PROHIBITION OF THE USE OF POISON FOR TAKING OR KILLING WATER RATS (*HYDROMYS CHRYSOGASTER*).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prohibit the use of any poison or substance containing poison for taking or killing or for attempting to take or kill water rats (*Hydromys chrysogaster*).

I do hereby prescribe a penalty of not less than £2 or more than £20 for any contravention of this Proclamation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this tenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, and in the sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1941-42, No. 52.

THE Municipal Council of the City of Warrnambool, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes, of Fifteen pence (15d.) in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Warrnambool Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Five shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon all occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of October, 1941, and shall be payable on the 17th day of February, 1942, at the office of the said Council, Municipal Chambers, Warrnambool.

Such person or persons as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates.

CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BY-LAW No. 53.

THE Municipal Council of the City of Warrnambool doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by Water Acts, make the By-law as follows:—

The following are the charges to be made and levied by the council for water supplied by measurement, and in respect of the various purposes named:—

- (a) Private water troughs may be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Council shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for yearly shall be 20,000 gallons.
- (b) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Council is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Fourteen pence (14d.) per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.
- (c) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Council in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Fifteen pence (15d.) per 1,000 gallons.
- (d) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at Fifteen pence (15d.) per one thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 20,000 gallons.
- (e) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine not exceeding thirty (30) horse power, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.
- (f) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Twelve shillings and six pence per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.
- (g) For a supply of water for building purposes, the Council may make a charge of Two shillings and six pence per centum on the contract price for all stone work, brick work, and plastering, and in the absence of any such contract, on the sum paid for such stone work, brick work, and plastering, or the Council may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate of Two shillings and six pence per 1,000 gallons consumed.

The minimum charge on the per centum basis to be Five shillings, and as per measurement Twenty shillings. Such charge to be paid by the owner of the building. Payment in each case to be made in advance.

- (h) For water supplied to public parks and showgrounds, the charge shall be Nine pence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
- (i) For water supplied to the Botanic Gardens Court House Reserve, the Manifold-street Reserve, the Flagstaff Hill Reserve, the charge shall be Two pence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
- (j) For water supplied to the Warrnambool State Schools, Warrnambool High School, Warrnambool Technical School, the charge shall be Nine pence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons, and the water must be taken through a meter.
- (k) The before-mentioned charges shall be payable on demand at the office of the Council, Municipal Chambers, Warrnambool.
- (l) Such person or persons as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purposes shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

By-law No. 42, made by the Council on the 17th day of November, 1931, is hereby revoked.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

Special Rates.—For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of a standpipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such standpipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rate.

Public Institutions and Others.—Water supplied to all Government Departments, charitable and other institutions, and religious denominations shall be by measure at Twenty pence per 1,000 gallons, or by special agreement. For water supplied to cricket, bowling, or tennis clubs the charge shall be subject to arrangements with Trust.

Water Troughs.—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 6,000 gallons per annum, at Twenty pence per 1,000 gallons.

Period of Rate.—That the above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1942, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1942, and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of March, 1942, at the office of the said Trust. Such persons as the commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rates and charges.
