NOTICE TO SUPPLIERS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Victorian Emergency Reserve Stocks Rules published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th April, 1941, at pp. 1575-90, the Victorian Emergency Reserve Stocks Committee hereby requires every supplier to forward to the Committee within the period of seven days after the publication hereof a return in the form in the Third Schedule to the said Rules.

With reference to the above-mentioned "Notice to Retailers" and "Notice to Suppliers" attention is drawn to the following matters:—

- (i) "Retailer" means person firm company or association who or which in Victoria at premises outside the metropolitan district in the ordinary course of business—
 - (a) sells any essential commodity by retail; or
 - (b) uses any essential commodity in the making of bread for sale—

and includes the successor in business of any such retailer.

- (ii) "*Metropolitan District*" means the municipal districts of the cities of Box Hill, Brighton, Brunswick, Camberwell, Caulfield, Chelsea, Coburg, Collingwood, Essendon, Fitzroy, Footscray, Hawthorn, Heidelberg, Kew, Malvern, Melbourne, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Northcote, Oakleigh, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Preston, Richmond, Sandringham, South Melbourne, St. Kilda, Williamstown, the borough of Ringwood, and the shires of Blackburn and Mitcham, Braybrook, Broadmeadows, Bulla, Dandenong, Doncaster and Templestowe, Eltham, Ferntree Gully, Frankston and Hastings, Keilor, Lillydale, Melton, Mornington, Mulgrave, Werribee, and Whittlesea.
- (iii) "*Essential Commodities*" are—baking powder, bi-carbonate of soda, biscuits, bread improver, candles, condensed and powdered milk, cream of tartar (or substitutes therefor), flour, honey, infant foods, invalid foods, jam, lighting kerosene, matches, salt, self-raising flour, soap, sugar, tea, tinned fruits, cheese, dried fruits, oatmeal (all types), pearl barley, rice, split peas, bacon, butter, ham.

NOTE.—Commodities may be added to, or removed from, this list from time to time by notice published in the *Government Gazette*.

- (iv) A retailer must make a separate return in respect of each of the premises at which he carries on business as a retailer outside the metropolitan district.
- (v) "*Supplier*" means person firm company or association (whether a manufacturer, miller, processor or merchant) who in the ordinary course of business supplies by wholesale any essential commodity to retailers, and includes the successor in business of any such supplier.
- (vi) Forms in the Second Schedule and instructions are available at your nearest railway station, but when the nearest railway station is too far away, or where there is no officer in charge of such station, forms and instructions will be forwarded direct to retailers on application to the Secretary, Victorian Emergency Reserve Stocks Committee, T. & G. Buildings, Cnr. Collins and Russell Streets, Melbourne.
- (vii) Forms in the Third Schedule and instructions can be procured on application from the Secretary, Victorian Emergency Reserve Stocks Committee, T. & G. Buildings, Cnr. Collins and Russell Streets, Melbourne.
- (viii) A retailer or supplier who fails to forward the returns required by the above-mentioned notices renders himself liable to a fine or imprisonment or both.

FURTHER PROROGUING PARLIAMENT AND FIXING THE TIME FOR HOLDING THE SECOND
SESSION OF THE THIRTY-FOURTH PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of
Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands prorogued until Tuesday, the third day of June, 1941:
Now I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my
Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Tuesday, the twenty-fourth day of June, 1941,
and I do hereby fix Tuesday, the twenty-fourth day of June, 1941, aforesaid, at the hour of half-past Two o'clock
in the afternoon, as the time for the commencement and holding of the next Session of the said Parliament of
Victoria, for the despatch of business, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Spring-street, in the City of
Melbourne: And the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative
Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth
day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and in the fifth year
of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.
