THE CONSTITUTION ACT AMENDMENT ACTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Constitution Act Amendment Acts it is provided that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* divide any Electoral Province into Divisions, specify the names and boundaries of Divisions, and alter the name and boundaries of any Division:

And whereas by Proclamation dated the third day of April, 1939, published in the *Government Gazette*, Electoral Provinces were divided into Divisions with the names and boundaries specified:

And whereas it is necessary again to divide the Melbourne West Province into Divisions:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation again divide the Melbourne West Province into Divisions with the names and boundaries specified in the Schedule hereto.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, and in the seventh year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

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SCHEDULE.

NAMES AND BOUNDARIES OF DIVISIONS OF THE MELBOURNE WEST PROVINCE.

In the following descriptions, where the boundaries indicated are those of a municipal district or a portion of a municipal district, they shall be taken to be the boundaries in force on the first day of August, 1943.

Footscray North Division. ✓

The North and North-west Wards of the City of Footscray, and that part of the River Riding of the Shire of Braybrook, east of Ashley-street.

Footscray South Division. ✓

The Middle and South Wards of the City of Footscray, and that part of the Kingsville Ward of the said City within the Province.

Port Melbourne Division. ✓

That part of the City of Port Melbourne south of the Coode Canal.

St. Kilda West Division. ✓

The West Ward of the City of St. Kilda.

South Melbourne Division. ✓

The City of South Melbourne.

Sunshine Division. ✓

Commencing at a point on the Maribyrnong River in line with Lyons-street; thence southerly by a line, Lyons-street, Ashley-street, and the western boundary of the City of Footscray to Francis-street, west by that street to the Geelong-road, south-westerly by that road to the Kororoit Creek, northerly by that creek to Anderson-road at the west boundary of section 18, Parish of Cut-Paw-Paw, north by Anderson-road, northerly by McIntyre-road, and further north by the west boundary of section 22 to the Maribyrnong River; and thence south-easterly by that river to the point of commencement.

Williamstown Division. ✓

That part of the City of Williamstown within the Province.

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, NORMAN A. MARTIN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be Sixty-six per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of September, 1943.

CHEESE QUOTA.

I, NORMAN A. MARTIN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of cheese at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for cheese as follows:—

The proportion shall be Fifty-nine per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of September, 1943.

DETERMINATION OF FEES AND TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES FOR MEMBERS OF THE GRAIN ELEVATORS BOARD.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Grain Elevator Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Orders in Council made on the 15th January, 1935, 24th May, 1938, and 17th February, 1942, fixing fees and travelling expenses of members of the Grain Elevators Board, and doth by this Order hereby fix the following fees and travelling expenses which members of the Grain Elevators Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") are entitled to receive, from and inclusive of the 26th August, 1943.

FEES.

Each member of the Board, other than the chairman thereof, shall be entitled to receive a fee of £4 4s. for each sitting of the Board attended by him, and the member of the Board representing the wheat growers of Victoria shall be entitled to receive a fee of £4 4s. per day whilst engaged in carrying out duties assigned to him by the chairman of the Board in connexion with the operation of the Board.

Provided that the total amount of fees so receivable in respect of any one year shall not exceed—

- (i) £275 by the member appointed in accordance with sub-section 2 (b) of section 5 of the *Grain Elevators Act 1934* (No. 4270), as amended by the *Grain Elevators Act 1943* (No. 4946).
(ii) £400 by the member representing the wheat growers of Victoria.

TRAVELLING EXPENSES.

(1) During absence from Melbourne on duty outside the metropolitan area, each member of the Board shall be entitled to an allowance of Sixteen shillings per day, and to the reimbursement of any amount reasonably expended on travelling by railway or, subject to the approval of the Minister, by other means of transport.

(2) A member of the Board resident outside the metropolitan area shall be entitled to an allowance of Sixteen shillings (16s.) per day during his absence from his place of residence for the purpose of attending any meeting of the Board or whilst engaged in carrying out duties assigned to him in connexion with the operations of the Board, and to reimbursement of any expenditure by him on travelling by railway or, subject to the approval of the Minister, by other means of transport necessarily incurred for such purposes.

"Metropolitan area" in the foregoing clauses means the City of Melbourne and the vicinity within the distance of eight (8) miles from the corporate limits of the said City.

(3) Each member of the Board necessarily absent on duty in another State shall be entitled to an allowance of Thirty-two shillings per day, and to the reimbursement of any amount reasonably expended on travelling by railway or, subject to the approval of the Minister, by other means of transport.

(4) In calculating the amount payable to any member, the allowance for each meal and for bed shall be one-fourth of the daily rate, provided that no allowance for bed shall be payable whilst travelling by rail if the Board has incurred expenses for sleeping berths, and provided further that, when any fare paid by the Board includes maintenance, such smaller allowance shall be paid as the Minister deems reasonable.

BY-LAW No. 142.

Prescribing Parking Area in Westfield-street, Fairfield.
A By-law of the City of Heidelberg, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and particularly under and with reference to the Local Government Act 1928, Part VII., and numbered 142, for regulating the parking of motor vehicles.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. A driver may park his motor vehicle in such streets and public places or parts thereof respectively (hereinafter called parking areas) as are set forth in the schedule to this By-law as Parking Areas for motor vehicles which are hereby appointed as such by the Council, but not so as to prevent, hinder, or delay the entry of any other vehicle to or the exit of any other vehicle from premises abutting on or adjacent to any such street or public place or any part thereof.

2. The Council may appoint from time to time such officers as it thinks proper to supervise such parking areas, and every driver shall pay to the Town Clerk or such other officer as the Council shall from time to time direct such fee as prescribed by resolution of the Council and as printed on the official receipt of the Council, and not being more than One shilling per day or portion of a day for each vehicle parked by such driver in any parking area.

3. Any person who, without authority, shall on any pretext pretend to be a parking area attendant or other officer appointed by the Council to receive fees from drivers for parking motor vehicles, or who shall in any way assume the duties of a parking area attendant or such other officer as aforesaid, or who shall otherwise obstruct, hinder, or delay any such attendant or officer in the execution of his duty under this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

4. A driver shall in any parking area park his motor vehicle as directed by the officer in charge of the parking area, or if no such officer be present in the order of his arrival thereat and in such a manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to other motor vehicles already parked, and also in such a way as will permit the latter to leave their respective positions without difficulty and in such a manner that will not contravene any of the provisions of the Road Transport Act or any amendment thereof.

5. Any wilful contravention of any of the foregoing clauses or provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

6. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
