REGULATIONS REVOKING CERTAIN NATIONAL SECURITY REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS under the Commonwealth Act known as the National Security Act 1939-1940 Regulations and Orders have been made in respect of subject-matters substantially the same as those dealt with in the Regulations under the National Security (Emergency Powers) Acts which are specified in the Schedule hereto: And whereas the operation of certain of the Regulations made under the last-mentioned Acts is spent. Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the National Security (Emergency Powers) Acts and of all other powers thereto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:-

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Security Citation. (Revocation) Regulations.
- 2. The Regulations specified in the Schedule to these Regulations Revocation of National Security Regulations are hereby revoked.
