HEPBURN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1943.

THE Hepburn Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and three pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Hepburn Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty-five shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1943, and shall be payable in equal moieties on the 1st day of January, 1943, and the 1st day of July, 1943, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity computed as in the last preceding clause is hereby fixed at One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 5,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

KOO-WEE-RUP WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1943.

THE Koo-wee-rup Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and nine pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Koo-wee-rup Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than twenty-five shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Twelve shillings and six pence.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the first day of January, 1943, and shall be payable on the first day of January, 1943, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity computed as in the last preceding clause is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

The secretary of the Trust for the time being is hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover on behalf of the Trust the rates and charges imposed by this By-law.

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 12th day of November, 1930, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of December, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of December, 1930, are hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations."

2. Regulation 123 is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof the following Regulation is substituted:—

"123. No person shall remove any goods from any wharf or shed within the fenced-in area without delivering to the Customs Officer at the gate, or where there is no Customs officer stationed at the gate, to the person acting under the authority of the Commissioners, a permit from the master, owner, or agent of the importing vessel to remove such goods, and satisfying such officer or person that the provisions of Regulation 122 have been complied with."

3. Regulation 173 is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Regulation is substituted:—

"173. The owners, consignees, or persons claiming such liquor remaining in the "wet shed" after the expiration of six days from the date of having been placed therein, shall pay to the Commissioners in respect of the use of such shed One shilling per ton for the first week, and for every subsequent week the sum of Three pence per ton additional to the amount per ton payable for each immediately preceding week; that is to say, One shilling and three pence per ton for the second week, One shilling and six pence per ton for the third week, and so on. For the purposes of this Regulation a fraction of a ton shall be deemed a ton.

If, in the opinion of the Commissioners, the non-removal of liquor within the time limited has been due to some cause beyond the control of the owner of the liquor, then the Commissioners may, if they think fit, on the application of the owner, grant a refund of such part of the said storage fees paid under this Regulation as exceeds the rate of One shilling per ton per week. The Commissioners may require a statutory declaration verifying the facts of the case by such person or persons as they shall think proper."

## REGULATIONS RELATING TO PRECAUTIONS AGAINST DANGER FROM COAL DUST.

HIS Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 68 of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1928*, doth make the following Regulations:—

1. Such measures shall be taken for the prevention, suppression, collection, and removal of coal dust, and for treating it with incombustible dust or in other manner approved, in writing, by the Chief Mining Inspector, as will ensure that on the floor, roof, and sides respectively of every road or part of a road which is accessible, the dust which can be raised into the air shall contain, when tested in the manner hereinafter prescribed, not less than the percentage of incombustible matter set out in the Schedule to these Regulations according to the volatile matter content of the coal.

The percentage of incombustible matter means the actual percentage of incombustible matter (including moisture) contained in the dust.

The volatile matter content of the coal means the average volatile matter content calculated on an ash free dry basis of the seam of coal worked through the road (or if more than one seam is so worked of that seam which has the highest average volatile matter content), and shall be deemed to be more than 32 per cent. unless the contrary has been proved by an analysis made and communicated to the Inspector within the previous twelve months. The analysis shall be made by one of the methods specified by the British Standard Institution, and the sample of coal used for such analysis shall be taken from a representative section of the seam or from a representative quantity of the run-of-mine coal from the seam.

Provided that in any seam in which inflammable gas is unknown, and in which no explosive other than a sheathed permitted explosive is used in any road or ripping, or any dry and dusty part of the mine, the percentage of incombustible matter shall not be required to be more than 50 per cent. if that is the natural condition of the dust throughout the road, or more than 60 per cent. if the road is treated with incombustible dust.

2. The incombustible dust used for the purpose of these Regulations shall be:—

- (a) of such fineness that, of the dry dust which passes through a 60 mesh not less than 50 per cent. by weight and not more than 75 per cent. by weight shall pass through a 240-mesh sieve;
- (b) of such character that it is readily dispersible into the air and, when in use in places where it is not directly wetted by water from the strata, does not cake but is dispersed into the air when blown upon with the mouth or by a suitable appliance.

No incombustible dust shall continue to be used if it is found by tests, which shall be carried out regularly, not to comply with these requirements.

3. No dust shall be used for the purpose of complying with these Regulations of a kind which may be prohibited by the Chief Mining Inspector on the ground that it is likely to be injurious to the health of persons working in the mine.

4. The following steps shall be taken for the purpose of ensuring that No. 1 of these Regulations is complied with:—

- (a) At least ten samples of dust per mile of roadway shall be systematically collected and analysed each calendar month.

Provided that if analyses of the samples collected from any road have shown that the natural conditions of the road are such that No. 1 of these Regulations is complied with, or have shown, in respect of roads not used for the transport of coal and not within 200 yards of a working face, that the application of additional incombustible dust has not been required more than once in every six months, it shall suffice, so long as there is no visible change in the conditions, to collect and analyse the samples at intervals not exceeding three months, or at such longer intervals as may be authorized, in writing, by the Inspector.



