AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish the area of Crown land comprised in Class 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

- (a) His full name and address.
- (b) If onions are being produced under a share farming or partnership agreement, the names and addresses of shareholders or partners, and the proportionate shares of each.
- (c) The varieties planted and the area of each such variety.
- (d) Locality where onions are planted.

2. Every producer who fails to register any or all of the particulars above mentioned with the Onion Marketing Board shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of Five pounds.

3. Every producer who wilfully registers with the Onion Marketing Board any particulars required by these Regulations which are false or misleading shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of Five pounds.
