BEALIBA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1943.

THE Commissioners of the Bealiba Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Two shillings in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Bealiba Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Fifty-five shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Five shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1943, and ending the 31st day of December, 1943, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1943, at the office of the Trust, Dunolly.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling and eight pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 33,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust, Dunolly.
