SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT MOOLAP.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the

thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act* 1928.

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

Parish of Moolap, County of Grant: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 13, Parish of Moolap; thence south-easterly by the western side of the road forming the eastern boundaries of allotments 13 and 14 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-easterly by a direct line to the north-eastern angle of allotment 18A; thence south-easterly and southerly by the western side of the road forming the eastern boundaries of allotments 18A, 19A, 19, 21, and 24, and south-westerly by the western side of the road forming the north-western boundary of portion 14 to the south-western angle of allotment 17A; thence south-westerly by a direct line to the south-eastern angle of allotment 18A and by the northern boundary of the road aforesaid to the junction of such road with the Geelong and Portarlington road; thence westerly by the northern side of the said Geelong and Portarlington road to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment 1 of section 6; thence north by a direct line to the most easterly angle of allotment 1A of section 5; thence south-easterly 5,300 links, more or less, in a direct line to a point being high-water mark on the southern shore of Corio Bay at the western entrance to Stingaree Bay; thence easterly by a direct line to a point being high-water mark on the northern shore of Stingaree Bay in line with the western boundary of allotment 24; thence northerly by high-water mark to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 13 aforesaid; and thence east by a direct line and the northern boundary of the said allotment 13 to the point of commencement.

*Marine Act 1928.*THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SICK AND
SUPERANNUATION FUND REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1928* (section 91), the Pilot Superannuation Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following amendment of the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations (that is to say):—

1. *Short Title.*—These Regulations may be cited as The Pilot Superannuation Regulations, 1941.

2. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations, 1938, as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as "The Principal Regulations"), and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st of July, 1940.

3. *Pensions.*—Schedule I. and Schedule II. to the Principal Regulations are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

8. *Lump Sum in Lieu of Pensions.*—(a) Any pilot on becoming entitled to a pension under these Regulations may, if he thinks fit, elect to receive payment thereof in the form of a lump sum instead of as a pension, whereupon he shall be paid a sum calculated at the rate of £88 0s. 10d. for the first completed year of service, £89 7s. 11d. for the second completed year of service, and so on, such rate increasing by £1 7s. 1d. for each additional completed year of service thereafter up to and including thirty-five years' service.

(b) Where any pilot who has elected under paragraph (a) hereof retires in any year prior to the anniversary of the date upon which his service as a pilot first commenced, he shall be entitled, in addition to the sum referred to in the said paragraph, to an additional amount for each completed month's service in the incomplete year equal to one-twelfth of the lump sum to which he would have been entitled for that year had he not retired before the completion thereof.

(c) No pension, capitation, or other allowance shall be payable under these Regulations to the widow or in respect to the child of any pilot who dies after having accepted, pursuant to paragraph (a) of this Regulation, a lump sum in lieu of any pension to which he was entitled under these Regulations.

9. *Dependants' Benefits.*—(a) *Widows' Benefits.*—On the decease of a pilot who, at the time of his death, was operating as such under a Pilot Licence issued by the Marine Board of Victoria, or subsequent to his being placed on the superannuation list and leaving a widow him surviving, the said widow shall be entitled to a pension from the Sick and Superannuation Fund in accordance with the scale prescribed in Schedule II, hereto.

Where the widow of a pilot is entitled to a pension under Schedule II, hereto, and such pilot had served, in addition to the completed years of service, a further period of less than one year, her pension at the rate prescribed in the aforesaid Schedule, according to the number of such completed years of service, shall be increased by an amount for each completed month of such additional service equal to one-twelfth of the sum representing the difference between the amount of the said pension and that which would have been payable according to the aforesaid Schedule if such additional service amounted to a full year.

Subject to the proviso that the pension payable to the widow of a pilot shall in no case exceed £81 5s. 5d. per annum unless she shall have been married to him for ten years or upwards at the time of his death or superannuation, whichever may first have happened, nor more than £108 7s. 2d. per annum unless she shall have been married to him fifteen years or upwards at the time of his death or superannuation, whichever may first have happened.

If, after these Regulations come into force, a pilot marries, subsequent to being placed on the superannuation list, neither his widow nor the children of such marriage shall be eligible for a pension, capitation, or any other allowance from the Fund.

