AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SJPPLY COMMISSION.
BY-LAW NO. 4032.—URBAN DISTRICT SUPPLIED WITH WATER
FROM THE COLIBAN SYSTEM OF WATERWORKS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

- 1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District supplied with water from the Coliban system of waterworks, for the supply of water for domestic purposes:—
 - (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual municipal valuation whereof does not exceed £13 6s. 8d.—Twenty shillings per annum.
 - (2) Of any such tenement the annual municipal valuation whereof exceeds £13 6s. Sd.—Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of such valuation not exceeding £300; Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of such valuation exceeding £300 and not exceeding £700; and Five pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation exceeding £700.
 - (3) Of lands on which there is no building—Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the annual municipal valuation.
- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1942, and ending with the 30th day of June. 1943, and shall be payable on the 1st day of October, 1942, at the office of the said Commission at Bendigo or Castlemaine.
- 3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MURMUNGEE RECREATION

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 22nd December, 1939, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Murmungee, and known as the "Murmungee Recreation Reserve."

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding thirty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or for holding amusements, on any of which occasions the fee which may be charged and taken for admission shall be such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and six nerve

Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and six pence.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure the buildings, gates, feuces, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses.

of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6 No person shall bring into the Reserve any day unless.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained

8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or takepart in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.

11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order of the Committee of Management. 12. No person shall take part in any organized games, sports, or entertainments of any sort in the Reserve at any time without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful sports or games, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine, the use of the grounds so set

14. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use thereof, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management. but shall not exceed the sum of £5 5s. per day.

Any person committing in the Reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of admission or of member-ship of any of the clubs playing tennis or bowls in the Reserve, or any part thereof, with the consent of the Committee of Management :-

- (a) Assaulting any other person.
- (b) Being in an intoxicated condition.
- (c) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (d) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting language.
- (e) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (f) Wilfully interfering with or disturbing any entertainment, performance, game, amusement, or tournament to the annoyance, detriment, or discomfort of any person or persons engaged in such entertainment, performance, game, amusement, or tournament ment.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Tenpounds. pounds.

1. No person shall use any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads for the growing of any tree. shrub, or hedge abutting on any such street or road or

within 10 feet therefrom unless, for a distance of 20 feet from the corner of such private property, each part of such tree, shrub, or hedge is kept at a height not greater than 4 feet above that point on the surface level of the adjacent treet or road which is nearest to such part of such tree, shrub, or hedge.
