PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720). section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Northcote has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned reserved for a street be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved for a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Northcote aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.: meaning of the said Act, viz :-

AMENDMENT OF SECOND SCHEDULE TO THE POISONS ACT 1928.

ARTICLES DEEMED TO BE POISONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Poisons Act 1928, it is enacted (inter alia) that the several articles mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed poisons within the meaning of the said Act and that on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the Government Gazetts amend the said Schedule by adding to any part of such Schedule or removing therefrom any article and the Schedule so amended shall have the same force and effect as if such amendment had been enacted in the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the said Board, do by this my Proclamation, amend the Second Schedule to the Poisons Act 1928 as follows, that is to say:—

- 1. By adding to the first part of the said Second Schedule the article:-
 - "Lead and its salts in combination with oleic acid or other higher fatty acids, whether sold as Diachylon or under any other designation (except machine spread plasters).
- 2. By removing from the second part of the said Second Schedule the article numbered 31 and in its place adding to the said second part of the said Second Schedule the article:—
 - "Lead—medicinal salts and compounds of lead and medicinal preparations or admixtures containing lead or its salts or compounds."

DANGEROUS DRUGS.

Addition to Paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule to the Poisons Act 1928.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 38 of the Poisons Act 1928, as amended by section 5 of the Poisons Act 1930, it is enacted that, if it appears to the Governor in Council that any new derivative of morphine or cocaine or of any salts of morphine or cocaine or any other substance or preparation of whatever kind is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analagous to those produced by morphine or cocaine, the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria may by Proclamation add the name of that derivative, alkaloid or other substance or preparation act 1928 and declare that Division 2 of Part III. thereof shall apply to that new derivative or alkaloid or other substance or preparation in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations mentioned in paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule to the said Poisons of the said Division 2 shall apply accordingly:

And whereas it appears to the Governor in Council that

And whereas it appears to the Governor in Council that Desomorphine (dihydrodesoxymorphine) is productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as, or analagous to, those produced by

morphine or cocaine: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the said Board, do by this my Proclamation add to paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule to the Poisons lot 1928 the name of Desomorphine (dihydrodesoxymorphine) and declare that the provisions of Division 2 of Part III. of the Poisons Act 1928 shall apply to the following substance, namely. Desomorphine (dihydrodesoxymorphine) in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations mentioned in paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule to the said Poisons Act 1928.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 47 of the Poisons Act 1928 it is enacted (inter alia) that in addition to the substances included in the Seventh Schedule thereto, the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare any substance which is not included in the Second, Fourth or Sixth Schedules to the said Act, and which in the opinion of the Commission of Public Health, should be subject to regulations imposing special restrictions under Part IV. of the said Act with respect to the sale thereof to be a "potent drug" for the purposes of the said act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation, declare each of the substances hereinafter specified, which substances are not included in the said Second, Fourth or Sixth Schedules, and which, in the opinion of the said Commission of Public Health should be subject to regulations imposing special restrictions under Part IV. of the Poisons Act 1928, with respect to the said Act, namely:— WHEREAS by section 47 of the Poisons Act 1928 it is said Act. namely:-

8. Biological products and glandular substances and prepara-tions intended for therapeutic use, whether derived from natural sources or by any synthetic process. 9. Sobisminol Mass and Sobisminol Solution.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Fire Brigades Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may he) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the Government Gazotte declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the council of the municipal district hereinafter mentioned has requested that the portion of such district enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire district. And whereas a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria. In the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the Fire Brigades Act 1928, do hereby declare that the said portion of such municipal district shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly: specified accordingly:-

(b) An occulting red light every six seconds exhibited on the Breakwater Pier, Williamstown, 34 feet above high water, and 10 feet vertically below the green navigation light;

(c) An occulting red light every six seconds exhibited 24 feet above high water, and 6 feet vertically below the flashing green light on the beacon on the south side of the river entrance.

(2) This Regulation shall not apply to any vessel the property of or used in the service of the Commissioners, or to any self-propelled vessel of less than the following dimensions:-

Length, between perpendiculars-130 feet; Breadth-26 feet

Rating By-law for the Year ending on 30th September, 1941.

THE Council of the Shire of Creswick, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Borough Riding of the Shire of Creswick Water Supply District.

On such lands and tenements—a rate of Nine pence in the pound of the amount of the annual municipal value.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Fifteen shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Two shillings and six pence.

All water supplied by measure by the Council shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and six pence per 1,000

The charge for water by measure shall be payable on demand. The charge for water supplied at standpipes shall be Nine pence per load of 180 gallons.