(b) *Children's Benefits.*—On the decease of a pilot who, at the time of his death, was operating as such under a Pilot Licence issued by the Marine Board of Victoria or subsequent to his being placed on the superannuation list, leaving a widow or child or children him surviving, a capitation allowance of £67 14s. 6d. per annum for each child shall be made until the child attains the age of sixteen (16) years. On the death of a pilot's widow leaving any child or children of the pilot under the age of eighteen (18) years, the capitation allowance, if there is but one child, shall be increased to £81 5s. 5d. per annum, and shall continue to be paid until such child attains the age of eighteen (18) years. If, however, the said widow leaves more than one (1) child under the age of eighteen years her surviving, the pension payable to the widow shall be divided into as many equal parts as there are children under the age of eighteen years, and each part shall be added to the capitation allowance of each child payable as aforesaid, and shall likewise continue to be payable until each such child attains the age of eighteen (18) years, but without the benefit of survivorship between the children, and provided that no child shall in any case receive a larger allowance (including the said capitation allowance) than £81 5s. 5d. per annum.

(c) On the decease of a pilot who, at the time of his death, was operating as such under a Pilot Licence issued by the Marine Board of Victoria, or subsequent to his being placed on the superannuation list leaving a child or children under the age of eighteen (18) years him surviving, but no widow him surviving, the allowance payable in respect of each child shall be calculated as if the pilot had died leaving a widow him surviving for a period of twenty-four hours.

(d) The Board may, in its discretion, pay the allowance to which any child is entitled under this regulation to the widow or guardian, or to such other person as to it seems proper, and the receipt of such widow, guardian, or other person shall be good and sufficient discharge to the Board.

Note.—*Adopted Child.*—Under the foregoing Regulations (b), (c), and (d), a child adopted by a pilot under the *Adoption of Children Act 1928* shall be deemed to be the child of the pilot if, in the opinion of the Board, such child was totally or mainly dependent upon such pilot.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Pilot Superannuation Board held this 5th day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-one.

NURSES BOARD.

ADDITIONS TO THE NURSES REGULATIONS, 1935.

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 29 of the *Nurses Act* 1928, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations, which shall come into force on publication in the *Government Gazette*:—

Add to Part I., 3—

“‘Nomination day’ means the day appointed on or before which all candidates for any election must be nominated, and ‘Polling day’ means the last day appointed at any election for the delivery of ballot-papers by voters to the Returning Officer, and words importing the feminine gender shall be deemed and taken to include males.”

Add, after Part VII., Regulation 38, the following:—

“PART IX.

39. Regulation for election to the Nurses Board, pursuant to the Nurses Act 1940, of representatives of registered nurses.

1. Subject to the special provisions, as hereinafter provided, for the first election in the year 1941, the following provisions shall apply to all elections of registered nurses as members of the Board.

(a) The Minister shall appoint a competent person, not being a member or officer of the Board, to be the Returning Officer.

(b) (i) In any year in which representatives of registered nurses are to be elected to the Board, the Minister shall during the month of January give notice of the election in the *Government Gazette*, and the Registrar shall give similar notice in at least one recognized journal circulating amongst nurses, and at least two daily newspapers published in Melbourne.

(ii) In every such notice the polling day (which shall be the last Friday in February in such year), the nomination day (which shall be not less than fourteen days after the date of the publication of such notice in the *Government Gazette*), the name of the Returning Officer, and the time and place when and where he will receive nominations, and the place where nomination forms may be obtained shall be specified.

(c) Forthwith after the nomination day for any election the Registrar shall supply the Returning Officer with a roll of persons (giving the full name and address in each case) who on nomination day are registered nurses, and shall also supply the Returning Officer with an envelope addressed to each such person. Such roll shall be the roll of persons entitled to vote at the election.

(d) (i) Every candidate for election must be a person registered as a nurse under the Nurses Acts.

(ii) In order that any registered nurse may become or be a candidate at any election, she shall before Twelve o'clock noon on the nomination day deliver or cause to be delivered to the Returning Officer a nomination paper in or as nearly as may be in Form 26 of the First Schedule hereto stating the name and address and registration number of such registered nurse and signed by not less than six other registered nurses, and having at the foot thereof a statement under the hand of the registered nurse so nominated that she consents to such nomination.

No registered nurse who has not been so nominated shall be or be deemed to be a candidate at any election.

(e) Any registered nurse who has been nominated may, by written notice addressed to the Returning Officer, withdraw her consent to her nomination at any time not later than Twelve o'clock noon on nomination day, and thereupon such registered nurse shall be considered as not having been nominated, and the Returning Officer shall omit the name of such registered nurse from the ballot-papers.

(f) After Twelve o'clock noon on nomination day the Returning Officer shall, in respect of a contested election, announce the full name of each candidate nominated, and shall cause notice thereof to be published in the *Government Gazette*.