(b) The samples of dust so collected shall be representative samples, and each sample shall be collected over a section of road not less than 50 yards in length, and shall comprise the dust collected to a depth of one-quarter of an inch as near as may be on the roof and the sides, and a depth not exceeding 1 inch on the floor, either

(i) by a method of strip sampling, by which the dust is collected from a succession of transverse strips, as nearly as possible of equal width, and equally spaced not more than 5 yards apart, of an aggregate area not less than 1 per cent. of the total area sampled; or

(ii) by a method of spot sampling by which one sub-sample or increment of dust for each yard of the length sampled is collected, as nearly as possible at regularly spaced intervals along a zig-zag path.

Except where otherwise directed by the Inspector of Mines, it shall suffice if the foregoing requirements are complied with in respect of the dust on the roof and sides of a road taken together instead of separately.

(c) Each sample shall be well mixed and quartered, and a representative portion of the mixture shall be sieved through a 60-mesh sieve and analysed by the appropriate method prescribed.

(d) The following shall be the methods of analysis:—

(i) (A) The sample of dust shall be sieved through a 60-mesh sieve. The sieve may be tapped lightly to assist the passage of the dust through the sieve, but the dust shall not be rubbed through the sieve. The dust that passes through the sieve shall be kept in an air-tight container until it is analysed.

(B) If a dust sample is too damp to be sieved through the 60-mesh sieve, it shall be sieved through an 18-mesh sieve, and the fraction passing through that sieve shall be allowed to dry in the air during one hour, and thereafter shall be sieved through a 60-mesh sieve, as described in the preceding paragraph. The percentage loss of moisture from the dust during the preliminary drying in the air shall be determined, and a correction shall then be made to the determined incombustible content of the dust which has passed through the 60-mesh sieve.

This correction shall be calculated as follows:—

If *M* is the percentage loss in weight of the dust passing the 18-mesh sieve during air drying, and *I* is the percentage of total incombustible matter in the dust passing the 60-mesh sieve, then the corrected total incombustible content of the dust per cent. is:—

$$M + I \frac{(100 - M)}{100}$$

(ii) The samples of dust prepared as aforesaid shall be analysed as follows:—

(A) *Dust samples which contain no Carbonates or Gypsum.*

(1) A weighed quantity of the sieved dust shall be dried at a temperature between 105° and 110°C., and the weight lost shall be reckoned as moisture.

(2) The residue shall then be brought to a red heat in an open vessel until it no longer loses weight. The weight of the incinerated residue added to the weight of the moisture shall be reckoned as incombustible matter, and be expressed as a percentage of the total weight of the sieved dust.

(B) *Dust samples which contain Carbonates.*

(1) A weighed quantity of the sieved dust shall be dried at a temperature between 105° and 110°C., and the loss in weight shall be reckoned as moisture.

(2) The residue shall then be heated in an open vessel to a temperature of at least 950°C. until it no longer loses weight. The incinerated residue shall be weighed.

(3) A weighed quantity of the sieved dust shall be treated with dilute hydrochloric acid in a suitable apparatus, and the weight of carbon dioxide evolved from the dust shall be either (a) determined directly, or (b) calculated from the volume of carbon dioxide evolved, or (c) determined in any other manner approved by the Chief Mining Inspector.

(4) The sum of the weights of moisture, carbon dioxide, and incinerated residue shall be reckoned as incombustible matter, and be expressed as a percentage of the total weight of the sieved dust.

(C) The incombustible content of the dust may be determined by such other method, and in such other manner, as may be approved, in writing, by the Chief Mining Inspector.

5. With 28 days of the taking of each sample, or such further time as the Chief Mining Inspector may grant in writing, the result of the analysis of such sample shall be recorded in the mine office, and shall there be made available for inspection during the ordinary hours of work when so required by the district inspector or any deputy or check inspector.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "SCARSDALE GRAVEL RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 21st October, 1941, as a site for Gravel Supply in the Parish of Scarsdale, and known as the "Scarsdale Gravel Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
5. The owner of any horse, cattle, or other animals found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and, in addition, such horse, cattle, or other animals may be impounded.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all powers incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
8. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the said Committee of such fees as the said Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and six pence per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission, the Committee of Management may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this Regulation shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half-year.
9. All gravel to be removed from the said Reserve, in accordance with the permission of the Committee of Management, shall be removed therefrom subject to and in accordance with the directions of the engineer of the Council of the Shire of Grenville, provided that and subject to such direction all gravel shall be removed on a face and for the full depth of the deposit. No overburden shall be allowed to remain on the floor of the pit, but all such overburden shall be removed and deposited as directed by the Committee of Management. All trees, stumps, logs, roots, branches, and other debris shall be removed from the pit as they are reached and fall, and shall not be left standing on "islands."

