AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

AMENDMENT OF PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is provided under section 518 of the *Local Government Act 1928* that when in regard to any Proclamation made by the Governor in Council, pursuant to this section or any corresponding previous enactment, the Minister is satisfied that an error or misdescription has been made, the Governor in Council may rescind, revoke, amend or vary such Proclamation in whole or in part as the case requires: And whereas in a Proclamation, dated the thirteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fourteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, at page 135, misdescriptions were made in the preamble to such Proclamation and in the Proclamation of the public highway inasmuch as before the words "acquired for road purposes" there were omitted the words "used and part also", and after the letters, figures and words "S. 0 deg. 18 min. W. 5 inches" there followed the letters, figures and words "N. 89 deg. 57 min. E. 31 feet": Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby amend such Proclamation by inserting before the words "acquired for road purposes" the words "used and part also", and substituting the letters, figures and words "S. 89 deg. 57 min. W. 31 feet" for the letters, figures and words "N. 89 deg. 57 min. E. 31 feet".

AS AMENDED.

AFTER inquiry in the manner prescribed by the Milk Board Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, the Milk Board does by this notice—

- (a) Define the areas contained in the Schedule to this notice as areas in the metropolis for the purposes of section 24 of the *Milk Board Act 1933* (No. 4183), as amended, in substitution for the areas defined by notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th January, 1942.
- (b) Determine that, in respect of the areas defined in this notice, milk may be distributed by retail from the dairies described in the second column of the Schedule to this notice in the defined areas appearing opposite such dairies in the first column of such Schedule. STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION—
 BY-LAW No. 4028.—RATES AND CHARGES FOR WATER.—
 ALLANSFORD URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE OTWAY WATER
 WORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Allansford Urban District, within the Otway Waterworks District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Eighteen pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Thirty shillings for the period hereinafter set out.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Eighteen pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such lands. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such lands shall not be less than the sum of Five shillings for the period hereinafter set out.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the 7th day of February, 1942, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1942, and shall be payable on the

6th day of March, 1942, at the office of the said Commission at Camperdown.

3. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied during the period from 7th February, 1942, to 30th June, 1942, without further charge to properties rated by the Commission, shall be the quantity which, if charged for at the rate of One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to the rate payable for the period from 7th February, 1942, to 30th June, 1942, in respect of the properties so supplied.

4. For all water supplied in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph 3 of this By-law, the charge shall be One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons. Such charge shall be payable on demand at the office of the said Commission at Camperdown.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

BY-LAW No. 117, BEING A BY-LAW TO AMEND BY-LAWS NUMBERS 2 AND 81.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, being 6th Victoria No. 7, intituled "An Act to incorporate the inhabitants of the Town of Melbourne", which said Act was extended to Geelong by a further Act of the said Governor and Legislative Council numbered 13th Victoria No. 40, intituled "An Act to incorporate the inhabitants of the Town of Geelong and to extend and apply thereto the laws now in force for the regulation of the Corporation of Melbourne" and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Geelong doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That clause 2 of the said By-law Number 81 shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
2. In lieu thereof there shall be read and substituted the following clause, namely:—

"There shall be seven permanent Committees of the Council named and constituted as follows:—

- (1) *The Public Works Committee*, consisting of the whole of the members of the Council, five to form a quorum.
- (2) *The Legislative Committee, Finance Committee, Market Committee, and Parks and Gardens Committee*, each consisting of two members from each Ward, three to form a quorum.
- (3) *The City Hall Committee*, consisting of one member from each Ward, three to form a quorum.
- (4) *The Beach Improvement Committee*, consisting of any eight members of the Council, three to form a quorum."

3. The members of the aforesaid permanent Committees other than the Public Works Committee shall be appointed annually by the Council at its meeting held next after the annual installation of the Mayor, and any vacancies occurring during the course of a year shall be filled by the Council.

4. By-law No. 2 shall be amended as follows:—

(a) In clause 32 the words "excepting in cases of election when the vote shall be by ballot" shall be repealed, and at the end of the clause the following words shall be added, namely:—

"Provided that in cases of appointment to Committees or to other offices at the disposal of the Council if the Council by resolution (which may be framed and put without notice at the meeting at which such appointment is to be made) so decides the appointment shall be by ballot."

