## AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

## REGULATION RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

## REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Stock Foods Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations prescribing standards for and fixing the composition of certain Stock Foods (that is to say):—

The Regulations made under the provisions of the Stock Foods Acts on the 9th March, 1937, are hereby amended by adding, after Regulation 4, the following Regulation:—

5. Standards for and the composition of the Stock Foods hereinafter mentioned shall be as follows:—

*Feeding Blood Meal* shall be the product obtained by drying and grinding blood from freshly slaughtered animals to which no other matter has been added. Feeding Blood Meal shall contain not less than 75 per cent. of crude protein (12 per cent. of albumenoid nitrogen) and not more than 5 per cent. of crude fibre.

*Feeding Meat Meal* shall be the sterilized product obtained by cooking, drying and grinding the carcasses or portions thereof (excluding hair, hide, hoof and horn) of freshly slaughtered animals to which no other matter has been added. Feeding Meat Meal shall contain not less than 55 per cent. of crude protein (8.8 per cent. of albumenoid nitrogen), and not more than 7 per cent. of phosphoric acid. Its fineness shall be such that it will all pass through a 10-mesh sieve.

*Feeding Meat and Bone Meal* shall be the sterilized product obtained by cooking, drying and grinding the carcasses or portions thereof (excluding hair, hide, hoof and horn) and bone of freshly slaughtered animals to which no other matter has been added. Feeding Meat and Bone Meal shall contain not less than 45 per cent. of crude protein (7.2 per cent. of albumenoid nitrogen). Its fineness shall be such that it will all pass through a 10-mesh sieve.

And the Honorable Norman Angus Martin, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BUSH FIRE BRIGADES COMMITTEE.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by section 15 of the *Bush Fire Brigades Act* 1933, the Governor in Council is enabled on the recommendation of the Bush Fire Brigades Committee to make Regulations for or with respect to such matters and things as are authorized or permitted to be prescribed or are necessary or expedient to be prescribed for carrying the said Act into effect: And whereas under the said section it is further provided that any Regulation under the said Act may be revoked by the Governor in Council by Order published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth order that the Regulations made on the twenty-ninth day of November, 1937, and the fifth day of December, 1938, respectively, shall be and the same are hereby revoked, and that in lieu of such Regulations doth hereby make on the recommendation of the Bush Fire Brigades Committee the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Bush Fire Brigades Regulations, and the revocation of the Regulations above mentioned shall not affect any application, regulation, appointment, election, or any other matter or thing made, done, or effected under such Regulations.

2. In these Regulations—

“Act” means the *Bush Fire Brigades Act* 1933, as amended by any Act.

“Brigade” means a bush fire brigade registered under the Bush Fire Brigades Acts.

“Bush Fire District” means a bush fire district specified in the Schedule of the *Bush Fire Brigades Act* 1933.

“Committee” means the Bush Fire Brigades Committee appointed under the Bush Fire Brigades Acts.

“Officer” means a captain, first lieutenant, second lieutenant, or lieutenant.

“Lieutenant” includes “first lieutenant” and “second lieutenant.”

“Subscription member” means any member who under the constitution, rules, or regulations of the brigade has paid or is liable for the payment of membership fees or charges.

*Registration of Brigades.*

3. Any association, formed or to be formed for the purpose of preventing and extinguishing fires within any bush fire district, desiring to be registered as a bush fire brigade under the Bush Fire Brigades Acts, shall make application to the Committee in the form set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

There shall be lodged with the application—

- (1) A list of the persons who, on the date of the application are members of the said association, specifying subscription, transport, and honorary members and those available for fire fighting;
- (2) a copy of the constitution, rules, and regulations of the said association; and
- (3) a list showing the names, addresses, and occupations of the captain, first lieutenant, second lieutenant, and all additional lieutenants of the association stated in order of seniority, and verified by the president of the said association or the chairman of the meeting at which they were elected, and the secretary: Provided that the association may elect such number of lieutenants as provided in clause 4 hereof.

4. Every association shall elect a first lieutenant and a second lieutenant, provided that any association may elect such additional lieutenants as do not exceed the number set out in Scale A or Scale B hereunder (whichever provides for the greater number), provided further that the total number of lieutenants shall not exceed one-sixth of the number of members of the association.

If the number of members or the area of the brigade is reduced below that for which it is entitled to its number of lieutenants and remains so reduced for a period of more than eight weeks, the brigade shall within seven days of the expiration of the said period of eight weeks remove from office such number of lieutenants as may be in excess of those allowed in accordance with the foregoing Scales A and B, and the brigade shall within seven days of the removal from office of such lieutenants advise the Committee of the names of the lieutenants removed.

5. No such application shall be made unless a Resolution authorizing the same shall have been passed by a majority of members present at a general meeting of the association of which notice specifying the intention to submit and, if thought necessary, to pass such Resolution has been duly given to all members: Provided that in the case of an association to be formed such intention shall be indicated in the notice of meeting.

