IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VII. of the *Public Service Act 1928*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as a Public Holiday or a Public Half-Holiday (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

## CRESWICK GOLDFIELD COMMON ABOLISHED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1928*, it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby abolish the under-mentioned common, viz.:—

#### CRESWICK GOLDFIELD COMMON.

*Fire Brigades Act 1928.*  
ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the council of the municipal district hereinafter mentioned has requested, that the portions of such district enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire district: And whereas a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal district shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly:—

EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Upper Yarra, Parishes of Warburton and Woori Yallock, County of Evelyn.

Commencing at a point where the Corduroy-road crosses the Little Yarra River near the south-western angle of allotment 9, Parish of Warburton; thence north by that road to its junction with Settlement-road at the north-western angle of the afore-mentioned allotment; thence generally in an easterly direction by Settlement-road to the north-eastern angle of allotment 49 of section B; thence southerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the northern boundary of the Township of Warburton West; thence north-easterly

by the afore-mentioned township boundary to the eastern boundary of allotment 39 of section A; thence south-easterly by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment and a line crossing the main Warburton-road to the junction of the last-mentioned road with Tarrango-avenue at the most northerly angle of allotment 243; thence generally in a south-easterly direction by Tarrango-avenue to Britannia Creek; thence generally in a westerly direction by Britannia Creek to the Little Yarra River; thence generally southerly and south-easterly by the Little Yarra River to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of allotment 53B, Parish of Woori Yallock; thence south-westerly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary to the Little Yarra-road at the south-eastern angle of allotment 53B; thence north-westerly by the last-mentioned road to the eastern boundary of allotment 53°: thence south-westerly by the last-mentioned boundary and north-westerly by the southern boundary of allotment 53° to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment at Milners-road; thence northerly by Milners-road to the southern boundary of allotment 53z2; thence north-westerly and north-easterly by the southern and western boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 53z; thence north-westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 53z, 53y, 53x, 53w, 53v, 53t2, and 53s1 to the eastern boundary of allotment 52B; thence southerly by the last-mentioned boundary 30 chains more or less to a point on the western boundary of allotment 53q; thence by a line bearing west to the western boundary of allotment 52B; thence northerly by the last-mentioned boundary 40 chains more or less to the southern boundary of the Yarra Junction Township; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundaries of the last-mentioned township, and continuing northerly by a line to the Little Yarra River; thence easterly by the Little Yarra River to the point of commencement.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

## FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nominations during 1944 for free places in a course for a degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne. The number of officers that may be nominated is five.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Chairman of the Public Service Board, as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of their Departmental Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers or who have already completed part of their course, should be not more than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these free places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary

leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction and an approved surety that he will observe the conditions of tenure of his free place, that he will not relinquish the course of studies to which he has been admitted without the permission in writing of the Minister, that he will not discontinue service with the Government of Victoria for any cause within his control during the period of the said course and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the said Government during the period of three years after the termination of his free place and, if his free place extends over more than three years, during an additional year for each year by which the term of his free place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the free place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.

## GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST

## BY-LAW No. 74.

*A By-law for Making and Levying the Rates for the Year commencing on the first day of July, 1943.*

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called "The Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the *Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1928*, and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works or any extension of such works.

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area and supplied with water for domestic purposes:—

- (a) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £20—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £20—One shilling in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) On any land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £5—Five shillings per annum.
- (d) On any such land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof exceeds £5—One shilling in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1943, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1944, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the eighteenth day of October, 1943, and the first day of January, 1944.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 5,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

1. 2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. *The supplies are*

to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary, Education Department, or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

9. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be forwarded by the contractor to the officer authorized to accept delivery, who shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach same to his claim for payment.

10. All orders, duly receipted, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account in the prescribed form for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time to be allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to have been made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in Clause 7.

13. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

14. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and

Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 15, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in Clause 7.

15. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in Clause 7.

16. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

17. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 14 and 15 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the said Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 7. ##### CITY OF BRUNSWICK.