(b) In clause 37 for the word "seven" therein appearing there shall be read and substituted the word "fourteen".

(c) Clauses 42, 43, and 44 shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

5. This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law No. 2 and any By-law amending the same.

CITY OF OAKLEIGH.

By-LAW No. 63.

A By-law of the City of Oakleigh made under section 292 of the Health Act 1928, and section 197 of the Local Government Act 1928, and numbered 63 for or with respect to—

- (a) Prescribing the conditions on which animals may be received into or supplied or removed from abattoirs.
- (b) Fixing the rates of fees or dues payable to it under the provisions of Part XIII. of the Health Act 1928.
- (c) Prescribing the times for slaughtering animals at the abattoirs.
- (d) The feeding, watering, and tending and the prevention of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in the abattoirs, and the milking of milch animals at the abattoirs.

(e) Preserving good order and decency in buildings at the abattoirs.

(f) Conditions under which slaughtermen are permitted to operate at the abattoirs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act and the Local Government Act and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Council of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Oakleigh orders as follows:—

1. Definitions.—Wherever appearing in this By-law—

(a) "Abattoirs" means the abattoirs owned by the Council in conjunction with the Shire of Mulgrave and situate in North-road, East Oakleigh.

(b) "Animal" means any bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer, calf, ram, ewe, wether, lamb, goat, kid, or swine.

(c) "Committee of Management" means the committee consisting of members of the Oakleigh City and Mulgrave Shire Councils appointed from time to time by the councils respectively to manage the abattoirs in accordance with the agreement subsisting between the two councils relating to the abattoirs.

(d) "Council" means the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Oakleigh.

(e) "Inspector" shall mean the Inspector from time to time appointed by the Council or Committee of Management of the abattoirs under the provisions of Part XIII. of the Health Act 1928.

(f) "Secretary" shall mean the person for the time being holding the office of secretary to the Committee of Management.

Reception into or Supply or Removal of Animals from Abattoirs.

2. Animals intended for slaughter may be received into the abattoirs on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday of each week, between the hours of 6.30 a.m. and 8.30 p.m., other than such of the said days as are declared as public holidays.

3. The owner of or the person leaving any animal at the abattoirs for slaughtering shall pay to the Council fees for the accommodation of such animal of One penny for each week or portion of a week for each sheep or lamb, and One shilling for each week or portion of a week for any other animal so left, such charge to commence as from the day next following the day on which such animal is left and to continue until and including the day on which such animal is slaughtered.

4. No animal shall be removed from the abattoirs after once having been received therein, except as provided in clause 10.

5. Every animal upon being received into the abattoirs shall be raddle marked, the position and colour of such marks to be determined by the Inspector. The owner of such animal, or the person having the custody of or being in charge of it, shall comply with the instructions and directions of the inspector.

6. Every animal received into or placed in the abattoirs shall be examined by the Inspector before such animal is permitted to be slaughtered, and no person in charge or having the custody of any animal shall slaughter or permit or allow such animal to be slaughtered before being so examined.

Fees and Dues Payable.

7. The fees which shall be demanded, paid, received, and taken at the abattoirs by the inspector or other officer appointed by the Council for that purpose shall be as follows:—

- (e) For any certificate as to an examination made by a meat inspector, 2s. 6d. per head or carcass.

Times for Slaughtering.

8. The abattoirs shall be open for slaughtering every day not being any Saturday, Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Show Day, Cup Day, and such other public holidays as may be determined by the Committee of Management, from half-past seven o'clock in the forenoon until half-past four o'clock in the afternoon, and at no other times except upon special occasions, and then only upon such special conditions as may be prescribed in writing under the hand of the Secretary of the Committee of Management.

Feeding, Watering.—Prevention of Cruelty.

9. Every person who brings any animal into the abattoirs shall provide such animal with a sufficient quantity of whole some water and also with good and sufficient food at least once in every 24 hours.

10. No such person shall permit or allow any animal to remain in the abattoirs after three hours after notice requiring the removal of such animal shall have been given to the owner or other person who shall have brought such animal to the abattoirs. Any such notice may be verbal or in writing.

