The Fisheries Acts.

PROHIBITION OF ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM THE LANG LANG RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the eighteenth day of September, 1933, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twentieth day of September, 1933, regarding prohibition of fishing in the Lang Lang River and its tributaries; and prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the following waters for the periods mentioned:—

1. The Lang Lang River and its tributaries between the Heath Hill Bridge and the mouth of such river, including what is known as the Lang Lang straight cut—from 1st May to 31st August in each year, both days inclusive.
2. The Lang Lang River and its tributaries (except O'Mahony's and Pheasant Creeks and their tributaries which are already closed to all fishing during the whole year) above or upstream from the Heath Hill Bridge—during the whole of each year.

CERTAIN PLANT DECLARED TO BE A NOXIOUS WEED THROUGHOUT THE STATE OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plant named hereunder to be a noxious weed for the purposes of the above Act throughout the State of Victoria, viz.:—

Diplotaxis tenuifolia, "Sand Rocket."

VARIATION OF ORDER APPOINTING A COAL AND COKE BOARD.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts* for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did, by Order, appoint a Wages Board described as the Coal and Coke Board, and did by further Orders vary and adjust the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient further to vary the powers of the said Board in the manner hereafter appearing: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Acts*, doth hereby vary the Orders above-mentioned so that in substitution for the powers thereby conferred, the said Coal and Coke Board shall be given the following powers, that is to say:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed—

- (a) in any business or occupation connected with the sale or distribution of coal or coke by any—
 - (i) coal importer;
 - (ii) coal mine owner;
 - (iii) gas company;
 - (iv) agent or contractor who distributes coal or coke for any coal importer, coal mine owner, or gas company;
- (b) in the process, trade, business, or occupation of burning, preparing, grinding, grading or distributing charcoal in a form suitable for use—
 - (i) in power-producing or heat-producing units;
 - (ii) in the manufacture of explosives;
 - (iii) in the manufacture, repair, or maintenance of gas masks or respirators.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACTS.—AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER V.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Factories and Shops Acts* and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order amend Chapter V. of the Regulations under the *Factories and Shops Acts* made on the fourth day of March, 1930, by adding to Clause 16 of the said Chapter V. the following sub-clause:—

- (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, if the Board is satisfied, after such examination as it thinks necessary, that an applicant is a fit and proper person and that his knowledge and experience are sufficient to enable him with reasonable safety to take charge of any particular steam-boiler, the Board may grant to such applicant a conditional certificate for one steam-boiler only for such limited period, not exceeding six months, as to the Board appears proper. Provided that this sub-clause and any certificate issued thereunder shall remain in force for the duration of the war only.

For the purpose of this sub-clause the Board may, if it thinks fit, waive any of the requirements of Clause 17 of the said Chapter V. as amended by any Regulation.

And the Honorable Edwin Joseph Mackrell, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BY-LAW No. 16.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Stawell order as follows:—

1. The area set forth in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a populous area.

2. (a) Where in the opinion of the Council any undergrowth, weeds, or grass upon any land within the area set out in the Schedule hereto constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property, the Council may cause to be served on the owner or occupier of such land a notice, in writing, under the hand of the Shire Secretary, requiring such owner or occupier to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass within the time limited in such notice, not being less than seven days from the service thereof.

(b) If such owner or occupier shall refuse or neglect within the time limited in such notice to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass from the said land, the Council may by its officers, servants, or agents at any time thereafter enter upon such land and remove therefrom such undergrowth, weeds, or grass, and may recover the cost thereof in any Court of competent jurisdiction from the owner or occupier.

(c) Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than 20s., and not exceeding £20, for each and every offence, and in the case of

a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than 10s. for each day on which an offence under the By-law is continued.
