Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1923, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1923 aforesaid, do hereby increase the area of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1923 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

AMENDMENT OF RECULATION XV. (A).-STUDENT-SHIPS AND COURSES AT THE TEACHERS' COLLEGE.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred under sections 124 and 149 of the Public Service Act 1928, and section 2 of the Student Teachers (War Service) Act 1942, and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby amend Regulation XV. (A)—Studentships and Courses at the Teachers' College, as under:—

In clause 4, for the expression-

"Provided that, in the case of a holder whose student-ship was suspended under the provisions of clause 8A below, the period of training to be actually spent at the Teachers' College may be reduced to such period as may be determined by the Director and approved by the Minister."

there shall be substituted the expression-

"Provided that, in the case of a holder of a studentship referred to in clause SA below, the period of training to be actually spent at the Teachers' College or other approved institution may be reduced to such period as may be determined by the Director and approved by the Minister.'

Amend clause 8A to read as follows:-

Sa. (a) A male person who is awarded a studentship and is prevented by reason of his service with the Naval, Military. or Air Forces of the King or the Commonwealth in connexion with the present war from attending the Teachers' College for the prescribed period of training shall for the purposes of clauses 4 and 8 above and 27 below be regarded as being in attendance at the Teachers' College for the whole of the period in respect of which his studentship was awarded, and at the expiration of such period he shall be placed in the subdivision in which under the provisions of clause 27 below he would be entitled to be placed if he had successfully completed the course appropriate to his studentship, but nothing in this sub-clause contained shall be deemed to entitle any such person who does not comply with the provisions of sub-clause (b) of this clause to the salary appropriate to the subdivision in which he is so placed.

(b) Every such person upon his discharge from the SA. (a) A male person who is awarded a studentship

A By-law for the Regulation and Management of the Abattoirs of the City of Bendigo.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1928 and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, be it enacted by the Council of the City of Bendigo, hereinafter called the Council, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens thereof, as follows, that is to say:—

1. That clause 14 of By-law 46 of the City of Bendigo be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following clause substituted in lieu thereof:—

As to Dues and Fees.