11. Every person who brings any animal into the abattoirs shall place such animal in such pen, stall, or yard at the abattoirs as the inspector may direct.

12. No person shall ill-treat or unnecessarily frighten or irritate any animal or resort to unnecessary cruelty in slaughtering any animal and no person shall do any act or observe any forbearance towards any such animal, which act or forbearance involves cruelty.

13. Every person in charge or having the custody of milch animals at the abattoirs shall milk such animals at such time and place as the Inspector, either verbally or in writing, may direct.

Good Order and Decency.

14. No person shall in or upon the abattoirs—

- (a) Carry or convey or cause to be carried or conveyed or consume any intoxicating liquor.
- (b) While apparently under the influence of intoxicating liquor be or remain therein or thereon.
- (c) Use any profane, indecent, or obscene language or commit any act of indecency.
- (d) Cause any disturbance or obstruct in the execution of his duty the Inspector, his assistant, or other officer or person appointed to conduct or assist in the management of the abattoirs.
- (e) Neglect or refuse to comply with any lawful request of the Inspector, his assistant, or other officer or person appointed to conduct or assist in the management of the abattoirs, or
- (f) Gamble or play any unlawful game.

15. Every person using the changing or dining rooms shall observe cleanliness therein, and shall not leave therein any clothes of any description between the time the abattoirs are closed on a Friday and the time they are next re-opened for the transaction of business.

16. No person shall hang or dry any sheep or other skins except in the shed provided for such purpose. All necessary rods and sticks for hanging skins must be provided by the owner of such skins.

17. No person shall permit or allow any sheep or other skins to be or remain in the shed mentioned in the last clause or in any other portion of the abattoirs between the hour of 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon of any Friday and 7.30 o'clock in the forenoon of the following Monday. If any skins are found upon the abattoirs in contravention of this clause the Inspector may (without prejudice to any penalty for which the person in default shall be liable) without notice destroy such skins.

Slaughtermen.

18. No person shall be permitted to commence or continue to work for any other person at the abattoirs as a slaughterman unless his name shall be recorded in the Register of Slaughtermen kept by the Secretary, and he shall have signed an undertaking to observe, comply with, and obey each and every of the by-laws and rules of the abattoirs under pain (apart from any other penalty) of having his name expunged from the Register of Slaughtermen.

19. If the Inspector shall be of the opinion that any person whose name shall be entered in the Register of Slaughtermen shall have been guilty of any breach of any undertaking or

writing given by such person or if the Inspector is of the opinion that the presence of such person in the abattoirs is undesirable or prejudicial to the best interests of the abattoirs, the Inspector shall make a report to such effect to the Secretary who may expunge the name of such person from the Register of Slaughtermen and such person on being required by the Inspector so to do shall immediately leave the abattoirs and not enter or attempt to enter the abattoirs unless his name shall thereafter be re-instated in the Register of Slaughtermen.

20. Any person who shall feel aggrieved by reason of the expunging of his name from the Register of Slaughtermen may by notice in writing to the Secretary appeal to the Committee of Management who shall hear and determine such appeal allowing such evidence and statements to be given and made before it as it may think fit, and the decision of the Committee of Management or of a majority thereof shall be final and binding on such person and on the Inspector and Secretary.

21. No person shall, without the consent of the Inspector first obtained, remove from the abattoirs any meat or carcass derived from a bull, a cow, or an ox unless such carcass or meat shall have remained in the chilling chamber at the abattoirs for at least twelve hours.

The resolution for making and passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council at a meeting held on Monday, the 17th day of November, 1941.

The said resolution was confirmed by the Council at a meeting held on Monday, the 15th day of December, 1941.

BOROUGH OF PORTLAND.

BY-LAW No. 67.

A By-law of the Borough of Portland made under sections 198 and 228 of the Local Government Act with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 67, for the purpose of altering No. 66, which provides for regulating the erection of buildings, &c.

