### Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WOODEND PUBLIC CEMETERY.

TN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1928, the trustees of the Woodend Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):

- 1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- 2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- 3. Any person desiring ground, for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any property servers. any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein
- 4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
- 5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has 5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

  6. Application for an order for interment shall be made hefore noon on the day previous to the interment, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.
- 7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary 1. No comm shall be buried within 4 leet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- 8. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.; on Sundays, only by permission of the Trustees, and on payment of the special fee as provided.
- 9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that babels behalf.
- 10. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every cofin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.
- 11. No private grave shall be reopened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.
- 12. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.
- 13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.
- 14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.
- 15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.
- 16. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

REGULATIONS REGARDING THE TESTING BY AIR OR GAS PRESSURE, IN FACTORIES OF ENCLOSED METAL VESSELS.

WHEREAS by section 64 of the Factories and Shops Act 1928, it is enacted that, if the Minister has certified 1928, it is enacted that, if the Almster has certified that any, manufacture, plant, process, or labour used in factories is dangerous to life or limb generally, the Governor in Council may make such Regulations as may be deemed necessary and reasonably practicable to decrease or prevent danger from such manufacture, plant, process or labour: And whereas the Honorable Edwin Joseph Mackrell, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, has prevised that the process of testing in factories closed metal. vessels by means of air or gas compressed above atmospheric pressure, other than the process of testing closed metal vessels

- (1) vessels constructed primarily for the purpose of holding or storing air or gas under pressure greater than 30 lb. to the square inch above atmospheric
- pressure, or

  (2) boilers within the meaning of the Boilers Inspection

  Act 1928,
  is dangerous to life or limb generally:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers hereinbefore recited doth make the following Regulations relating to such dangerous process, that is to say:—

- 1. These Regulations shall come into force and be operative on and after the first day of November, 1943.
- 2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the

context or subject matter—
"air pressure" means the pressure exerted by air when

- "air pressure" means the pressure exerted by air when compressed above atmospheric pressure; "air" includes gas of any description whatsoever; "closed vessel" means any closed vessel constructed wholly or partly of metal other than—

  (i) a closed metal vessel constructed primarily for the purpose of holding or storing air or gas under pressure greater than 30 lb.

  to the square inch above atmospheric
- ressure, or

  (ii) a boiler within the meaning of the Boilers Inspection Act 1928;
  "receiver" means any closed vessel constructed primarily for the purpose of holding air under pressure greater than 30 lb. to the square inch above atmospheric pressure.
- 3. Except for the purpose of discovering porosity in a closed vessel or leaks in the seams thereof, and then only in the manner and subject to the conditions hereinafter stated, no person shall in any factory use air pressure for the purpose of testing any closed vessel.
- 4. The manner in which and the conditions subject to which air pressure may be used for the purpose of testing any closed vessel are as follows:—
  - (1) The compressed air shall be delivered to the closed vessel from a receiver (hereinafter in these Regulations called the "auxiliary receiver"), which shall receive its air pressure from a receiver (hereinafter in these Regulations called the "main receiver") only by means of piping and a reducing valve so adjusted that the air pressure in the auxiliary receiver shall not at any time exceed 30 lb. to the square inch above atmospheric pressure.
  - (2) The main receiver and the auxiliary receiver shall each be constructed to withstand the same pressure and shall each be provided with—
  - (i) a proper safety valve; (ii) a drain cock; (iii) a stop valve; and

- (iii) a proper pressure gauge which, in the case of that fitted to the auxiliary receiver, shall be graduated to show the pressure in pounds per square inch.
  (3) The safety valve on the auxiliary receiver shall at all times be set to carry a pressure not exceeding 30 lb. to the square inch above atmospheric pressure.
- 5. If any person uses in any factory air pressure for the purpose of testing any closed vessel in contravention of these Regulations, such person and the occupier of the factory shall be severally guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

- $\,\,^{\circ}$  6. Nothing in these Regulations shall apply to the testing by means of air pressure of—

(a) refrigerating machinery;
(b) coal gas meters and coal gas pipes;
(c) any closed vessel or class of closed vessel exempted in writing by the Chief Inspector of Factories.

- 4. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.
