# Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.,

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

### ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Fire Brigades Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the Government Gazette declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the council of the municipal district hereinafter mentioned has requested that the portions of such district enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire district: And whereas a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore 1, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the Fire Brigades Act 1928, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal district shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly:—

### SOUTHERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Warrnambool, Parish of Wangoom, County of Villiers.—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 12, section A, Parish of Wangoom; thence westerly by a road forming the northern boundary of the City of Warrnambool 12, section A, Parish of Wangoom; thence westerly by a road forming the northern boundary of the City of Warrnambool to the south-western angle of allotment 113, no section; thence northerly by a road to a point on the cast boundary of allotment 81 and on a line parallel with the Warrnambool to Dennington Country Roads Board main road at a distance of 5 chains therefrom; thence north-westerly by the line aforementioned to the west boundary of allotment 90; thence due west by a line to the west boundary of allotment 91, and southerly by a road to the south-eastern angle of allotment 99; thence westerly by the south boundary of the last-mentioned allotment and a line to the Merri River, and generally in a northerly direction by the Merri River to a road forming the north boundary of allotment 43; thence casterly by that road to the north-eastern angle of allotment 51; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 51 and 50 to a point distant 5 chains north from the afore-mentioned Country Roads Board main road; thence easterly and south-easterly by lines parallel with and distant 5 chains from the last-mentioned road to a point on a line parallel with and distant 25 chains north from the northern boundary of the City of Warrnambool; thence easterly by the line last mentioned to a point on the eastern boundary of allotment 13, section A; thence southerly by a road to the point of commencement.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the Government Gazette, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation revoking the Proclamation made the eighteenth day of September, 1933, and published in the Government Gazette of the twentieth day of September, 1933, regarding prohibition of fishing in the Lang Lang River and its tributaries; and prohibiting all fishing in or the taking of fish from the following waters for the periods mentioned:—

1. The Lang Lang River and its tributaries between the Heath Hill Bridge and the mouth of such river, including what is known as the Lang Lang straight cut—from 1st May to 31st August in each year, both days inclusive.

2. The Lang Lang River and its tributaries (except O'Mahoney's and Pheasant Creeks and their tributaries, which are already closed to all fishing during the whole year) above or upstream from the Heath Hill Bridge—during the whole of each year.
