Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

BY-LAW NO. 87.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, made under the Local Government Acts and numbered 87, for regulating traffic and processions, appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars, suppressing nuisances, and also as rules and regulations under the Police Offences Act, and for other purposes.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context other requires:—

"Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle, but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.

"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, mechanical, electrical, or other power, but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.

2. Except in such parking areas as are defined in the schedule to the By-law of the City of Footscray 83, and in relation to such parking areas only upon the days and during the hours during which such parking areas are under the said By-law 83 made available for parking, the driver of a motor car or vehicle shall not leave or allow the same (whether attended or not) to remain in any street or part thereof within the Municipality of Footscray for a longer period than 30 minutes, and unless such motor car or other vehicle is left in such a position as not to obstruct traffic: Provided that the person next driving or taking charge of any such motor car or other vehicle shall until the contrary is proved be deemed to be the driver thereof within the meaning of this clause. Penalty £5.

3. The driver of any motor car or other vehicle on any street or part thereof within the Municipal District of Footscray, which motor car or vehicle has been stopped for the purpose of taking up or setting down any goods shall not permit such motor car or vehicle to remain in the position in which it has been so stopped for any period longer than is reasonably necessary for the purpose of taking up or setting down such goods. Penalty £5.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Footscray.
