Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire district: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal districts shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly:—

EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Cranbourne, Parish of Eumemmerring, County of Mornington:—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 18, of section XXV., Parish of Eumemmerring; thence southerly by a road to the south angle of allotment 21; thence westerly by a road to the south-western angle of allotment 6; thence northerly by a road to the north-western angle of allotment 1; thence easterly by a road to the point of commencement.

Shire of Dandenong, Parish of Eumemmerring, County of Mornington, and Parishes of Dandenong and Mordialloc, County of Bourke:—Commencing near the intersection of Heatherton-road and the Dandenong Creek, Parish of Dandenong, at the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 45; thence generally in a southerly and south-westerly direction

by that creek to a point in line with the south boundary of Crown allotment 18, Parish of Eumemmerring; thence easterly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary and southerly by the west boundaries of allotments 19 and 20 and a line to the south side of the Princes Highway; thence westerly by the Princes Highway, a line, and Kirkham-road to the west side of the Frankston-road; thence southerly by that road, Parish of Eumemmerring, to Williams-road; thence westerly by Williams-road to the south-western angle of allotment 7, of section 24, Parish of Eumemmerring; thence northerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 2 and 1 to Kirkham-road; thence westerly by Kirkham-road, and westerly by Cheltenham-road, Parish of Dandenong, to the south-western angle of allotment C of section 24; thence north-westerly by Cheltenham-road, Parish of Mordialloc, to the most westerly angle of allotment 1, of section 20; thence north-easterly by Tootal-road to Heatherton-road; thence westerly by Heatherton-road forming the south boundaries of allotments 3, and 2, section 11, to Clayton-road; thence northerly by Clayton-road to the north-western angle of allotment 1 of section VI.; thence easterly by Police-road forming the northern boundaries of allotments 1 and 3, section VI., and 1 and 2, section 5, to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by a road to the Princes Highway; thence south-easterly by the Princes Highway, Parish of Dandenong, to the most easterly angle of allotment 11; thence easterly by a line and the south boundaries of allotments 7d and 6 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotment 14, a line, and allotment 15 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by the Heatherton-road to the point of commencement.

4. No person shall allow any fowls, ducks, geese, or turkeys to wander in any street, road, or public place.

5. No person shall keep on or in any land or place any poultry unless in a substantial enclosure within which such poultry shall at all times be confined, the enclosure at all times to be kept clean and free from vermin.

6. The term poultry under this By-law shall include fowls, ducks, geese, and turkeys.

7. This By-law shall come into operation on its being published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall operate throughout that portion of the Shire of Broadmeadows, being all that part of the Parish of Dounta Galla situate within the said shire.
