WITHIN WHICH SECTION 22 OF THE DOG ACT 1928
SHALL APPLY.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 22 of the *Dog Act 1928* it is provided
that such section shall apply to cities, towns and
boroughs or to such shires or parts of shires as are specified
for the purposes of this section on the recommendation of the
council of the shire by Proclamation of the Governor in
Council published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas
the Council of the Shire of Morwell has recommended that the
said shire be specified for the purposes of the above-mentioned
section: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of
Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council
thereof, do by this my Proclamation hereby specify the Shire
of Morwell as a shire within which section 22 of the *Dog Act*
1928 shall apply.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

BY-LAW No. 35.

A By-law of the Shire of Winchelsea made under section 198 of the Local Government Act 1928, and numbered 35, for regulating the erection of hoardings and exhibition of advertisements or signs at Lorne.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1928, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Winchelsea order as follows:—

1. No hoarding shall be erected except for the purpose of being used for advertisements or signs authorized to be placed thereon under clause 5 (b) of this By-law, and then only with the consent of the Council.

2. Every hoarding shall comply with the following conditions:—

(a) Such hoarding shall not be erected nearer to the building line of any street or road than 15 feet measured at right angles to such street or road.

(b) Between the bottom of the closed-in portion of such hoarding and the surface of the ground there shall be left an open space, 2 feet in height, free from all obstruction other than the main supports of such hoarding.

(c) No such hoarding shall be built over or in the front of any building used as a dwelling-house.

(d) No hoarding shall be more than 12 feet in height measured from the ground.

(e) Sign posts or direction posts shall only be erected on private property and not less than 15 feet measured at right angles from any street, and then only with the written consent of the Council.

3. Every person who shall own, control, or be responsible for, the erection or maintenance of any hoarding or part thereof erected or maintained or situated contrary to this By-law shall forthwith pull down, remove, or demolish the same if required so to do by the Council, and in default of

compliance with any such requisition the Council may pull down, demolish, and remove the same, and sell the materials thereof and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down, demolishing, and removing the same and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

4. No person shall exhibit any advertisement or sign in any place in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of any public park or pleasure promenade or to disfigure the natural beauty of any landscape.

5. No person shall attach, fix to, or paint any advertisement or sign on any hoarding or building or on any fence, rock, cliff, or tree unless under and subject to the following conditions:—

(a) No letter in any advertisement or sign shall occupy in an enclosing rectangle an area exceeding 12 square inches, except in the case of the business or trade sign on a business or trade building and which sign shall have been first approved by the Council.

(b) No such advertisement or sign shall be placed on the roof or side walls of any building or shall occupy in an enclosing rectangle more than one-sixth (1-6th) of the exposed area of any wall on which it is placed, and no such advertisement or sign shall be placed upon any hoarding except in relation to and for the purposes of a boarding house, business house, or trade premises standing well back from the street, and then only with the previous written consent of the Council.

(c) A precise statement of particulars showing the contents, set up, colour of, and rectangular area occupied by such advertisement or sign and a specification of the type and measurements of the maximum size, letters therein, and the place where and manner in which the same is intended to be affixed or exhibited shall first be submitted to the Council with any further particulars the Council may thereupon require.

(d) The Council shall on such submission as aforesaid examine the specification, particulars, and site of such advertisement or sign, and if the same complies in all respects with this By-law and all other Acts, Regulations, or By-laws applicable thereto, shall grant its written approval thereto and permit for the exhibition thereof.

6. The Council may obliterate, abolish, or remove any advertisement or sign upon any hoarding, building, fence, rock, cliff, or tree, if in the opinion of the Council it is unsightly or objectionable.

7. Any matter or thing arising under or in relation to this By-law or the subject-matter thereof may be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case.

8. The Council's Surveyor for the time being may, unless in any particular case otherwise ordered by the Council, issue and give on its behalf all such directions, orders, requisitions, dispensations, or consents, and do all such acts, matters, and things as the Council is authorized to issue or give or do under this By-law.

9. This By-law shall apply and have the force of law within the limits for the time being of the Township of Lorne in the said Shire.

10. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall, for every such act or default, be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound or more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after written notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after a conviction or order of any Court (as the case may be), and in addition to such penalty any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of this By-law or in the execution of work directed thereby to be executed by any person and not executed by him shall be paid by the person committing such breach or failing to execute such work.
