## NATIONAL SECURITY (EMERGENCY POWERS) ACTS.

At Government House, Melbourne, the sixth day  
of March, 1942.

### REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE CONTROL OF SUPPLIES OF SECOND-HAND FRUIT CASES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the National Security (Emergency Powers) Acts His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Security (Second-hand Fruit Cases) Regulations. Citation.
2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter— Interpretation.

“Second-hand fruit case” means a case of the description and measurements set forth in the Schedule to these Regulations which has been used for the packing of fruit or vegetables.
3. No person shall— Use &c. of second-hand fruit cases.
  - (a) use any second-hand fruit case otherwise than for the purpose of containing fruit or vegetables; or
  - (b) damage or destroy any second-hand fruit case—

except under and in accordance with a permit in writing issued by an officer of the Department of Agriculture authorized in that behalf by the Minister.
4. (1) Any person authorized in that behalf by the Minister (whether generally or in any particular case) may enter and inspect any land or premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether these Regulations are being complied with. Powers of entry on premises &c.

(2) No person shall obstruct or hinder any person so authorized in the execution of his powers under this clause.

Description of Case.	Inside Measurements.
Dump (bushel) case ..	18" long x 14½" deep x 8¾" wide.
Long (bushel) case ..	26" long x 14½" deep x 6" wide.
Canadian (Standard) case ..	18" long x 10½" deep x 11½" wide.
One half bushel (dump) case ..	18" long x 7½" deep x 8¾" wide.
One half bushel (long) case ..	26" long x 7½" deep x 6" wide.
Standard pear case ..	18" long x 8½" deep x 11½" wide.
Citrus export case ..	24" long x 11½" deep x 11½" wide.
Tropical fruit case ..	24½" long x 12" deep x 12" wide.
Banana case (one bushel) ..	18" long x 13" wide x 9¼" deep.
Grape case ..	24" long x 11½" deep x 6" wide.

And the Honorable Albert Arthur Dunstan, His Majesty's Premier of the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SUPPLY OF MATERIALS TO  
THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD.

AT the request of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in pursuance of the powers conferred by the National Security (Emergency Powers) Acts, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Security (Country Roads Board Supplies) Regulations.

Authority to

materials to  
Country Roads  
Board.

2. Notwithstanding anything in any Act the council of every municipality in Victoria is hereby authorized to sell and supply to the Country Roads Board such gravel sand screenings toppings crushed rock road metal and other like materials as the said Board requires to execute any works of national importance which it is constructing for or on behalf of the Commonwealth.

And the Honorable Albert Arthur Dunstan, His Majesty's Premier of the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE EXPENSES OF MEMBERS OF  
THE STATE WAR ADVISORY COUNCIL AND CERTAIN  
COMMITTEES.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the National Security (Emergency Powers) Acts His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby make the following Regulations that is to say:—

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Security (Members' Expenses) Regulations.

certain  
members of  
committees  
acting in  
conjunction  
or  
consultation  
therewith.

2. There shall be payable to each member (not being a Minister of the Crown) of the State War Advisory Council and to each member (not being a Minister of the Crown) of any committee acting in conjunction or consultation with such Council who is a member of the Legislative Council or the Legislative Assembly expenses in connection with the performance of his duties as a member of such Council or any such committee at such rate as is fixed by the Premier of Victoria.

3. Clause 9 of the National Security (State War Advisory Council) Regulations is hereby revoked.
