WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of
Victoria passed in the seventh year of the reign of His
present Majesty King George VI. intitled the *Coal Mine
Workers Pensions Act 1942* (No. 4932), it is amongst other
things enacted that Parts II, III, and IV. of this Act shall
come into operation on such day or such respective days as
is or are fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council
published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the
Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the
advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my
Proclamation fix the thirteenth day of January, One thousand
nine hundred and forty-three, as the date upon which the
said Part III. of the said *Coal Mine Workers Pensions Act

Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

AWARD No. 74 OF 31ST DECEMBER, 1942, RELATING TO RATES OF SALARIES AND WAGES FOR THE YEAR 1942.

THE Railways Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the Railways Act 1928 (No. 3750), hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

1. The rates of salaries and wages to be paid to officers and employees during the year One thousand nine hundred and forty-two shall be as set forth hereunder:—

- (a) Adult male employees (except Gatekeepers) shall be paid a needs basic wage of 13s. 6d. per day subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in the Orders of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration dated 17th April, 1934, and 23rd June, 1937 (Railway Award) respectively, and in addition the margins prescribed therefor in the Schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1920, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the Schedule to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, 40, 44, 45, 46, 49, 51, 56, 60, 61, 62, 65, 67, and 68, and in the Schedule to this Award.
- (b) Adult male officers shall be paid a needs basic salary of £211 per annum, subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in the Orders of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration dated 17th April, 1934, and 23rd June, 1937 (Railway Award) respectively, and in addition the margins prescribed therefor in the Schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1920, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, 40, 44, 45, 46, 49, 56, 60, 61, 62, 65, and 67, and in the Schedule to this Award.
- (c) Adult male Gatekeepers with free quarters shall be paid a rate of 1s. per day less than the basic wage.
- (d) Casual employees shall be paid the hourly rates prescribed therefor in the Schedule to this Award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.
- (e) Female employees and junior officers and junior employees shall be paid the rates prescribed therefor in the Schedule to this Award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

2. The rates prescribed for casual employees, junior employees, and female employees are based on an adult male needs basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day, and those prescribed for junior officers are based on an adult male needs basic salary of £226 per annum, and the said rates shall, on the same dates, be increased or decreased in the following manner:—

- (i) The hourly rates for casual employees shall be increased or decreased by one-eighth of the amount by which the adult male needs basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day is increased or decreased.
- (ii) The rates of pay of junior employees, female employees, and of junior officers shall be increased or decreased in proportion to the increase or decrease in the adult male needs basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day and/or the adult male needs basic salary of £226 per annum, such sum to be calculated to the nearest penny or the nearest pound (as the case may be).

Provided that the increase or decrease in any junior or female rate of pay shall not exceed the increase or decrease in the adult male needs basic wage.

3. (a) In addition to the rates prescribed in clause 1, sub-clauses (a) and (c), the wage rates of all adult male employees shall be increased by a constant amount at the rate of 10d. per day.

(b) In addition to the rates prescribed in clause 1, sub-clause (b), the salaried rates of all adult male officers shall be increased by a constant amount at the rate of £13 per annum.

(c) The hourly rates prescribed in clauses 1 (d) and 2 (i) for Casual Employees shall be increased by the constant amount of 1½d.

(d) Where the rate prescribed for female employees is at least an amount being 54 per cent. of the adult male basic wage payable from time to time as provided in clause 1 (a) of this Award, such rate shall be increased by an amount equal to the difference between 54 per cent. of the needs male basic wage and 54 per cent. of the sum of the needs male basic wage and the constant amount prescribed in sub-clause (a) of this clause, both calculations to be made to the nearest 1d. per day.

(e) Junior male employees or officers and female employees in the grades set out in the following table shall, in addition

PROHIBITION OF THE KEEPING, GRAZING, OR MILKING
OF COWS WITHIN CERTAIN SPECIFIED AREAS OF
THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF THE SHIRE OF
BRAYBROOK.

WHEREAS by section 67 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act* 1928 (No. 3736), the Governor in Council is empowered on the application of the Council of any municipal district whether wholly or partly within a Milk Area or not, if approved by the Minister, to prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows on any part or parts or in any part of such area or district: And whereas the Council of the Municipal District of the Shire of Braybrook has applied to the Governor in Council to prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows in the following specified areas of such municipality:—

- (a) Commencing at a point where the Sunshine-Newport Railway Line crosses Wright-street; thence westerly by Wright-street to Graham-street south; thence northerly by Graham-street south and Graham-street to Derby-road; thence westerly by Derby-road to Kororoit Creek; thence north-westerly upstream by Kororoit Creek to a point opposite the west building line of Kororoit-street; thence by a line bearing northerly to the Sunshine-Ballarat Railway Line; thence westerly by the Railway Line to Kororoit Creek; continuing thence upstream by Kororoit Creek to Andrew-parade; thence northerly by Andrew-parade to the boundary fence of Selwyn Park, and continuing around Selwyn Park westerly, northerly, and north-easterly to Perth-avenue; thence northerly by Perth-avenue to Ballarat-road; thence easterly by Ballarat-road to Duke-street; thence southerly by Duke-street to Lilly-street; thence easterly by Lilly-street to Darnley-street; thence southerly by Darnley-street to Myalla-street; thence westerly by Myalla-street to Duke-street; thence southerly by Duke-street and continuing under the Sunshine-Tottenham Railway Line through the Black Arch to Sunshine-road; thence westerly by Sunshine-road to the commencing point, but excluding a triangular area of approximately twenty acres bounded by Talmage-street, King Edward-avenue, and Sydney-street.

BY-LAW No. 110.

A By-law of the City of Brighton, made under the Health Acts, and numbered 110, for the purpose of amending By-law No. 94 (a By-law prescribing fees to be paid for registration and renewal and transfer of registration of certain premises) of the said city.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brighton order as follows:—

1. That on and after the coming into force of this By-law, it shall form part of and be read as one with By-law No. 94 of the City of Brighton, and shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Brighton.

2. That clause 1 of the said By-law No. 94 be amended as follows, by deleting therefrom the words:—

"Offensive trade premises—Two pounds,"

and substituting therefor the words:—

"Offensive trade premises (other than those referred to below)—Two pounds.

Offensive trade premises (being fat-extracting or melting or rendering works which are conducted at premises occupied principally as a butcher's shop, and at which fat is extracted, melted or rendered only from materials derived from such shop)—One pound."

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the City of Brighton on the second day of November, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, and confirmed the thirtieth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two.

SHIRE OF FERN TREE GULLY.

SHOPPING AREAS.

TAKE notice that on the 14th day of December, 1942, the Council of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully passed an order specifying the roads or sections of roads set out in the Schedule hereunder to be shopping areas under the above Act, which provides, *inter alia*—
