Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).

DECLARING THAT MAIZE SHALL BECOME THE
PROPERTY OF THE MAIZE MARKETING BOARD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same;

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 5th day of May 1936 under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared maize to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 2nd November 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a Marketing Board in relation to maize and assigned to such Board the name of "The Maize Marketing Board": Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one, all maize shall subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* be divested from the producers of maize and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Maize Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any maize coming into existence within two (2) years from the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Maize Marketing Board as the owner thereof: And to enable The Maize Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such maize shall subject to and in

accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Maize Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Maize Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plant named hereunder to be a noxious weed for the purposes of the above Act within the Shire of Wimmera, viz.:—

Emex Australis, Steinh. "Spiny Emex," "Three-cornered Jack," or "Cat's Head."

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by section 8 of the *Ordinary Life Assurance Act* 1940 it is enacted that where in the opinion of the Minister, after consultation with the Government Statist, the provisions of the Schedule to the said Act should not apply without any modification in respect of any policy or class of policies the Governor in Council may by Order declare that the provisions of the said Schedule shall apply in respect of such policy or class of policies with such modifications as are declared in the Order:

And whereas the Responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Ordinary Life Assurance Act* 1940, after consultation with the Government Statist, is of opinion that the Schedule to the said Act should not apply without any modification in respect of certain classes of policies:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and pursuant to the provisions of the said section 8, doth make the Order following (that is to say):—

It is hereby declared that the provisions of the Schedule to the *Ordinary Life Assurance Act* 1940 shall apply in respect of the classes of policies described herein subject to the modification set forth:—

1. *Family Income Policies.*

- (i) If a policy provides income or other additional life assurance benefits so that the amount payable (exclusive of bonuses) in the event of death within a specified term dating from the commencement of assurance exceeds the amount payable (exclusive of bonuses) in the event of death after the expiry of the specified term (which latter amount is hereinafter referred to as the basic sum assured) the paid-up policy to which the policy holder is entitled shall be payable on the same contingencies as the basic sum assured only, and shall not carry such additional benefits, but the amount of the paid-up policy shall be adjusted in accordance with the second and third paragraphs hereof.
- (ii) The value of the additional benefits shall be ascertained in accordance with Part II. of the Schedule to the Act, except that the net premium may be calculated on the assumption that the age of the person whose life is assured is one year greater than his age on his birthday next following the date of the policy.
- (iii) The paid-up policy in respect of the basic sum assured only shall be increased or decreased by a sum bearing the same proportion to the value of the additional benefits (calculated as in (ii) above) as the sum of One pound bears to the value of the reversion in the sum of One pound according to the contingency upon which the basic sum assured under the original policy was payable.

2. *Exclusion of Accident Benefits, &c.*

If an ordinary life assurance policy includes provision for a benefit payable in an event other than death or survival or a benefit payable in the event of death from a specified cause or causes (either or both of which benefits are hereinafter referred to as additional benefits) the paid-up policy to which the policy holder shall be entitled shall be calculated in the manner prescribed under the Schedule to the Act. For the purpose of such calculation the additional benefits shall be ignored, and the paid-up policy shall not provide any part of the additional benefits.

3. *Option Policies.*

If an ordinary life assurance policy contains provision for the contract thereunder to be varied at the option of the assured on a specified date or on the happening of a specified event and the policy holder becomes entitled to a paid-up policy before such option has been exercised the paid-up policy to which the policy holder shall be entitled shall be that to which he would be entitled if the policy did not include provision for such optional variation.