(g) If the number of candidates nominated does not exceed five, the Returning Officer shall, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, declare such candidates

duly elected, and shall forward a copy of such notice to the Minister.

(h) If at any election more than five candidates have been duly nominated, a poll shall be taken, and the Returning Officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed in or as nearly as may be in Form 27 of the First Schedule hereto, and shall, not later than the fourteenth day before polling day, send by post, or cause to be delivered, to each of the registered nurses entitled to vote, one of such ballot-papers duly signed or initialed by the Returning Officer, together with an open return-envelope bearing the Returning Officer's name and address.

(i) When the voter has marked her vote on the ballot-paper, she shall place it in the addressed return-envelope, and she shall sign her name and state her registered address and registered number on the face of such return-envelope and post it or deliver it or cause it to be delivered to the Returning Officer in time to reach the Returning Officer not later than noon on polling day. Any ballot-paper which is not enclosed in an envelope with the voter's signature and the other specified particulars thereon or in respect of which the directions in accordance with Form 27 of the First Schedule hereto have not been substantially complied with shall not be counted in the scrutiny. The decision of the Returning Officer as to the validity or invalidity of any vote or ballot-paper shall be final.

(j) Upon a voter satisfying the Returning Officer that she has not received a ballot-paper or that the ballot-paper received by her has been lost, spoiled, or destroyed, the Returning Officer may issue a new ballot-paper to such voter.

(k) (i) A voter shall mark her ballot-paper by striking out the names of the candidates for whom she does not wish to vote.

(ii) A voter may give and exercise five votes, giving not more than one vote for each of five candidates.

(iii) Any ballot-paper recording more or less than five votes shall be rejected as informal.

(l) Each candidate at any election shall be entitled to appoint in writing one scrutineer to be present during the scrutiny.

(m) As soon as practicable after the close of the poll, the Returning Officer, in the presence of such scrutineers as are present, shall—

(i) produce unopened all return-envelopes received up to the close of the poll;

(ii) examine each envelope, and, if it is properly signed and properly endorsed with the prescribed particulars thereon and otherwise complies with the provisions herein contained, accept the vote for further scrutiny;

(iii) if an envelope is not properly signed or otherwise does not comply with the provisions herein contained, reject the vote without opening the envelope;

(iv) place the envelopes containing unrejected votes on a table face downward, so that the signature of the voters shall not be visible;

(v) open each such envelope, withdraw the ballot-paper contained therein, and, without inspecting the vote or permitting any other person to do so, deposit the ballot-paper in a ballot-box;

(vi) when all such envelopes have been opened and the ballot-papers withdrawn therefrom and deposited in the ballot-box, open the ballot-box, and count the votes.

(n) The five candidates who have received the greatest number of votes shall be duly elected.

(o) The Returning Officer may from time to time adjourn the scrutiny to a day and hour fixed by him and notified to scrutineers.

(p) Subject to the provisions contained herein, the provisions of the law for the time being regulating elections for the Legislative Assembly shall, so far as they can be made applicable and with such adaptations, modifications, and substitutions as are necessary, apply to elections under this regulation.

(q) If at any election the number of votes received by any two or more candidates are equal and the addition of one vote to any one of the said candidates would enable that candidate to be declared elected, the Returning Officer shall decide by lot which of such candidates shall be elected.

- (r) At any time before the gazettal of the result of any election as hereinafter provided, the Returning Officer may, if he thinks fit, on the written request of any candidate setting forth the reasons for the request, or may, of his own motion, make a recount of the votes.

If the Returning Officer refuses on the request of a candidate to make a recount of the votes, the candidate may, in writing, appeal to the Minister to direct a recount, and the Minister may, as he thinks fit, either direct a recount or refuse to direct a recount.

- (s) At the conclusion of every election, the Returning Officer shall, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, declare the result of the election and shall forward a copy of such notice to the Minister.
- (t) Forthwith after the declaration of the result of every election the Returning Officer shall forward to the Registrar all documents, rolls, and ballot-papers relating to the election, and the Registrar shall cause such documents, rolls, and ballot-papers to be stored at her office for a period of six months after receipt of same and then to be destroyed.

- (u) Any person who—
- personates any registered nurse for the purpose of voting at any election; or
 - votes or attempts to vote more than once at the same election—
- shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

2. For the first election in the year 1941 of representatives of registered nurses as members of the Board the following provisions shall apply in respect of the election of representatives of registered nurses:—

- (a) The notices of election given by the Minister and the Registrar, the nomination day, and the polling day shall be on such days and at such intervals as the Minister deems fit.
- (b) Subject to paragraph (a) of this clause such election shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of this Regulation.

