**CERTAIN PLANT DECLARED TO BE A NOXIOUS WEED
WITHIN THE SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.**

PROCLAMATION

Tribulus terrestris, L. "Caltrop."

ORDER OF COUNCIL OF SHIRE OF GLENELG
CONFIRMED BY MINISTER.

I, GEORGE LOUIS GOUDIE, being the Minister of the Crown administering Part XVIII. of the *Local Government Act* 1928, in pursuance of the power in that behalf conferred on me by section 513 of that Act, do hereby confirm with the variations hereinafter referred to the Order of the Council of the Shire of Glenelg made on the 17th day of March, 1941, directing the execution of the work or undertaking of providing land, being part of Crown allotment 9, section 9, Parish of Wando, County of Dundas, for the supply of materials for road construction according to the specifications and plan deposited in the office of the said Council on the 16th December, 1940.

The variations above referred to are as follows:—

1. There shall be substituted for the description of the land referred to in the specifications mentioned in such Order the following description:—All that piece of land being part of Crown allotment 9, section 9, Parish of Wando, County of Dundas, which is delineated in the amendment of the plan of survey annexed hereto, being that part of the said allotment 9 commencing at the point where the north-eastern boundary of the said allotment abuts on the Wando River, being the northern angle of the said allotment: thence by the said north-eastern boundary bearing south 32 deg. east 1 chain 8 links; thence by a line bearing south 31 deg. 14 min. west 1 chain 12 links; thence by a line bearing south 32 deg. east 4 chains 28 7/10 links; thence by a line bearing south 42 deg. 43 min. west 12 chains 84 9/10 links; thence by a line bearing south 37 deg. 2 min. west 62 links; thence by a line bearing north 77 deg. 33 min. west 5 chains 6 4/10 links to the Wando River; thence by the Wando River bearing north-easterly to the commencing point, and containing 7 acres 0 roods 27 perches or thereabouts.

2. The plan of survey annexed to such specification shall be amended by the surveyor to the Council so as to make it accord with such last-mentioned description.

AMENDMENT OF PILOTAGE REGULATIONS (SCHEDULE "A").

UNDER powers in that behalf conferred by section 79 of the *Marine Act 1928*, and all other powers it in that behalf enabling, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, doth ordain and determine as follows:—

1. "That on and after the first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, the pilotage rate from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay or vice versa, for steamships and ships propelled by electricity or other mechanical power, up to and including 5,000 tons of the vessel's burthen, shall be Two and five-sixteenth pence (2 5/16d.) per ton calculated on the vessel's net registered tonnage, from 5,001 tons up to and including 10,000 tons One penny (1d.) per ton, and for every additional ton One-sixteenth pence (1/16d.), subject in any case to a minimum charge of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.)."

2. "That on and after the first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, the pilotage rate for a pleasure yacht or other vessel, not being a ship of war, resorting to port, only for or on account of one or more of the following purposes or causes, namely, pleasure or seeking cargo or calling for orders or effecting repairs or docking or obtaining provisions or through stress of weather or undergoing survey or being otherwise in distress, subject to the proviso that should the vessel subsequently discharge or load any cargo, or land or take on board any passengers in the port for the purpose of or incidental to earning freight or passage money, the vessel and those concerned shall be liable to pay and shall pay the ordinary full rates of pilotage in respect of the vessel, both inwards and outwards:—

From without Port Phillip Heads to any anchorage within the ports of Port Phillip, Geelong, or Melbourne, or vice versa (calculated upon net registered tonnage):—

CITY OF ESSENDON.

BY-LAW NO. 96.

A By-law of the City of Essendon, numbered 96, made under the Local Government Acts for requiring the removal of undergrowth, weeds, or grass from land.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon do hereby order and direct—

1. That the area within the municipal district of the City of Essendon is, for the purpose of this By-law, hereby declared a populous area.

2. Where in its opinion any undergrowth, weeds, or grass on any land within any of the said area constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property the Council may, by notice in writing addressed to the owner or occupier of such land, require such owner or occupier to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass from such land within such reasonable time as shall be prescribed by such notice.

3. If such owner or occupier, after service on him of a notice to remove undergrowth, weeds, or grass as aforesaid, shall fail to do so within the time prescribed by such notice, the Council may cause such undergrowth, weeds, or grass to be removed from such land and may recover the cost of such removal from the owner or occupier in default.

4. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than Twenty shillings, and not exceeding Twenty pounds for each and every offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence under the By-law is continued.

SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

ACT No. 4856—AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW RELATING TO DOGS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Alexandra did, at a meeting of the Council held on Wednesday, the 8th day of April, 1942, order that section 4 of Act No. 4856—An Act to amend the Law relating to Dogs—be enforced in the following part of the municipal district, that is to say:—

4. (1) The owner of any dog (other than a dog being used in the droving of stock)—

(a) which is found during the period between sunset and sunrise in any municipal district, or part of a municipal district, specified for the purposes of this section, by order of the Council of that municipality published in the *Government Gazette*, and in some newspaper circulating in that municipal district; and

(b) which is not—

(i) upon the premises of such owner; or
(ii) effectively secured by means of a proper chain or enclosure; or
(iii) under the effective control of some person by means of a proper chain, cord, or leash—