The Council of the Shire of Grenville has been appointed a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the

Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WHITTLESEA SWIMMING POOL RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of that portion of the land reserved as a site for a Public Park in the Parish of Toorourrong, at Whittlesea, as is indicated in red colour on plan marked W.B.3.8.39 attached to the Lands Department correspondence C.86542, and known as the "Whittlesea Swimming Pool Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter any of the pools before first washing himself in the shower bath, and every bather after using the latrines shall again wash under the showers without costume before returning to the pools.
2. No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease or sores shall enter or attempt to enter the Reserve.
3. No person shall use soap in any of the pools or cause the water therein to be fouled or polluted in any way.
4. No person shall use obscene language within the Reserve.
5. No person shall spit in any of the pools or on any seat or fixture or on to the floor or walls or any portion of the buildings or bathing enclosure.
6. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve while in a state of intoxication.
7. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal to enter the Reserve.
8. No person shall commit any nuisance in or upon any portion of the Reserve.
9. No person, not authorized by the Committee of Management, shall either enter or leave the bathing enclosure save by walking through the foot-pools, nor be or remain within the said enclosure unless decently attired in an approved bathing costume, save that the parents or guardians of small children using the pools may be permitted to accompany them within the bathing enclosure in ordinary attire.
10. No person shall at any time introduce into the Reserve any spirituous or intoxicating liquor.
11. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any locks, taps, or fittings in connexion with the baths; nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure fittings or other articles supplied for use in the baths, nor write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other part of the baths.
12. No person not authorized by the Committee of Management shall climb or attempt to climb over, on to, or upon, or remain on or upon any fixture, fountain, fence, roof, building, or structure surrounding or appurtenant to the baths.
13. No person not authorized by the Committee of Management shall be or remain upon the baths premises when the pool is being emptied or refilled or at night time when the lighting system is not in operation.
14. Except in the case of accident no person not authorized by the Committee of Management shall use or in any way interfere with the first-aid kits, life buoys, or other similar apparatus.
15. No person of either sex shall enter or attempt to enter or look into or attempt to look into any portion of the baths premises set apart either permanently or temporarily for the use of the other sex.
16. The Committee of Management shall have power from time to time, by resolution, to fix the hours during which the baths shall be open for the use of females only, and no person shall enter or attempt to enter or use or attempt to use the baths or portion thereof contrary to the terms of such resolution.
17. It shall be lawful for the person for the time being in charge of the baths to expel any person or persons from the

baths premises who indulge in any boisterous or rough play or unseemly conduct, or who in any way commits any breach of these Regulations.

18. No person shall do any act or thing or interfere in any way with any other person or persons, or with the springboard, or with any stand, platform apparatus, fixture, or facility established for use either permanently or temporarily at the baths which will cause or be likely to cause inconvenience, injury, or danger to himself or to any other person within or without the baths.

19. The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any articles lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the baths.

20. The Committee of Management shall not unreasonably or arbitrarily deny the public the use of the baths, but when it is considered advisable may close the baths for any particular purpose.

21. The Committee of Management shall have the power from time to time, by resolution, to fix and regulate the fees to be paid by the public for admission to the baths, or the use of other facilities, and every person shall, before being admitted to the Reserve, pay to the authorized person the charges so fixed.

22. The Committee of Management shall have power from time to time, by resolution, to give such directions as it may consider necessary for the proper management of the baths.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

#### SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

##### BY-LAW No. 32.

A By-law of the Shire of South Barwon, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1928, as amended by section 14 of the *Local Government Act* 1941, and numbered 32 for the purpose of—

- Requiring the removal of undergrowth, weeds, or grass from the land within certain areas of the Municipal District of the Shire of South Barwon in cases where the Council considers such undergrowth, weeds, or grass constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property.
- Enabling the Council in the event of default by the occupier or owner of the property to remove the same and to recover the cost of the work from the owner or occupier.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1928 and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of South Barwon make the following By-law, namely:—

1. Those areas within the Municipal District of the Shire of South Barwon in the schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the areas) are hereby declared to be populous or residential areas.

2. In cases where in the opinion of the Council undergrowth, weeds, or grass on any land within the area constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property, the Council may give notice in writing, signed by the Shire Secretary, requiring the removal of such undergrowth, weeds, or grass:

3. Such notice shall specify such time as the Council may consider reasonable in the circumstances to permit of such removal being effected from the land specified therein, but not less than seven days from the date of service, and shall be given to the occupier if any person be rated in the rate book of the municipality as occupier, or to the owner if no person be so rated as occupier, and the owner or occupier to whom such notice is given shall remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass within the time specified in such notice.

4. Such notice may be served upon the owner or occupier personally or by prepaid registered letter, post-addressed to the recipient at his or her address appearing in the municipal rate book and if served by post shall be deemed to have been served at the time when it would be delivered to such owner or occupier in the ordinary course of post.

5. If, after the expiration of the time specified in the said notice, the undergrowth, weeds, or grass referred to therein have not been removed in accordance with the provisions thereof, the Council may remove the same and recover the cost thereof from the owner or occupier (as the case may be) to whom such notice was given, but so that any liability of such owner or occupier to any penalty under this By-law shall not be affected thereby.

6. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty of not less than £1 nor more than £20 for each such offence.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the areas.