6. The Committee, after due inquiry and upon being satisfied that the association should be registered, shall register the same and issue a certificate of registration in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

7. Such registration certificate shall remain the property of the Committee, and if the registration of the brigade is at any time cancelled, or if the brigade is amalgamated with any other brigade, or is reduced in classification, or disbanded or otherwise ceases to exist, such certificate shall be void, and shall within seven days after the happening of any such event be returned to the Committee.

*Election of Captains and Lieutenants.*

8. Every brigade shall meet not later than the fifteenth day of December in each year, and elect by ballot a captain, first lieutenant, second lieutenant, and such additional lieutenants as are considered necessary by the Committee, and determine the order of seniority of any such additional lieutenants. The maximum number of additional lieutenants which a brigade may elect shall be as prescribed in clause 4 hereof.

9. Notice of intention to elect a captain and lieutenants shall be given in the notice convening the meeting.

10. A return showing the names, addresses, and occupations of the officers elected, and stating their order of seniority, shall be forwarded to the Committee within seven days of their election.

11. (1) Subject to this clause, every officer elected as herebefore provided shall hold office—

- (a) in the case of an officer elected in any month of the year preceding the month of October until the 31st day of December in the year of his election, or until the date on which the Committee approves of the election of his successor, whichever date is the earlier; and

- (b) in the case of an officer elected in the month of October, November, or December, until the 31st day of December in the year following the year of his election, or until the date on which the Committee approves of the election of his successor, whichever date is the earlier.
- (2) If an officer is convicted of any felony or becomes insane or resigns or dies or is removed from office in the manner hereinafter appearing his office shall thereupon become vacant.
- (3) If at any meeting of a brigade called for the purpose a majority of not less than three-quarters of the total number of members present at such meeting carries a Resolution that any officer of the brigade no longer possesses the confidence of the brigade and if, after receiving notice of the passing of such a Resolution, the Committee, with the consent of the Governor in Council, disqualifies such officer from exercising any powers and authorities under the Act such officer shall on the date on which such disqualification takes place be removed from office.
- (4) The secretary or president of every brigade shall forthwith upon the happening thereof notify the Committee of every vacancy in an office caused by an event other than retirement by effluxion of time.
- (5) If any officer who has been approved by the Committee is elected to hold office as a captain or lieutenant for a further period, provided that such officer has not been previously dismissed from his office or disapproved by the Committee, he may hold office until the 31st day of December as hereinbefore provided.
12. Elections to fill any vacancy caused by any event other than retirement by effluxion of time shall be held as soon as may be after the occurrence of the vacancy, and notice of intention to hold such election shall be given to members. A captain or lieutenant elected to fill any such vacancy shall hold office for the unexpired portion of the term for which the officer whom he succeeds was appointed. Notice of any such election shall be given to the Committee within seven days thereof.
13. No member shall be eligible for the position of captain or lieutenant of any brigade unless, prior to the commencement of his term in such office, he shall have attained the age of 25 years.
14. Every captain and lieutenant shall be issued with a certificate of authority in the form set forth in the Third Schedule hereto or to the like effect, which certificate shall become void at the expiry of the period indicated on the certificate or on the earlier resignation, dismissal, or cessation of membership of the holder of any such certificate or the approval of the election of his successor, and the certificate shall be returned to the Committee. Such certificates may be renewed by the attachment thereto of a renewal slip in the form set forth in the Fourth Schedule hereto or to the like effect.
15. Brigades shall be classified according to the following scale:—
- A.—301 and more members available for fire fighting.
  - B.—251 to 300 members available for fire fighting.
  - C.—201 to 250 members available for fire fighting.
  - D.—151 to 200 members available for fire fighting.
  - E.—50 to 150 members available for fire fighting.
  - F.—Up to 50 members available for fire fighting.
16. Every brigade shall keep a register of its members, and shall enter therein the names and addresses of the members, distinguishing between subscription members, transport members, honorary members, and those available for fire fighting.
17. Every brigade shall, within seven days after the annual general meeting for the election of officers in every year, send to the Committee a return stating the names and addresses of all persons who on the date of the return are members of the brigade, distinguishing between subscription members, transport members, honorary members, and those available for fire fighting.
18. Every brigade and every association applying for registration shall, when so required by the Committee, make available its financial and other records for the purpose of verification of the membership.
19. If at any time the membership of a brigade is reduced below the number specified for the classification in which such brigade is included, and remains so reduced for a period of more than eight weeks, or is increased beyond the said specified number, notice thereof shall be given to the Committee within seven days of the expiration of the said period of eight weeks in the case of a reduction; and within seven days of an increase, and the certificate of registration shall be returned.
20. Where under these Regulations it is provided that any notice, list, return, or other information shall be supplied to the Committee, the same shall be supplied by the president of the brigade, the chairman of any meeting whereat was decided any matter concerning which information is required, and the secretary, and, where it is provided that any meeting shall be convened, the same shall be convened by the president or chairman of the brigade and the secretary.