###### BY-LAW No. 126.

A By-law of the City of Brunswick, made under sub-section 18 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 126, for prohibiting, regulating, and controlling quarrying or blasting operations.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick order as follows:—

1. Except with the written consent of the Council no person shall within the City of Brunswick carry on any quarrying or blasting operations, provided that the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to quarrying or blasting operations in connexion with—(a) works commenced before the 4th day of January, 1911, and (b) foundations for buildings.

2. Any person desiring to carry on any quarrying or blasting operations (other than persons exempted under this By-law) shall make written application to the Council for permission, and shall give full particulars of the location, purpose, and nature of such operations, and shall supply such other information relating to the application as the Council may require.

3. The Council may, in its absolute discretion and without giving any reasons, refuse its consent to such application or give its consent, subject to the conditions set out in the consent.

4. No person shall carry on any quarrying or blasting operations in connexion with foundations for buildings without obtaining a permit from the engineer of the City of Brunswick. Application for such permit shall be made, in writing, giving full particulars of the quarrying or blasting operations proposed to be undertaken, and such permit may be refused or granted with or without conditions.

5. In all quarrying or blasting operations (except those carried on by the Government instrumentalities and companies hereinafter set out and those relating to foundations for buildings) the following conditions shall be complied with:—

- All holes shall be drilled vertically and not less than 3 feet apart, or if they are inclined no part of the charges shall approach within 3 feet of one another.
- No hole shall be charged with more than 20 lb. of gelignite or its equivalent, and not more than 50 lb. of explosives shall be fired simultaneously.
- The charge in the hole shall not occupy more than half the length of the hole, and the hole must be tamped to the collar.

(d) All holes so far as practicable shall be bored so that the burden is evenly distributed.

(e) Popping holes shall be bored so as to ensure that the charges placed in them have approximately the same burden in all directions.

6. The owner of any works upon which any quarrying or blasting operations are carried on shall be the person responsible for the observance of this By-law.

7. The provisions of this By-law shall not apply to works carried on by any Government Department of the Commonwealth of Australia or the State of Victoria or by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, the Victorian Railways Commissioners, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, the Metropolitan Gas Company, the Colonial Gas Association, or any electric light corporation under any statutory power, or by the Brunswick City Council.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Brunswick.

9. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable on every such breach to a penalty of not less than Five pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if such breach is a continuing one to a further penalty of not less than Five pounds for each day such offence is continued after a conviction by any court.

10. By-law No. 62 of the City of Brunswick is hereby repealed.

11. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately on its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

there shall be substituted the letter, words, and figure—“(b) calf, sheep, lamb, goat, or kid—5d.”

#### SHIRE OF CORIO.

##### BY-LAW No. 31.

A By-law of the Shire of Corio, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and every other power it thereunto enabling, and numbered 31, for the purpose of suppressing the nuisance hereinafter described existing throughout the whole of the municipal district.

WHEREAS there exists within the municipal district a nuisance caused by filings, turnings, trimmings, and other scraps and particles of glass, iron, steel, tin, and other metals, minerals, and hard substances dropped on roads and streets from vehicles and containers in which the same were being conveyed over such roads and streets. And whereas it is considered by the Council of the said shire to be necessary for the purpose of suppressing such nuisance to make this By-law now in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and of all other powers it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Corio do order as follows:—

1. No person shall, within the Municipal District of Corio, convey or cause or permit to be conveyed upon any road or street any filings, turnings, trimmings, or other scraps or particles of glass, iron, steel, tin, or other metals, minerals, or hard substances (hereinafter referred to as “the said substances”) unless—

(a) The said substances are contained in an impervious container which is completely enclosed; or

(b) the vehicle or other container in which the said substances are so conveyed is completely enclosed so as to make it impossible for any of the said substances to escape therefrom and fall upon any road or street within the municipality; or

(c) the vehicle or other container in which the said substances are being so conveyed is completely surrounded by sides which are so constructed as to prevent any part of such substances escaping through openings therein, and which extend at least 3 inches above the highest part of the said substances being conveyed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of Corio.

3. Every person who shall, by wilful act or default, offend against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for a first offence to a penalty of not more than £5, and for a second or any subsequent offence to a penalty of not more than £20.
