Parish of Conewarre, County of Grant: Commencing at a point bearing south 100 links from the most southerly angle of allotment I of section 28; bounded thence by a road bearing south 1,000 links and south 1 deg. 50 min. E. 3,509 5/10 links; by a line bearing south to the shore of Bass Strait; by that shore bearing south-westerly to Thomson's or Bream Creek; by that creek upstream to the south corner of allotment F of section 27; by that allotment bearing N. 29 deg. 24 min. E. 2,330 links; and thence by a road bearing east 156 3/10 links to the point of commencement.—(B.795⁽³⁾) (*) (Rs.151).

FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

NORTH SHEPPARTON IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.—DISTRICT EXTENDED—PORTION EXCISED.

EXTENSION OF POWERS OF THE ENGINEERS AND
BRASSWORKERS (UNSKILLED) BOARD.

WHEREAS, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, the Governor in Council did by Order dated the twenty-third day of March, 1937, specify the trade of manufacturing or preparing lead and shot as a trade to which section 6 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1936* shall apply: And whereas the Governor in Council did by further Order made on the seventh day of April, 1937, appoint a Wages Board (to be known as the General Board) to determine the lowest rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in such trade specified as aforesaid: And whereas the Minister of Labour is satisfied that a majority of employees in the said specified trade desire that the powers of the Engineers and Brassworkers (Unskilled) Board be extended thereto under section one hundred and thirty-nine of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the powers of the Engineers and Brassworkers (Unskilled) Board be extended so that in addition to the powers conferred by Orders heretofore made the said Board may determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of manufacturing or preparing lead and shot, such trade being, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, of the same or similar character to the trade for which the Engineers and Brassworkers (Unskilled) Board was appointed.

SLAUGHTERING FOR EXPORT BOARD—VARIATION OF
APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did by Order appoint a Wages Board styled the Slaughtering for Export Board, and did by Order made under the said provisions vary the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient to further vary the said powers in the manner hereafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Orders accordingly, so that in substitution for the powers thereby conferred, the said Slaughtering for Export Board shall be given the following powers (that is to say):—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the provisions of any Wages Board heretofore appointed) employed in the meat export trade as—

- (a) slaughterers or dressers of sheep, lambs, cattle, pigs, or calves;
- (b) boners, trimmers, or labourers;
- (c) drovers, stockmen, or penners-up;
- (d) skin store workers.

OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 3 (BUTCHERS) SHALL BE
OPERATIVE.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council:—

- (1) By Order dated the twenty-first day of May, 1900, appointed a Butchers' Board, and by Order dated the tenth day of May, 1921, changed the Short Title of such Board to the Shops Board No. 3 (Butchers).
- (2) By Order dated the tenth day of April, 1922, re-defined the area or locality within which the Determination of the said Shops Board No. 3 (Butchers) shall be operative.

And whereas the Governor in Council may as between any two or more Boards adjust the powers which such Boards may lawfully exercise, and may re-define the area or locality within which the Determinations of such Boards shall be operative: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby:—

- (1) For the purpose of adjusting the powers which the said Shops Board No. 3 (Butchers) and the Shops Board No. 4 (Butchers—Country) and the Shops Board No. 5 (Butchers—Provincial) may lawfully exercise, deprive the said Shops Board No. 4 (Butchers—Country) and the Shops Board No. 5 (Butchers—Provincial) each of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a butcher or seller of meat, or maker or seller of small goods and confer such power exclusively on the Shops Board No. 3 (Butchers).
- (2) Re-define the area or locality within which the Determination of the Shops Board No. 3 (Butchers) shall be operative as the whole of the State of Victoria.

 - (b) parts of agricultural machinery or implements;
 - (c) bag-filling machinery, bone crushers, butter making machinery, chaff-cutters, corn-crushing machinery, cream separators, hay presses, horse works, iron feeding troughs, lawn-mowers, machinery for treating flax or hemp, maize shellers, windmills; or
 - (d) garden tools or implements or parts thereof;
 - (2) assembling or putting together any parts of machinery or implements of classes or kinds (whether the same have been made inside or outside the State) same or similar to those mentioned in paragraph (1).
- (b) Re-define the area or locality within which the Determination of the Agricultural Implements Board shall be operative as the whole of the State of Victoria.

AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENTS BOARD: NUMBER OF MEMBERS REDUCED.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council, by Order made on the twenty-fifth day of September, 1906, directed that the Wages Board described as the Agricultural Implements Board should consist of ten members and a chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and five as representatives of employees: And whereas it is expedient to vary the said Order in the manner hereafter appearing: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby direct that the Agricultural Implements Board shall consist of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees.

And the Honorable Edwin Joseph Mackrell, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE "SMYTHESDALE WATERING
PURPOSES RESERVES."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council, dated the 5th August, 1940, as sites for Water Supply purposes in the Parish of Smythesdale, and known as the "Smythesdale Watering Purposes Reserves."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public free of charge at all times.
2. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any waste paper, bottles, tins, or any other litter on any part of the Reserves.
3. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management, first obtained—
 - (1) gather, pick up, cut, pluck, dig up, remove, or have in his possession while in the Reserves, or take away therefrom any live or dead timber;
 - (2) ring-bark or strip or remove bark from any tree, bush, or shrub.
4. No person shall dig or remove soil or other material in or from the Reserves.
5. No person shall remove, displace, or damage any board, plate pump, pipe, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management of the Reserves.
6. No person shall put into the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserves, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserves, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserves (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

8. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work or duty.

9. No person shall break glass of any kind on the Reserves or leave thereupon anything which will injure any person.

10. No person shall camp on any portion of the Reserves except on that portion set apart by the Committee of Management, and then only after obtaining a permit subject to the payment of such fees and under such conditions as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine.

The Council of the Shire of Grenville has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
