"PROCLAIMED PERIOD" AND "PROCLAIMED AREAS"
WHERE SERIOUS DANGER FROM FIRES EXISTS.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Forests Commission with respect to the period of twelve months commencing on the twentieth day of January, 1943, has reported to the Minister of Forests that, owing to climatic conditions, serious danger of fire exists in the parts of Victoria specified in the Schedule hereunder: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare—

- (a) the period from the twenty-seventh day of January, 1943, to the fifteenth day of March, 1943, both days inclusive, to be a "proclaimed period", and
- (b) the areas of Victoria specified in the Schedule hereunder to be "proclaimed areas".

SCHEDULE.

Such parts of the counties enumerated hereunder as—

- (1) are not situate in a city or in a town or in a township of more than one thousand inhabitants; and
- (2) are not Mallee country within the meaning of the *Land Act 1928*.

Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I. E. J. REGULATION XV. (A).—STUDENTSHIPS AND COURSES AT THE TEACHERS' COLLEGE—AMENDED.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 124 and 149 of the *Public Service Act 1928* and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby amend Regulation XV. (A)—Studentships and Courses at the Teachers' College, as follows:—

In clause 2, for the expression "and (f) below" there shall be substituted the expression "(f) and (g) below".

In clause 4, for the expression—

- "(d) Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate—three years;
- (e) Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate—three years;
- and
- (f) Such other courses as may from time to time be recommended by the Director and approved by the Minister."

there shall be substituted the expression—

- "(d) Trained Special Teacher's Certificate—two years;
- (e) Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate—three years;
- (f) Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate—three years;
- and
- (g) Such other courses as may from time to time be recommended by the Director and approved by the Minister."

To clause 4 add the expression—

"Provided that, in the case of a holder whose studentship was suspended under the provisions of clause 8A below, the period of training to be actually spent at the Teachers' College may be reduced to such period as may be determined by the Director and approved by the Minister."

In sub-clause (c) of clause 7 after the words "Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate" there shall be inserted the words "or for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate".

In clause 8, for the words "and the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate" there shall be substituted the words "the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate and the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate".

After clause 8 there shall be inserted the following clause:—

"8A. A male person who is awarded a studentship and is prevented by reason of his service with the Naval or Military or Air Forces of the King or the Commonwealth in connexion with the present war from attending the Teachers' College for the prescribed period of training shall be granted by the Minister a suspension of his studentship during the period he was so prevented from attending the college and shall for the purposes of clauses 8 above and 27 below be regarded as being in attendance at the Teacher's College during the whole of the period in respect of which his studentship is so suspended, but he shall not be entitled to any of the benefits specified in clause 27 aforesaid until he has completed a course of training at the Teachers' College for such period as may be determined by the Director and approved by the Minister in accordance with the provisions of clause 4 above."

After clause 15 there shall be inserted the following clauses:—

"15A. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 15 of this regulation, a person who has served as a temporary head teacher in a rural school and who will be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of January in the year in which the studentships are awarded shall be eligible for a studentship in the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate."

"15B. Notwithstanding anything contained in clauses 10, 15, and 15A above, a male student teacher who is serving with the Naval or Military or Air Forces of the King or the Commonwealth in connexion with the present war shall be awarded a studentship in the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate at the Teachers'

College from and inclusive of the first day of January immediately following the date of his enlisting or being called up for such service provided that, in the case of a male student teacher who was appointed after the first day of March in the year in which he enlisted or was called up for such service, the date of the award of such studentship shall be from and inclusive of the first day of January in the year next after the year immediately following that during which he so enlisted or was called up."

After clause 18 there shall be inserted the following heading and clause:—

"TRAINED SPECIAL TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.

18A. The qualifications for studentships in the course for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate shall be as follows:—

- (a) Applicants shall have successfully completed the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate and shall have been specially recommended by the Principal, who shall take into consideration the temperament and personality of the applicants and their experience and ability in teaching normal children.
- (b) The course shall include—
 - (i) Psychology of mentally handicapped children;
 - (ii) Education of mentally handicapped children;
 - (iii) Manual, Industrial, and Household Arts and Crafts;
 - (iv) Health and Physical Defects;
 - (v) Speech Defects and remedial measures;
 - (vi) Physical Training with special reference to mentally handicapped children;
 - (vii) Music and Rhythmic Expression;
 - (viii) Horticulture;
 - (ix) Practice of Teaching and Observation in a class or school for mentally handicapped children."

Amend clause 27 (a) (i) as under:—

"27. (a) (i) Upon successfully completing a course of training at the Teachers' College, the holder of a studentship shall, except in the cases mentioned in sub-clauses (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f) of this clause, be placed in a subdivision and paid an initial salary in accordance with the rates prescribed for teachers in the under-mentioned subdivisions of the Fifth Class in the Primary Schools Division or the Secondary Schools Division as the case requires—

In clause 30 after the words "Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate" there shall be inserted the words "the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate".