*Duties of Captains and Lieutenants.*

21. It shall be the duty of the captain to control and direct at any fire the members of the brigade and any persons who voluntarily place their services at his disposal, and, subject to the Act and the Regulations thereunder, to take all measures which in the circumstances are reasonable and appear to him to be necessary or expedient for the protection of life and property, and for the purpose of extinguishing or preventing the spread of fire, and in particular to give the necessary directions for entering any land or premises, pulling down or removing any fences, or burning any grass, trees, scrub, or vegetation.
22. Where any fence is pulled down or removed or any premises are entered by a member of the brigade or any person who has placed his services at the disposal of the captain or a lieutenant, it shall be the duty of the captain to take such action as is necessary to ensure that the fence is temporarily repaired in an appropriate manner and the premises safely secured as soon as may be, and the owner or occupier of the property notified of such pulling down, removal, or entry.
23. Where it is found necessary to remove stock, the captain shall notify or cause to be notified the owner thereof of such removal as soon as possible.
24. In the absence of the captain, the senior officer present on the particular occasion shall perform his duties.

#### Amending By-law No. 66 Relating to the Erection of Buildings, &c.

NOTICE is hereby given that By-law No. 74 of the City of Kew, made and passed by the Council of the City of Kew, was approved by the Commission of Public Health on the 3rd August, 1943, and by the Governor in Council on the 14th September, 1943.

The By-law is made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, the Health Acts, and every other power enabling the making of such By-law for the following purposes and purposes connected therewith:—

- (a) regulating, restricting, restraining, or prohibiting the erection, construction, use, occupation, conversion, and alteration of, and every addition to, buildings or erections, and regulating, restraining, or prohibiting the erection and construction of hoardings;
- (b) prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes;
- (c) regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building;
- (d) prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling house or any shop or any dwelling house and shop combined may hereafter be erected;
- (e) providing that every dwelling house hereafter erected shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof a prescribed area of open land;
- (f) regulating sewerage and drainage;
- (g) requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials within such time or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council;
- (h) leaving any matter or thing in relation to the erection and construction of buildings to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case;

and for regulating the erection and keeping in repair of awnings, shades, and coverings placed upon public footways; and for purposes in connexion with the foregoing purposes.

This By-law, save as is otherwise expressed in any clause hereof, shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Kew.

A By-law of the Shire of Glenelg, made under section 750 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, for regulating the market place and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for repealing parts of a By-law, numbered 17, made on the 18th day of February, 1925, and for other purposes hereinafter appearing.

The charge for each such special sale shall be Five pounds five shillings (£5 5s.). The applicant shall lodge with the shire secretary an application in the form prescribed by the Council; together with the sum of One pound one shilling (£1 1s.), which sum shall be retained by the shire secretary on account of the municipality. No further fee shall be payable in cases where the individual or firm, or all the individuals or firms, named in the application have duly paid the current quarter's fee for the use of a stall or standing place as prescribed by Regulation No. 4 and amended by Regulation No. 6 hereunder, and the yard dues payable in respect of such special sale shall be not less than Four pounds four shillings (£4 4s.), or in cases where the applicant shall not less than fourteen clear days before the date fixed for the said sale deliver to the shire secretary notice in writing, signed by the applicant, cancelling such sale, otherwise the remaining Four pounds four shillings (£4 4s.) shall be payable to the municipality. No refund of any such fees may be claimed as a right on the ground that the sale contemplated was not held, but the Council may in circumstances which seem to it to be special, order a refund of the fee or any portion thereof, or may agree to the holding of the special sale in question on some other day without payment of any further fee. All such fees shall be additional to the market dues prescribed by the Regulations hereunder."

2. Clause 6 of By-law No. 17 aforesaid is hereby amended by substituting the words "one thirty o'clock p.m." in place of the words "one o'clock p.m." therein appearing.

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

BY-LAW No. 37.

A By-law of the Shire of Winchelsea, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 37, for prescribing areas in the Township of Lorne within the municipal district as residential areas, and for the purpose of prohibiting within such residential areas the erection, adaptation for use or use of any buildings for the purpose of trades, industries, manufactures, business, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Winchelsea, with the approval of the Governor in Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. Those portions of the Township of Lorne within the Shire of Winchelsea, as defined in the Schedule to this By-law, shall be and the same are hereby prescribed as residential areas.

2. The erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures, business, or public amusements within such residential areas shall be and is hereby prohibited.

3. This By-law shall not preclude any continuance of the use of any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involves the use of immediately adjoining land.

4. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for such offence to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Twenty pounds for each such offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not less than Ten shillings nor more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after written notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after a conviction for the offence or order of any court (as the case may be), and in addition to any such penalties as aforesaid such person shall pay any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of any such breach.

5. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.
