PETITION TO INCORPORATE THE ASSOCIATION FOR

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

19TH OCTOBER, 1943.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Supreme Court Act 1928*, the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1928*, and all other powers hereunto enabling, the following Rules are made by a majority of the Judges of the Supreme Court.

1. The following rule is added to Part I of the Rules for the Admission of Barristers and Solicitors, dated the 26th November, 1892:—

Rule 3. *Board to Meet before Sittings.*—The Board shall meet seven days before the first day of each Sittings of the Full Court for the purpose of considering the application of every person desirous of being admitted to practise as a barrister and solicitor in the Court, and if it shall appear to the Board that such person is a fit and proper person to be admitted and that he has complied with the Statute law and the rules for the time being in force and applicable to his case, and has paid the fees for admission required by law the Board shall give him such a certificate as is required by the Rules of the Council of Legal Education for the time being in force.

2. Rule 20 of the Rules of the Supreme Court for the Admission of Barristers and Solicitors, dated the 26th November, 1892, is hereby repealed.

3. Rule 23 of the said Rules of 26th November, 1892, is hereby repealed, and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

Rule 23. *Payment of Fees.*—All fees for admission to practice as a barrister and solicitor required by the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1928*, or by any other Act or any Rule of the Supreme Court for the time being in force shall be paid to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners, and in any case in which any applicant be not admitted to practise in the said Court the fee paid by him as for his admission to practise shall be returned to him at his request on his giving up to the Secretary any certificate he may have received from the Board.

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, NORMAN A. MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 21st October, 1942, approved by the Governor in Council on 2nd November, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th November, 1942, and any amendment thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations."

2. After Regulation No. 180 of the Principal Regulations, the following Regulation is inserted:—

"180A. No person shall on any vessel which has on board any cargo comprising explosives of any kind perform any work whether by way of repair, alterations, or additions to the vessel by means of use of any article or tool by which a flash or flame of any description may be caused."

3. After Regulation No. 286/8 of the Principal Regulations the following Regulation is inserted:—

"286/8A. Use upon any wharf or in any shed any article or tool by which a naked flash or naked flame of any description may be caused unless such article or tool is used in such a manner and under such conditions as have been first approved of by the Harbor Master."

4. After Regulation No. 297 of the Principal Regulations the following Regulation is inserted:—

"297A. No person or persons shall launch any vessel or vessels into the waters of the port unless he or they shall have obtained written permission from the Commissioners so to do. This regulation shall not apply to the launching of vessels within the following limits:—

(a) a line drawn from the black dolphin at the southern side of the entrance to the River Yarra to the end of Ann-street Pier, Williamstown.

(b) Any part of the Maribyrnong River on the upstream side of the Napier-street bridge, Footscray."

AS AMENDED.

AFTER inquiry in the manner prescribed by the Milk Board Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, the Milk Board does by this notice—

- (a) Define the areas contained in the Schedule to this notice as areas in the metropolis for the purposes of section 24 of the *Milk Board Act* 1933 (No. 4183), as amended, in substitution for the areas defined by notices published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fourth day of March, 1942, and the ninth day of December, 1942.
- (b) Determine that in respect of the areas defined in this notice, milk may be distributed by retail from the dairies described in the second column of the Schedule to this notice in the defined areas appearing opposite such dairies in the first column of such Schedule. In pursuance of the provisions of section 23 of the *Milk Board Act* 1933 (No. 4183), as amended, the said dairies were specified by the Milk Board, by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of October, 1942, as dairies from which milk may be sold or distributed by retail in the metropolis.

CITY OF OAKLEIGH.

BY-LAW No. 65.

A By-law of the City of Oakleigh, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 65, for the purpose of further amending By-law No. 24, prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of such residential areas the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building or land for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusement as are specified in By-law No. 24.

Offensive trades premises, being fat extracting or melting or rendering works which are conducted at premises occupied principally as a butcher's shop and at which fat is extracted, melted, or rendered only from materials derived from such shop—Ten shillings.

Cattle sale yards—One pound.

Boarding houses—Ten shillings.

Common lodging houses—Ten shillings.

Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale of ice-cream, ices, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or artificially aerated water—Five shillings.

For transfer of registration of any of the above-named premises—Two shillings and six pence.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Borough of Maryborough.
