Dairy Products Acts. QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, E. J. HOGAN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be 86½ per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of July, 1943.

CHEESE QUOTA.

I, E. J. HOGAN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of cheese at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for cheese as follows:—

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of July, 1943.

Petrol Pump Licence Fees.

A By-law of the Borough of Colac made under the Local Government Acts and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered 5, for the purpose of amending By-laws Nos. 102 and 105 of the Shire of Colac, in so far as the same apply to the Borough of Colac.

3. That By-law No. 102 of the Shire of Colac, in so far as the same applies to the Borough of Colac, be amended by striking out clause 5 of the said By-law, as re-enacted by clause 2 of By-law No. 105 of the Shire of Colac, and inserting the following clause in lieu thereof, viz.:—

"5. (1) There shall be paid to the Council—

(a) For the granting or renewal of every licence for an approved type of petrol pump with a single device (other than a portable petrol pump) in or on any footway a licence fee of One pound one shilling per annum.

(b) For the granting or renewal of every licence for an approved type or class of petrol pump with dual devices (other than a portable petrol pump) in or on any footway a licence fee of One pound one shilling per annum.

(c) For the granting or renewal of every licence for a portable petrol pump in or on any footway for the purpose of selling or supplying motor spirit a licence fee of One pound one shilling per annum.

(d) For every transfer of a licence a fee of Ten shillings.

(2) Where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate fee, based on the number of months unexpired, shall be paid to the Council."

4. Payments made in respect of licence fees for any period after 1st October, 1941, which have been made on the basis as set out in the preceding clause of this By-law, shall be valid. Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council on the 24th day of March, 1943, and confirmed on the 28th day of April, 1943.

DIRECTIONS UNDER STATE EMERGENCY SERVICES ORDER (VICTORIA).

METHODS OF IDENTIFICATION OF CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE PERSONNEL AND OF CERTAIN VEHICLES OF STATE EMERGENCY AND OTHER SERVICES.

I, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by clauses 106a and 106c of the State Emergency Services Order (Victoria) 1, Alexander Mitchell Duncan, Chief Warden for Victoria, do hereby make the following directions:—

1. The directions made on the 24th day of March, 1943, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 30th day of March, 1943, are hereby revoked.

2. The method of identification of members of the personnel of the State Emergency Services and other services specified in the first column of Parts I. and II. of the First Schedule to this direction shall be as specified respectively in the second and third columns of those Parts of the said Schedule.

3. The identification labels to be used as methods of identification of vehicles of the classes mentioned in the first column of paragraph 2 of the Second Schedule to this direction shall be as specified in the said Schedule.

1. Identification labels shall be printed in red ink on white paper and shall bear the following words and lettering:—

- (a) On the first line the words "State Emergency Services";
- (b) On the second line the lettering applicable—
 - (i) to the service for which the vehicle has been appropriated; or
 - (ii) to the authority by which the vehicle is being used;
- (c) On the third line the registered number (if any) of the vehicle and the expression "Alex. M. Duncan";
- (d) On the fourth line and immediately under the expression "Alex. M. Duncan" the expression "Chief Warden."

2. The letters applicable to the various classes of vehicles shall be as follows:—