In sub-clause (a) of clause 32 for the expression "or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate (in either of which cases he shall be transferred to the Classified Roll for the Primary Schools Division)" there shall be substituted the expression "or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate or for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate (in any one of which cases he shall be transferred to the Classified Roll for the Primary Schools Division)".

To clause 32 add sub-clause (c) as follows:—

"(c) Special consideration shall be given by the Director in the case of a male student whose failure to pass the prescribed examinations was in the opinion of the Director due to his having been on service with the Naval or Military or Air Forces of the King or the Commonwealth in connexion with the present war."

In the table in sub-clause (c) of clause 33 there shall be inserted after the fourth item the following item:—

"20 for a first year's extension . . . Trained Special Teacher's Certificate".

In sub-clause (b) of clause 37, in clause 38 and in sub-clause (a) of clause 40 after the words "Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate" there shall be inserted the words "or for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate".

In clause 39 after the words "Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate" there shall be inserted the words "or Trained Special Teacher's Certificate".

REGULATION XLV.(A).—RELATIVE POSITION IN ORDER OF PREFERENCE OF TEACHERS IN THE PRIMARY SCHOOLS DIVISION.—AMENDED.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 149 of the *Public Service Act 1928*, and section 2 of the *Student Teachers (War Service) Act 1942*, and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby amend Regulation XLV.(A).—Relative position in order of preference of Teachers in the Primary Schools Division, as follows:—

Amend clause 2 to read as follows:—

"2. (a) Except as otherwise provided in sub-clauses (b) and (c) of this clause, persons who have been awarded studentships in a course of training at the Teachers' College or at any prescribed institution for training of teachers and who are deemed and taken to be provisionally classified in the Fifth Class in the Primary Schools Division during the currency of their studentships shall, at the end of the period of such course of training, be placed in such sub-class of the Fifth Class and in such relative position in order of precedence in the several sub-classes of the Fifth Class as the Classifiers may determine, having regard to—

(i) the period of the course of training taken at the Teachers' College or prescribed institution for the training of teachers;

(ii) the order of merit, as determined by a system of grouped percentile ranking on the basis of examination results, conduct, diligence, efficiency, and interest in work during the aforesaid course of training, such system to be prescribed by the Director; and

(iii) length of service.

(b) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clause (a) of this clause those persons who successfully completed their course of training shall, except as otherwise provided in sub-clause (c) next below, be placed in a higher position than those who did not successfully complete the course.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clauses (a) and (b) of this clause no male person who was on service with the naval or Military or Air Forces of the King or the Commonwealth in the present war and whose studentship was suspended during the period of such service shall be placed in a lower position than a male person who was awarded a studentship from the same date and who was not on such service.

(d) For the purpose of sub-clause (a) of this clause the period of the course of training at the Teachers' College or at any prescribed institution for the training of teachers shall, in the case of a male student in training who was on service with the Naval or Military or Air Forces of the King or the Commonwealth in the present war and whose studentship was suspended during the period of such service, include the whole of the period during which his studentship was so suspended.

CITY OF KEW.

BY-LAW No. 72.

A By-law of the City of Kew, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1928 and section 80 of the *Health Act* 1928, and numbered 72, for suppressing nuisances; for prohibiting or minimizing noises in public highways; for the regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of animals (including birds), in the opinion of the Council, offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous; and generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1928 and the *Health Act* 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Kew order as follows:—

Definitions.

1. In this By-law—

“animal” includes bird;

“apparatus” includes radio apparatus, amplifier, loud speaker, and any similar appliance or device by which sound is produced or amplified;

“premises” includes any building and any land;

“public place” includes any public highway, park, garden, reserve, and other place of public resort;

“sound” includes voice and music, and also any sound that is produced from any appliance or device by mechanical or electrical or other means.

Prohibition of noisy animals.

2. (1) This clause shall apply in respect of any premises whenever—

(a) at least two persons lodge with the Town Clerk a complaint, in writing, signed by them, in which they state that they are householders residing within hearing of the sound of animals on the premises, and that the noise made by an animal or animals on the premises is a nuisance to persons who reside in the neighbourhood, and

(b) the Town Clerk gives to the occupier or one of the occupiers of the premises a notice stating that under this By-law there has been made a complaint that the noise made by an animal or animals on the premises is a nuisance to persons who reside in the neighbourhood, and calling on the occupier or occupiers of the premises to cause the nuisance to be abated within seven days after the service of the notice.

(2) After the expiration of seven days from the service of a notice given pursuant to this clause, no person shall have on the premises, or keep on the premises, or allow to remain on the premises, any animal or animals that make noises so as to be a nuisance to any person residing in the neighbourhood of the premises.

Prohibition of dogs that are offensive, dangerous, &c.

