PROCLAMATION RESCINDED AND RE-PROCLAIMED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933*, do hereby rescind the Proclamation dated the 31st July, 1928, whereby certain Crown lands in the Parish of Sherwood, at Rutherford's Inlet, were proclaimed a township, and in lieu thereof do proclaim as a

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township, under the designation of Warneet, the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Parish of Sherwood, County of Mornington: Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 936¹; bounded thence by that allotment bearing S. 9 deg. 5 min. Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NORTHCOTE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and

from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Northcote has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned used as a street be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Northcote aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

UNDER and by virtue of the powers and authorities conferred by paragraph (5) of Regulation 7 of the National Security (Fair Rents) Regulations made by the Governor-General in Council on the twenty-fifth day of March, 1941, under the authority of the *National Security Act 1939-40* of the Commonwealth of Australia, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby revoke the rules made under and by virtue of the powers and authorities conferred by paragraph (5) of Regulation 5 of the National Security (Fair Rents) Regulations (being Statutory Rules, 1939, No. 104) on the ninth day of October, 1939, and doth hereby make the following rules (that is to say):—

- (1) These Rules may be cited as the Fair Rents Rules 1941.

(2) An application to have the fair rent of any dwelling-house, shop, or factory determined or varied by a Fair Rents Board, or (where the rent of any prescribed premises is fixed by virtue of regulation 6 of the National Security (Fair Rents) Regulations or by a determination) to obtain the consent of a Fair Rents Board to demand any increased rent or to give any notice or take any proceeding to terminate the tenancy shall be made in the form set out in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

(3) The applicant shall deliver or send by post to the Board the application properly prepared in duplicate.

(4) The Board shall appoint the day and hour for the hearing and shall endorse a memorandum thereof on the forms of application. Such memorandum shall be in the form set out in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

(5) The Board shall deliver or send by post to the applicant one of the duplicate forms of application duly endorsed as aforesaid.

(6) Notice of such application shall be given by the applicant to each of the parties entitled thereto (including the mortgagee, if any, if the applicant is the lessor) at least six clear days before the day appointed for the hearing by delivering a true copy of such endorsed duplicate form of application to such party himself or by leaving the same for him at his last or most usual place of abode or of business with some other person apparently an inmate thereof or employed thereat and apparently not less than sixteen years of age or by sending the same to him at his last or most usual place of abode or of business by registered post prepaid.

(7) If the applicant is the lessee, then the lessor after service upon him shall give notice of such application to the mortgagee, if any, in the manner provided by the last preceding rule, at least six clear days before the day appointed for the hearing if practicable, or if not so practicable, forthwith after service upon such lessor.

(8) Service upon the lessor's agent or the person to whom rent is ordinarily paid shall be deemed to be service upon the lessor.

(9) A summons to a witness to give evidence or to produce documents or to give evidence and to produce documents shall be in the form set out in the Schedule or to the like effect.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BALLAARAT RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 24th December, 1940, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Ballaarat at Ballaarat East, known as the "Town Mission Reserve," and hereinafter referred to as "the Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be at all times open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosure and Reserve.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee of Management, in their absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

14. No person shall disturb the surface or remove any sand, stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

15. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays or on Anzac Day.

16. No person or club shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, football, quoits, golf, cricket, hockey, or any other game or foot racing except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve or pass over any playing area or oval with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the ground.

18. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.

19. No assemblies for concerts or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind shall take place in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

20. No person, other than the players and officials connected with any game (football, cricket, tennis, hockey, or golf), and than any competitor and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon any playground or oval during the course of such games and sports.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "JANCOURT GRAVEL RESERVE."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 26th August, 1940, as a site for the Supply of Gravel in the Parish of Jancourt, and known as the "Jancourt Gravel Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

4. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

5. The owner of any horse, cattle, or other animals found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and in addition such horse, cattle, or other animals may be impounded.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

8. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the said Committee of such fees as the said Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid.

Such fees shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and six pence per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission, the Committee of Management may require from any person requesting such

permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this Regulation shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half-year.

9. All gravel to be removed from the said Reserve, in accordance with the permission of the Committee of Management, shall be removed therefrom subject to and in accordance with the directions of the engineer of the Council of the Shire of Heytesbury, provided that and subject to such direction all gravel shall be removed in a face and for the full depth of the deposit. No overburden shall be allowed to remain on the floor of the pit, but all such overburden shall be removed and deposited as directed by the Committee of Management. All trees, stumps, logs, roots, branches, and other debris shall be removed from the pit as they are reached and fall, and shall not be left standing on "islands."

The Council of the Shire of Heytesbury has been appointed a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against these Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by the bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
