiday.

(5) DAY'S WORK TO BE CONTINUOUS.—No employee, except in a case where he has been guilty of a misdemeanour, having commenced work, shall be required to take any time off (exclusive of intervals for meals) until he has completed the full number of hours for that day's work.

(6) TIME RATE.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall be paid, for time worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed for such ordinary week's work, as follows:—

- (a) In any week in which two or more Public Holidays occur At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum.
- (b) In any other week At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.

and for time worked beyond the one-half aforesaid, shall be paid the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work, together with any overtime rate which is applicable.

(7) SICK PAY.—Any employee not attending for duty who has had not less than twelve months' service with the same employer shall not lose his pay for the actual time lost if such employee produces or forwards within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his non-attendance was due to personal ill health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill health or accident for more than five days in each year commencing from the 22nd February, 1938.

(8) MEAL ALLOWANCE.—Any employee who is required to work for more than one hour after the usual closing time of the shop shall be paid 1s. 6d. as a meal allowance for each day that such extra time is worked.

(9) MEAL INTERVALS.—All employees shall be allowed the following meal intervals with permission to leave the shop for the whole of such intervals, viz.:—From Monday to Friday, one hour for lunch between noon and 3 p.m. and, in addition, on the usual late shopping night three-quarters of an hour between the hours of 5 p.m. and 7.15 p.m.

(10) REST INTERVALS.—Any employee who works four hours or longer without a meal interval shall be allowed a rest period of not less than ten minutes after two and a half hours' work. Such rest period shall be counted as time worked.

During such rest period the employee shall be permitted to take morning or afternoon tea as the case may be.

NOTE.—Section 117 (3) of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677) provides that no person shall be employed in any shop more than five hours without an interval for a meal.

(11) CLOTHING ALLOWANCE.—Where any employee is required by his employer to wear any special uniform, dress or clothing, of some colour other than black or black and white it shall be supplied, paid for, and, if necessary, laundered by the employer. Provided that, subject to the approval in writing of an official representative of the Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Federation of Australia, an Employer may substitute some other colour for black, or black and white, for any employee or section of employees, and under such circumstances the employer shall not be required to supply, launder or pay for such special uniform, dress or clothing.

(12) NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RATION.—Where an Employer owing to slackness of trade desires to ration his employees, he shall give at least two clear working days' notice to each employee of his intention to ration such employee.

(13) ANNUAL HOLIDAYS.—(i) Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted one week's holiday (exclusive of the Holidays mentioned in Clause (15)) in each year on full pay. Such holiday shall be given within three months of the completion of twelve months' service.

Seven days' notice shall be given by the employer to the employee before the latter commences his week's holiday aforesaid.

(ii) Any employee who has been for not less than six months in an employer's service, and whose engagement is terminated, shall receive one half-day's holiday payment for each month spent in such employer's service.

(iii) Any Employee who has been employed by the same employer for five years shall be granted two week's holiday on full pay.

(14) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(15) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS:—

The special rates for all work done on Sundays or the undermentioned Public Holidays shall be—

Sunday Double time.

New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, or after 12.30 p.m. on Show Day in localities mentioned in the Twelfth Schedule to the *Public Service Act 1928* within the area to which this Determination applies Double Time.

Easter Saturday—

(a) In the area enclosed by and including Flinders-street, Spencer-street, Lonsdale-street, and Spring-street in the City of Melbourne Five times the ordinary rate

(b) In all other places where this Determination applies Double time.

If, by Act of Parliament or Proclamation, any other day be substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

(16) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—Payment of all moneys due shall be made not later than Thursday of each week, and during working hours.

(17) REFERENCE.—An employee, on severing his or her connexion with an employer, shall be entitled to and shall receive from such employer a reference in writing, stating his or her period of service and duties performed. This provision shall apply only in the case of an employee who has been employed continuously for three months or more.

(6) **CASUAL LABOUR.**—Casual employees, i.e., persons who are employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work, shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter, with a minimum of 12s. 6d. per day.

(7) **ANNUAL HOLIDAY.**—(a) Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted one week's holiday in each year on full pay in addition to holidays mentioned in clause 9.

(b) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clause (a) an employee who has been in the continuous employment of an employer for not less than nine months, either from the date of his first commencing work with such employer or from the date when he resumed work after a holiday as hereinbefore provided, and who is dismissed for any reason (other than misdemeanour) shall be entitled to one half a day's holiday pay for each month of such employment.

(8) **PAYMENT OF WAGES.**—All wages must be paid on Thursday, and in the employer's time. Any time waited in excess of fifteen minutes after finishing time shall be paid for at overtime rates.

(9) **PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.**—All employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Picnic Day.

(10) **PICNIC DAY.**—The 3rd Wednesday in February in each year shall be observed as a holiday within a radius of 20 miles of the General Post Office, Melbourne, and at Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong.

(11) **EXTENDED JOURNEY.**—A motor driver shall not be required to travel on any journey extending over 110 miles from the employer's headquarters unless accompanied by a male adult employee.

(12) **TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.**—Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(13) **SPECIAL RATES.**—Double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Picnic Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted. Provided that persons employed at cleaning out stables, feeding, grooming and bedding-down horses shall be paid for the first two hours' work at the ordinary rate.