IN pursuance of powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and any other Act, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portland order as follows:—

1. *Section 8. Site Restrictions.*—Clause 2 (Brick Areas) shall be altered by adding to such clause, after the words "attached thereto", the words "Provided that the Council shall have power in the case of buildings made necessary in connexion with sewerage, to exempt from the provisions of this clause all minor additions to existing buildings of classes 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, and 7, or all out-buildings to be erected, attached to, or detached from such existing buildings, provided that the outer walls of the same are constructed of fire resisting materials or covered with galvanized iron or other fire resisting materials and comply with all other requirements of this By-law".

2. *Section 27. Timber Buildings and Construction.*—Clause 2 (Construction Requirements, &c.) shall be altered by adding to such clause, after the words "will not be permitted", the words "Provided that the Surveyor is also authorized to accept construction of buildings such as closets, bathrooms, and wash-houses, the specifications of which comply with the Portland Sewerage Authority's specifications and type drawings, and not with the sizes given in Table 9, in such cases where he is satisfied that the dimensions of such buildings are within reasonable limits for construction of this type".

3. This By-law shall come into operation when confirmed by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

The resolution adopting the foregoing By-law was passed by the Council of the Borough of Portland on the 18th day of November, 1941, and confirmed on the 23rd day of December, 1941.

A By-law of the Shire of Mulgrave, made under section 292 of the *Health Act 1928*, and section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 39, for or with respect to—

- (a) Prescribing the conditions on which animals may be received into or supplied or removed from abattoirs.
- (b) Fixing the rates of fees or dues payable to it under the provisions of Part XIII of the *Health Act 1928*.
- (c) Prescribing the times for slaughtering animals at the abattoirs.
- (d) The feeding, watering, and tending, and the prevention of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in the abattoirs, and the milking of milch animals at the abattoirs.
- (e) Preserving good order and decency in buildings at the abattoirs.
- (f) Conditions under which slaughtermen are permitted to operate at the abattoirs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* and the *Local Government Act*, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Council of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mulgrave orders as follows:—

1. Definitions.—Wherever appearing in this By-law:—

- (a) "Abattoirs" means the abattoirs owned by the Council in conjunction with the City of Oakleigh, and situate in North-road, East Oakleigh.
- (b) "Animal" means any bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer, calf, ram, ewe, wether, lamb, goat, kid, or swine.
- (c) "Committee of Management" means the committee consisting of members of the Oakleigh City and Mulgrave Shire Councils appointed from time to time by the Councils respectively to manage the abattoirs in accordance with the agreement subsisting between the two Councils relating to the abattoirs.
- (d) "Council" means the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mulgrave.
- (e) "Inspector" shall mean the Inspector from time to time appointed by the Council or Committee of Management of the abattoirs under the provisions of Part XIII of the *Health Act 1928*.
- (f) "Secretary" shall mean the person for the time being holding the office of Secretary to the Committee of Management.

Reception into or Supply or Removal of Animals from Abattoirs.

2. Animals intended for slaughter may be received into the abattoirs on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday of each week, between the hours of 6.30 a.m. and 8.30 p.m., other than such of the said days as are declared as public holidays.

3. The owner of or the person leaving any animal at the abattoirs for slaughtering shall pay to the Council fees for the accommodation of such animal of One penny for each week or portion of a week for each sheep or lamb, and One shilling for each week or portion of a week for any other animal so left, such charge to commence as from the day next following the day on which such animal is left, and to continue until and including the day on which such animal is slaughtered.

4. No animal shall be removed from the abattoirs after once having been received therein, except as provided in clause 10.

5. Every animal upon being received into the abattoirs shall be raddle marked, the position and colour of such marks to be determined by the Inspector. The owner of such animal, or the person having the custody of, or being in charge of it, shall comply with the instructions and directions of the Inspector.

6. Every animal received into or placed in the abattoirs shall be examined by the Inspector before such animal is permitted to be slaughtered, and no person in charge or having the custody of any animal shall slaughter or permit or allow such animal to be slaughtered before being so examined.

Fees and Dues Payable.

7. The fees, which shall be demanded, paid, received, and taken at the abattoirs by the Inspector or other officer appointed by the Council for that purpose, shall be as follows:—

Times for Slaughtering.

