COMMONWEALTH NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

STATE OF VICTORIA.

CONTROL OF LIFTS ORDER No. 2.

ORDER No. 31,

WHEREAS by Regulation 35A of the Commonwealth National Security (General) Regulations it is provided inter atia that the Premier of any State, after consultation with the Minister of State for Home Security or an officer of the Department of Home Security authorized by that Minister to act on his behalf and with the Commandant of a Military District or an officer authorized by the Minister of State for Defence Co-ordination or the Minister of State for the Army to act on behalf of such Commandant, may by Order make such provision as he deems necessary to protect the persons and property of the civil population in that State or any part thereof in case of emergency:

Now therefore I, Albert Arthur Dunstan, Premier of the State of Victoria, having duly held such consultations, do hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Control of Lifts Order (Victoria) Citation. No. 2.
- adding at the end thereof the following sub-clause:-
- 2. Clause 3 of the Control of Lifts Order (Victoria) is amended by ding at the end thereof the following sub-clause:—

 "(4) The Chief Warden appointed by the State Emergency immobilization at close Services Order (Victoria) may by writing under his hand and of business subject to such conditions as he thinks fit exempt any lift or the lifts in any building from the operation of this clause."