4. *Altered Policies.*

In cases where, since the issue of any policy, the contract thereunder has been varied by endorsement at the request of the policy holder, in such a manner that either (a) the date

upon which the sum assured becomes payable, or (b) the term during which premium payments are to be made has been altered, then the following rules shall apply to the calculation of a paid-up policy:—

- (i) The "date of variation" shall mean the date on which the first premium under the varied contract fell due.
- (ii) The paid-up policy in respect of the original contract under the policy shall be calculated according to Part I. or Part II. of the Schedule, as at the day before the "date of variation."
- (iii) An adjusted paid-up policy shall be calculated as at the "date of variation" by taking the sum which bears the same proportion to the paid-up policy under the original contract as the value of the reversion in the sum of One pound according to the contingency upon which the sum assured under the original contract was payable bears to the reversion in the sum of One pound according to the contingency upon which the sum assured under the policy is payable after the "date of variation."
- (iv) From the total sum assured under the policy after the "date of variation" there shall be deducted the amount of the "adjusted paid-up policy" calculated according to rule (iii). The sum so ascertained shall be known as the "premium bearing sum assured."
- (v) There shall be calculated, as at the date at which it is required to ascertain the paid-up policy in respect of the varied policy, the paid-up policy that would be applicable to a policy effected on the "date of variation" under the conditions relating to the contract as varied and having a sum assured equal to the "premium bearing sum assured," but for the purposes of interpreting section 4 of the Act in relation to such calculation and of ascertaining the appropriate percentage in applying the Schedule to the Act but only for such purposes the period for which premiums have been paid shall be assumed to date from the date of the original policy.
- (vi) The total paid-up policy in respect of a varied policy shall be the sum of the "adjusted paid-up policy" calculated according to rule (iii) and the paid-up policy in respect of the "premium bearing sum assured," calculated according to rule (v).
- (vii) The General Rules in Part II. (3) of the Schedule shall apply to the calculations in respect of varied policies.

5. *Endowment Assurance Payable in Instalments with Level Premiums until Last Instalment Paid.*

If an endowment assurance policy provides for payment of the sum assured by instalments at intervals and for any unpaid balance at death, premiums being payable at a level rate until the final balance of sum assured has been paid, the paid-up policy values of such a policy shall be calculated according to the rules in Part II. instead of Part I. of the Schedule.

And the Honorable Henry Stephen Bailey, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Every producer of chicory who has planted any chicory during the year ending on the 30th day of June, 1941, and who has entered into any contract for the delivery of chicory outside Victoria in respect of any such planting, is hereby required to forward to the Secretary of the Chicory Marketing Board, 375 Collins-street, Melbourne, the following particulars:—

1. On or before the 14th May, 1941—

- (a) The name and address of each person with whom he has so contracted during the period from the 24th December, 1940, to the 30th April, 1941 (both dates inclusive).
- (b) The quantity of chicory forming the subject of each of such contracts.
- (c) The price agreed upon in each of such contracts.
- (d) The date and place of delivery specified in each of such contracts.

2. Within fourteen days of the making of any such contracts—

- (a) The name and address of each person with whom he has so contracted from and including the 1st May, 1941.
- (b) The quantity of chicory forming the subject of each of such contracts.
- (c) The price agreed upon in each of such contracts.
- (d) The date and place of delivery specified in each of such contracts.

Every producer who fails to forward to the Chicory Marketing Board any or all of the particulars above mentioned shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of Fifty pounds.

Every producer who wilfully forwards to the Chicory Marketing Board any particulars required by these Regulations which are false or misleading shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of Fifty pounds.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE KARDINIA PARK.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following additional Regulation in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 17th April, 1924, as a site for a Public Park in the City of Geelong, Parish of Corio, known as "Kardinia Park":—

ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

No person shall park a motor car or other vehicle or motor cycle within the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose, and any person using any such place for parking a motor car or other vehicle or motor cycle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Committee of Management, pay such fee as is from time to time determined by such Committee, not exceeding One shilling in respect of any such car or vehicle or motor cycle for the use of such parking area on such days, not exceeding twenty-six in any one year, as a charge is being made for admission to the Reserve for Public Recreation adjoining.

member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE YINNAR RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council, dated the 21st March, 1940, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Yinnar, and known as the "Yinnar Recreation Reserve":—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding Twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, notwithstanding that such person has paid for admission to the Reserve.

3. No person shall put any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

4. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games, fêtes, amusements, shows, or sports, and from time to time grant to any club, society, or association of clubs, the use of the grounds so set apart upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

5. Persons or clubs renting or hiring the Reserve, or any portion thereof, for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use thereof, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed Two pounds per day.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