8. The abattoirs shall be open for slaughtering every day not being any Saturday, Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Show Day, Cup Day, and such other public holidays as may be determined by the Committee of Management, from half-past Seven o'clock in the forenoon until half-past Four o'clock in the afternoon, and at no other times except upon special occasions, and then only upon such special conditions as may be prescribed, in writing, under the hand of the Secretary of the Committee of Management.

Feeding, Watering—Prevention of Cruelty.

9. Every person who brings any animal into the abattoirs shall provide such animal with a sufficient quantity of wholesome water, and also with good and sufficient food at least once in every 24 hours.

10. No such person shall permit or allow any animal to remain in the abattoirs after three hours after notice requiring the removal of such animal shall have been given to the owner or other person who shall have brought such animal to the abattoirs. Any such notice may be verbal or in writing.

11. Every person who brings any animal into the abattoirs shall place such animal in such pen, stall, or yard at the abattoirs, as the Inspector may direct.

12. No person shall ill-treat or unnecessarily frighten or irritate any animal, or resort to unnecessary cruelty in slaughtering any animal, and no person shall do any act or observe any forbearance towards any such animal, which act or forbearance involves cruelty.

13. Every person in charge or having the custody of milch animals at the abattoirs shall milk such animals at such time and place as the Inspector, either verbally or in writing, may direct.

Good Order and Decency.

14. No person shall in or upon the abattoirs—

- (a) Carry or convey or cause to be carried or conveyed or consumed any intoxicating liquor.
- (b) While apparently under the influence of intoxicating liquor be or remain therein or thereon.
- (c) Use any profane, indecent, or obscene language, or commit any act of indecency.
- (d) Cause any disturbance or obstruct in the execution of his duty the Inspector, his assistant, or other officer or person appointed to conduct or assist in the management of the abattoirs.
- (e) Neglect or refuse to comply with any lawful request of the Inspector, his assistant, or other officer or person appointed to conduct or assist in the management of the abattoirs; or
- (f) Gamble or play any unlawful game.

15. Every person using the changing or dining rooms shall observe cleanliness therein, and shall not leave therein any clothes of any description between the time the abattoirs are closed on a Friday and the time they are next re-opened for the transaction of business.

16. No person shall hang or dry any sheep or other skins except in the shed provided for such purpose. All necessary roas and sticks for hanging skins must be provided by the owner of such skins.

17. No person shall permit or allow any sheep or other skins to be or remain in the shed mentioned in the last clause, or in any other portion of the abattoirs, between the hour of 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon of any Friday, and 7.30 o'clock in the forenoon of the following Monday. If any skins are found upon the abattoirs in contravention of this clause the Inspector may (without prejudice to any penalty for which the person in default shall be liable), without notice, destroy such skins.

Slaughtermen.

18. No person shall be permitted to commence or continue to work for any other person at the abattoirs as a slaughterman unless his name shall be recorded in the Register of Slaughtermen kept by the Secretary, and he shall have signed an undertaking to observe, comply with, and obey each and every of the by-laws and rules of the abattoirs under pain (apart from any other penalty) of having his name expunged from the Register of Slaughtermen.

19. If the Inspector shall be of the opinion that any person whose name shall be entered in the Register of Slaughtermen shall have been guilty of any breach of any undertaking or writing given by such person, or if the Inspector is of the opinion that the presence of such person in the abattoirs is undesirable or prejudicial to the best interests of the abattoirs, the Inspector shall make a report to such effect to the Secretary, who may expunge the name of such person from the Register of Slaughtermen, and such person, on being required by the Inspector so to do, shall immediately leave the abattoirs and not enter or attempt to enter the abattoirs unless his name shall thereafter be reinstated in the Register of Slaughtermen.

20. Any person who shall feel aggrieved by reason of the expunging of his name from the Register of Slaughtermen may, by notice in writing to the Secretary, appeal to the Committee of Management, who shall hear and determine such appeal, allowing such evidence and statements to be given and made before it as it may think fit, and the decision of the Committee of Management, or of a majority thereof, shall be final and binding on such person and on the Inspector and Secretary.

21. No person shall, without the consent of the Inspector first obtained, remove from the abattoirs any meat or carcass derived from a bull, a cow, or an ox unless such carcass or meat shall have remained in the chilling chamber at the abattoirs for at least 12 hours.
