NATIONAL SECURITY (CIVIL DEFENCE WORKERS'
COMPENSATION) REGULATIONS.

ORDER.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the National Security (Civil Defence Workers' Compensation) Regulations and by virtue of an instrument of delegation made by the Minister of State for Home Security, and dated the 27th day of August, 1942, I, Albert Arthur Dunstan, the Premier of the State of Victoria, hereby make the following Order:—

I hereby determine that it is, during the continuance of the war in which His Majesty is at present engaged, necessary for the maintenance of essential services that every person included in a class of persons specified in the Schedule to this Order should continue to perform the duties of his employment or occupation, or perform duties of a similar nature, or remain in readiness to perform any such duties, during a period of enemy action.

THE SCHEDULE.

Such of the employees as are indicated hereunder of the following bodies corporate who are duly required by or under the authority of the responsible executive officers or officer thereof to continue to perform the duties of their employment or occupation, or perform duties of a similar nature, or remain in readiness to perform any such duties, during a period of enemy action or during a period immediately following a period of enemy action.

Country Roads Board of Victoria.	All permanent and temporary employees.
The Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick.	All permanent and temporary employees who are engaged in the distribution of electricity.
The Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Footscray.	All permanent and temporary employees who are engaged in the distribution of electricity.
The Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Port Melbourne.	All permanent and temporary employees who are engaged in the distribution of electricity.
