The proportion shall be Sixty-eight per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of May, 1942.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1942.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO VACCINATION AGAINST
SMALL-POX.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Vaccination Regulations 1942" and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. All regulations made heretofore relating to matters provided for herein are repealed.

3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Commission" means the Commission of Public Health constituted under the *Health Act 1928*.

"Health Acts" includes the *Health Act 1928*, the *Health Act 1931*, and any other Act amending the same.

"Successful Vaccination" means that the course of the eruption produced by inoculation with vaccine corresponds with the description contained in the Schedule hereto.

"Vaccine" means the lymph obtained from the lesions produced by inoculating a calf with the virus of or derived from cow-pox and provided by the Commission, and such other vaccine as is approved by the Commission.

4. The manner in which vaccination shall be performed and the precautions to be observed by those performing it, and by the persons vaccinated or by the parents of children vaccinated, shall be as hereunder prescribed:—

(1) The vaccinator shall—

- (a) thoroughly cleanse the skin at the site selected for inoculation by any generally accepted surgical method;
- (b) sterilize the inoculating instrument immediately before using;
- (c) penetrate the cleansed skin with the inoculating instrument into the deeper layers of the epidermis or just beneath these layers by linear scratch about one-quarter of an inch long through a drop of vaccine, or by oblique puncture within the limits of an area about one-eighth of an inch in diameter carrying the vaccine thereinto.

(2) Any person vaccinated and the parent* of every child vaccinated shall faithfully carry out the directions of the vaccinator.

* Parent means any person having custody of a child.—*Health Act 1928 (No. 3697)*.

5. The fees to be paid to public vaccinators for the performance of duties imposed on them under the Health Acts shall be as prescribed hereunder:—

A fee of two shillings and six pence shall be paid by the Public Health Department to every public vaccinator for each successful vaccination and for each unsuccessful re-vaccination done by him and shown in the quarterly return under these Regulations, provided the provisions of the Health Acts and the Regulations thereunder have been duly complied with.

6. Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

7. The forms of returns and books of record to be used in connexion with vaccination or otherwise under Part VII. of the *Health Act 1928*, as amended by any other Act, and the

particulars therein contained shall be as hereunder prescribed:—

MEMO.—This return must be transmitted to the Secretary of the Commission of Public Health immediately after the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December.

The accounts for fees for vaccination are prepared by the Accountant's Branch of the Health Department from the quarterly returns furnished by Public Vaccinators. Cheques are forwarded to Public Vaccinators each quarter except in cases where the total of the account is less than ten shillings. In such cases the cheques are forwarded at the end of the June quarter in each year. Any change of address should be notified immediately to the Department.

SCHEDULE.

Types of Reaction Following Vaccination.

Observation two days after vaccination, and again on the fourth day and the eighth day, is necessary for differentiation between the reaction of immunity, the vaccinoid reaction indicating partial immunity, and the primary vaccinia reaction indicating absence of immunity.

The spreading and receding of the erythema is the essential part of the reaction, and the three types of reaction are differentiated from each other by the time at which the greatest diameter is reached.

With the reaction of immunity which indicates full protection against smallpox, the broadest redness is reached and passed in 8 to 72 hours after vaccination. The redness is accompanied by a slight elevation of the skin, which can be felt by passing the finger lightly over the vaccinated area. There is usually no vesicle. The time of the maximum reaction and not the amount of redness and infiltration is the index of immunity. The more prompt the maximum the higher is the immunity. It is distinguished from ordinary protein reactions by this time factor. Protein intradermal reactions are rapid, usually reach their maximum within about half an hour, whilst smallpox immunity reaction reaches its maximum in not less than eight hours.

With the accelerated or modified reaction called vaccinoid, which indicates partial immunity, the broadest redness is reached and passed in three to seven days after vaccination.

With a typical primary vaccination or vaccinia, indicating absence of immunity to smallpox prior to this vaccination, the zone of redness or areola rather narrow from the third to the seventh day, begins a sudden spread about seven days after vaccination and reaches its broadest diameter in eight to fourteen days after vaccination, rapidly disintegrating and disappearing thereafter. Vesicles are formed in vaccinoid and primary vaccinia reactions.

The sharp division of these post-vaccinal reactions into the three types is somewhat arbitrary, all gradations being found in practice. All reactions should be read on second and fourth as well as on the eighth day.

Primary vaccinia leaves a pitted scar, red at first, and gradually becoming white. Scars of vaccinoid are much less marked, and reaction of immunity usually leaves no scar.

All the three types are successful provided the smallpox vaccine was fresh and strong. All three not only indicate the previous grade of immunity, but increase the immunity as well. All other results, where proper technique with a minimum of trauma was used and the individual was in good health indicate deficient vaccine. Every vaccination should give a reaction.

The vesicle of typical vaccinia has a turbid, whitish appearance, but does not become a true pustule, and dries up and heals promptly after the height of the reaction is reached.

Printed forms of tender and the conditions of contract may, in all cases, be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Gisborne-street, Melbourne; and for the respective districts from the Clerks of Courts at Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Castlemaine, and Sale; for Sunbury, from the Medical Superintendent, Mental Hospital; for Greenvale and Gresswell, from the Medical Superintendents at the Sanatoriums; for Larundel and Travancore, from the Medical Superintendents; for Coorimungie, from the Officer in Charge of Police, Timboon; for Aborigines, Lake Tyers, from the Police Stations at Bairnsdale and Lakes Entrance; for Rutherglen, from the Superintendent, Viticultural College; for the School of Forestry, from the senior master, Creswick; for the McLeod Settlement, from the Officer in charge of Police, Lang Lang; and for the Pleasant Creek Special School, Stawell, from the Secretary—by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, by bank draft or marked cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board. The amount of the preliminary deposit required with each tender must be enclosed, and the amount must be clearly written in and the designation stated, whether marked cheque or bank draft, as the case may be. Cheques, Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits, which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required, either in bank guarantee (bank to be approved by the Tender Board), Commonwealth Treasury bonds, Savings Bank deposit book or fixed deposit receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the service may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is satisfactory and the prices tendered are considered reasonable.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted. In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual, and that for a breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for _____ at _____" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Health Acts, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in

the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor any of the articles specified in the schedule in the event of emergency due to the war.

3. Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; the Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, and Sunbury Districts will include the Mental Hospitals, Gaols, and Police Gaols at those places; and the Castlemaine District will include the Gaol. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules, or as directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the rate tendered, except butter boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for; the empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him, and shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, who shall render his account as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. Where practicable, the contractor shall use the Railways for the transport of the goods. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, except for Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in the triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee and the quintuplicate retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered at the time mentioned in the order or within such other time as the officer ordering the supply may specify for delivery, it will be competent for such officer, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations or stores are due or by the contractor in waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being, such appeal to be made in writing within 24 hours of the rejection; but, pending such appeal, he must at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required, or any like supplies suitable for the Service, may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

17. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

19. 23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of these contracts the word "Government" shall mean the Government of the State of Victoria; and the word "Treasurer" shall mean the Treasurer of the said State.
