WHEREAS by section 9 of the Local Government Act 1941
(No. 4869), it is enacted that the Governor in Council
may make Regulations for or with respect to permitting to
vote a person whose name appears in any voters' list certified
and signed under the provisions of section 95 of the Local
Government Act 1923, but has been omitted from the
corresponding municipal roll being used at any election under
the Local Government Acts: Now, therefore, His Excellency
the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice
of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers
conferred by the said section of the said Act and all other
powers enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the
following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. In these Regulations—
"Deputy Returning Officer" means the person appointed
deputy pursuant to section 125 of the Local Government Act 1928.

- "Presiding Officer" means the person appointed by the Returning Officer or his deputy pursuant to section 136 of the Local Government Act 1928, to preside at a polling booth.
- "Voter" means a person claiming to vote or voting pursuant to section 9 of the Local Government Act 1941.
- The declaration of a voter shall be printed on an envelope, and shall be in accordance with the schedule hereto.
- 3. Before a voter makes a declaration, the returning officer or deputy returning officer or presiding officer shall put to him the following question:—
 - (i) Have you already voted at the present election?
- And in municipalities where voting by post is in force-
 - (ii) Have you received a postal ballot-paper or postal ballot-papers enabling you to vote at the election (for a councillor or councillors (as the case may be) for the Ward (or Riding) of the to-day!

 (In the case of an adjourned poll, the day from which the poll was adjourned should also be named in the question.)

And the said returning officer or deputy returning officer or presiding officer may, if he thinks fit, and, if required by any candidate or scrutineer, shall put to any voter the following questions:-

- 4. Every voter to whom any of the prescribed questions are put who refuses or omits to answer such questions, or in answering them shows that he is not entitled to vote, shall be and be deemed to be prohibited from voting then or afterwards a such cleation. wards at such election.
- 5. After the voter has marked his ballot-paper or ballot-papers as required by or under the Local Government Acts, he shall forthwith fold the same separately so to conceal the vote and return same so folded to the returning officer or deputy returning officer or presiding officer at the booth from which he obtained the ballot-paper or ballot-papers.
- he obtained the ballot-paper or ballot-papers.

 6. Each returning officer or deputy returning officer or presiding officer shall make a record of the full name of every voter who votes at the polling booth at which he presides, together with the name and situation of the rateable property in respect of which he claims to vote, and the number of ballot-papers delivered to each voter, and at the close of the poll each such deputy returning officer or presiding officer shall sign and forward such record to the returning officer, together with the notes regarding any refusal of a claim of any person to vote provided by sub-section (11) of section 9 of the Local Government Act 1941.
- 7. Upon receipt from the municipal clerk of envelopes containing votes of unenrolled voters, the returning officer shall, in the presence of the scrutineers and poll clerk (if any), but of no other person, deal with the said envelopes any), but of no other person and ballot-papers as follows:

 (a) Place in one parcel the unopened envelopes bearing the duly signed and attested declarations of persons who, according to the municipal clerk's report, are not persons to whom sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Local Government Act 1941 applies, fasten and seal the parcel, endorse thereon the words "Unenrolled voters' ballot-papers disallowed", and add the name of the municipality and the name of the subdivision (if any), his signature, and the date: date:
 - (b) (i) place the envelopes containing the ballot-papers of persons who, according to the municipal clerk's reports, are persons to whom sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Local Government Act 1941 applies, before him on the table in such a manner that the face only of each envelope bearing the address of the returning officer shall be visible;
 - (ii) without further examining the declaration of any voter, or permitting any other person to do so, open and withdraw from each envelope a number of ballot-papers equal to the number of votes to

which the person is entitled according to the certificate of the municipal clerk, and without inspecting or unfolding any such ballot-paper or allowing any other person to do so, forthwith deposit the ballot-paper or ballot-papers in a ballot-box, leaving any excess ballot-paper or ballot-papers inside the envelope, and forthwith resealing any envelope in which it is apparent that a ballot-paper remains; and