3. (1) This clause shall apply in respect of any premises whenever—

(a) the Council resolves that, in its opinion, any dog or dogs that are on the premises, or are kept on the premises, or are allowed to remain on the premises, are, or are so kept as to be, offensive or injurious to health or dangerous, and

(b) the Town Clerk gives to the occupier or one of the occupiers of the premises a notice setting out the resolution of the Council, and calling on the occupier or occupiers of the premises, within seven days after service of the notice, to remove all dogs on the premises that are offensive or injurious to health, or dangerous.

(2) After the expiration of seven days from the service of a notice given pursuant to this clause, no person shall have on the premises, or keep on the premises, or allow to remain on the premises, any dog to which the resolution of the Council refers.

Prohibition of greyhounds.

4. (1) No person, without the consent in writing of the Council, shall have on any premises, or keep on any premises, or allow to remain on any premises, any greyhound dog, whether male or female.

(2) The occupier of any premises, if he permits or suffers any other person to have on the premises, or to keep on the premises, or to allow to remain on the premises, any greyhound dog, whether male or female, shall be deemed to have allowed that dog to remain on the premises.

5. (1) No person shall, in any public highway, without the consent in writing of the Council, use or allow to be operated any apparatus by which any sound is produced or amplified. Prohibition of amplifiers, &c., in public highways.

(2) For purposes of this clause, an apparatus shall be deemed to be in a public highway if it is in or over the public highway, or is in or upon any vehicle in the public highway.

(3) The Council, in its absolute discretion—

(a) may give its consent, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit, with respect to all or any of the following matters, that is to say—

the quality or degree of amplification or loudness of the sounds produced or amplified by the apparatus, information to be given by the sounds if they are in words,

the nature of any music or other sound to be produced or amplified,

the times of use or operation of the apparatus, or

(b) may refuse its consent,

to the use or operation, in specified places in public highways, or in specified public highways, or in all public highways in the municipality, of any apparatus for producing or amplifying any sounds, or any sounds which the Council specifies, or sounds of any description which it specifies.

(4) After the Council has given consent, subject to conditions specified by it, to the use or operation of any apparatus, if any person in any public highway uses or allows to be operated that apparatus or any other apparatus without observing all the conditions specified by the Council, he shall be deemed to have used or operated the apparatus without the consent in writing of the Council.

6. No person shall in any premises abutting on or adjacent to any public highway, use or allow to be operated any apparatus by which any sound is produced or amplified that is an annoyance, or causes an annoyance, to persons in the public highway. Prohibition of use of amplifiers, &c., causing annoyance in public highways.

7. (1) This clause shall not apply to the use or operation of apparatus in connexion with any public or patriotic purpose in any park or reserve under the control of the Council during any period of time for which the Council has authorized the use of the park or reserve for that purpose. Prohibition of nuisance by noise in public places.

(2) Subject to sub-clause (1) of this clause, no person shall in any public place, or in any premises abutting on or adjacent to any public place, use or allow to be operated any apparatus in such a way that any sound is produced or amplified by it so as to be a nuisance to members of the public in the public place.

(3) For the purposes of this clause, an apparatus shall be deemed to be in a public place if it is in or over the public place, or is in or upon any vehicle in the public place.

8. Any consent given by the Council for the purposes of any clause of this By-law may be expressed to be limited so as to remain in effect only for a specified time, or only until a notice that it has been withdrawn is served on the person to whom it was given; and any consent, whether expressed to be so limited or not, may be withdrawn by notice served on the person to whom it was given, and after the service of such a notice any person who wilfully does or wilfully allows anything that is prohibited by the clause under which the consent was given shall be deemed to have been guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to that clause as if no consent under that clause had ever been given. Consents.

9. (1) Any notice to an occupier of any premises for the purposes of this By-law shall be deemed to be properly given and served if the notice— Notices.

(a) is signed by the Town Clerk or by any person acting as Town Clerk, and

(b) is addressed either to the occupier by name or to the occupier described as such without his name, and

(c) is left at any dwelling house on the premises, or at the place of residence of the person who is the occupier, or is sent by registered letter directed to the occupier at the premises or at his place of residence,

and any notice so given and served shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which it is so left, or, if posted, on the day following the day of posting.

(2) Any notice to any person for the purposes of this By-law shall be deemed to be properly given and served if the notice—

(a) is signed by the Town Clerk or by any person acting as Town Clerk, and

(b) is addressed to the person to whom the notice is to be given, and

(c) is left at the place of residence of that person, or is sent by registered letter directed to him at his place of residence, and any notice so given and served shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which it is so left, or if posted, on the day following the day of posting.

Penalty. 10. (1) Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than £5.

(2) Any person who wilfully continues an offence in respect of a breach of any provision of this By-law, after a conviction or order of the Court in respect of a breach of the same provisions, shall be liable, on conviction, to a further penalty of not more than £1 for each day on which the offence is so continued.

Application. 11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Kew.

Marginal notes. 12. The marginal notes shall not be deemed to affect the meaning of any provision of this By-law.