ADDITIONS TO THE MIDWIVES REGULATIONS, 1935.

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 29 of the *Nurses Act* 1928, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations, which shall come into force on publication in the *Government Gazette*:—

BY-LAW No. 36.

Regulation (Standing Orders).

WHEREAS in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1928* the Board passed By-law No. 17 and certain Regulations (called Standing Orders) with respect to the management and transaction of the business of the Board: And whereas the Board is desirous of altering the said By-law and Regulations in manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore in exercise of the said powers and authorities the Board doth hereby alter the said By-law and Regulations (Standing Orders) by inserting therein and adding thereto a new Regulation (Standing Order) which new By-law and Regulation the Board hereby makes and it shall be as follows, that is to say:—

Any member desirous of putting a question as to the work or procedure of the Board shall reduce the same to writing and forward it to the Secretary of the Board. If such question is in order (as to which the Chairman's decision shall be final) the answer shall as far as practicable be read at the next meeting of the Board by the Secretary of the Board, provided it was received four clear days (exclusive of Sundays and public holidays) prior to such Board meeting. Provided, however, that it shall be competent for any member of the Board, with the consent of the Chairman or temporary or presiding Chairman, to put any question on any matter of urgency without notice. No discussion or further question shall be allowed on the question or the answer thereto, or on the decision of any such Chairman as to the question being in order or otherwise.

Nothing in this By-law shall limit the right of any member to ask at any meeting of the Board questions relating to business indicated in the Notice Paper of such meeting and set down for consideration by the Board.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

BY-LAW No. 37.

Water Supply.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called the Board), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Board in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. An apparatus in which water is used for cooling purposes shall be deemed to be an apparatus within the meaning of this By-law.

2. Clause 6 of the Board's By-law No. 34 is hereby amended as from the date of coming into operation of this By-law by the deletion therefrom of the words "cooling windows". Provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall affect the validity or enforcement of any rate or charge or abrogate or alter the power of the Board to recover and enforce payment of any rate or charge made before the coming into operation of this By-law and every such rate or charge shall be levied and the payment thereof enforced as if this By-law had not been made; and nothing herein contained shall relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the said By-law No. 34.

3. The use of water as aforesaid for any such apparatus shall be subject to the conditions and charges as set out in this By-law.

4. No such apparatus shall be installed or used in, on, or in connexion with any property, land, or tenement unless the Board shall have first consented thereto in writing.

5. Applications for consent to install or use such apparatus shall state the make and type, the minimum and maximum water requirements, and any other information the Board may require.

6. If water used for or in the operation of the said apparatus under full output exceeds a half ($\frac{1}{2}$) gallon per minute it shall be re-used unless consent to run it to waste shall have been obtained in writing from the Board.

7. The quantity of water run to waste shall be limited to the quantity specified in the Board's consent. The water which shall so run to waste shall be recorded by a meter specially fixed for the purpose, and shall be paid for at 1s. per 1,000 gallons in addition to the water rate and any other charge payable in respect of the property, land, or tenement. Should water in excess of the quantity so specified in the Board's consent be run to waste, every owner or occupier of the property, land, or tenement, or other persons supplied with or using the water so supplied by the Board who shall permit or allow such excess water to be run to waste, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

8. Where at the time of this By-law coming into operation such apparatus has been installed in or is used in connexion with any property, land, or tenement, the supply thereto shall continue under the existing terms and conditions. Provided, however, that on any extension, enlargement, or alteration of the apparatus or on the renewal of any part of the water service supplying it, the whole installation shall then be altered and made to comply in every respect with the requirements of the By-laws of the Board and to the satisfaction of the Engineer of Water Supply by the said owner or occupier or persons supplied with or using water as aforesaid, and payment for the water supply thereto shall be made in accordance with the provisions and under the terms and conditions of this By-law.

9. The owner or occupier or other person supplied by the Board with water as aforesaid shall keep or cause to be kept such apparatus and all pipes in connexion therewith in a proper state of repair.

10. Any owner, occupier, or other person who is supplied with water by the Board as aforesaid who shall fail to comply with this By-law or who shall otherwise commit a breach of its terms shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence hereunder, and shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £5, and to a further penalty not exceeding £2 for each day the offence continues after notice thereof from the Board.

The foregoing By-law was duly made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the common seal of the said Board was hereunto affixed the eleventh day of March, 1941, in the presence of—
