State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932.

AWARD No. 60 OF 11TH MAY, 1942, RELATING TO RATES
OF PAY OF CERTAIN WORKERS AT THE STATE COAL
MINE, WONTHAGGI.

THE State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of
the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of
the State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932 (No. 4030),
and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in
Council made thereunder, hereby determines and awards as
follows (that is to say):—

1. The adult male workers included in Part III. of the
Schedule to the Act (except those for whom weekly rates are
prescribed) shall be paid a basic wage of 16s. 4d. per day
when working on a basis of twelve shifts a fortnight, 17s. 10d.
per day when working on a basis of eleven shifts a fortnight,
and 19s. 7d. per day when working on a basis of ten shifts per
fortnight, and in addition the margins prescribed in the
appropriate awards in operation.

2. That in lieu of the rates prescribed for workers in the
under-mentioned grades in Awards No. 58 and No. 59 the
following rates shall be substituted, viz.:—

NAGAMBIE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1942.

(a) Where in the opinion of the Council any undergrowth, weeds, or grass upon any land within the area set out in the Schedule hereto constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property, the Council may cause to be served on the owner or occupier of such land a notice, in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk requiring such owner or occupier to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass within the time limited in such notice not being less than seven days from the service thereof.
- (b) If such owner or occupier shall refuse or neglect within the time limited in such notice to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass from the said land, the Council (notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty) may by its officers, servants, or agents at any time thereafter enter upon such land and remove therefrom such undergrowth, weeds, or grass, and may recover the cost thereof in any Court of competent jurisdiction from the owner or occupier.
- (c) Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than 20s., and not exceeding £20 for each and every offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which an offence under the By-law is continued.

1. In cases where, in the opinion of the Council, undergrowth, weeds, or grass (hereinafter referred to as "such undergrowth") on land within that part of the corporate limits of the Shire of Broadmeadows, and within 10 miles

radius from the General Post Office, constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property, the Council may, through its Inspector or otherwise, give notice, in writing, to the owner or occupier of such land requiring him to remove such undergrowth within a period of not less than seven days prescribed in such notice, and stating that in default of compliance therewith the Council may remove such undergrowth and recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier.

2. In the event of the owner or occupier failing or neglecting to comply with the notice referred to in the preceding clause of this By-law the Council may remove such undergrowth and recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier.

3. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Twenty pounds for each such offence.

4. The area within the corporate limits of the Shire of Broadmeadows, as defined in clause 1, is hereby declared to be a populous area.

SHIRE OF WARRACKNABEAL.

BY-LAW 27.

A By-law of the Shire of Warracknabeal made under the Local Government Acts and Part I. of the Police Offences Acts, for the regulation of traffic in the said Shire, and the routes to be observed by carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for preventing obstruction of carriage ways.

Sub-clause (g) of clause 2 of the By-law No. 22 of the Shire of Warracknabeal is amended by inserting after the word "street" first occurring, the following words (except Scott-street, Warracknabeal, between Lyle-street and a point 200 feet north of the northern building line of Phillips-street).

2. (a) The driver of a vehicle in Scott-street, Warracknabeal, between Lyle-street and a point 200 feet north of the northern building line of Phillips-street shall, except in so far as shall be necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or for other justifiable cause, on stopping in the said street, cause his vehicle to be drawn with the left or near side thereof parallel to the line of the kerb of the said street, and as near as possible to the kerb, and between the kerb and the line denoted on the said street and drawn parallel to the kerb, and so as not to interfere with the pedestrian use of any crossing provided over the street channel.

(b) The driver of a vehicle on those portions of Scott-street, Warracknabeal, as defined in sub-clause (a) hereof shall not stop in the said street (those portions of the said street defined as parking areas excepted) save for the purpose of putting down or taking up passengers or for loading or unloading goods.

3. Any contravention of any of the forgoing provisions of this By-law by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

4. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
