Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary

or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district respectively specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively specified: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal districts shall be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively specified accordingly:—

CENTRAL FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Buninyong, Parish of Ballaarat, County of Grant: Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 8, section 11; thence south-westerly by a road to a point thereon distant 15 chains more or less from the Midland Highway; thence north-westerly by lines parallel to and 15 chains distant from that highway to the southern boundary of the City of Ballaarat; thence easterly by that boundary to a point thereon distant 15 chains more or less easterly from the Midland Highway; thence south-easterly by lines parallel to and 15 chains distant from that highway to the southern boundary of allotment 18a, section 4; thence south-westerly by a road to the Midland Highway; and thence north-westerly by that highway to the point of commencement.

EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Healesville, Township of Marysville, Parish of Steavenson, County of Anglessey: Commencing at the intersection of the south-western boundary of the Township of Marysville with the Steavenson River; thence south-westerly by the boundary afore-mentioned, a distance of 46 chains more or less to a road; thence north-westerly by that road and a road forming the boundaries of allotments 15, 14, 13, 12, and

11 of section 5 to Mt. Kitchener-avenue; thence south-westerly by the afore-mentioned avenue to the most southerly angle of allotment 15 of section 4; thence generally in a north-westerly and northerly direction by a road to the most easterly angle of allotment 26 of section 2; thence generally in a westerly direction by a road forming the southern boundaries of allotments 26, 27, 32, and 31 to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly and north-easterly by a road forming the boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment and allotments 30, 29, 28, 23, 22, and 21 to a point opposite the western boundary of allotment 20 of section 1; thence westerly by a road to Wilks Creek; thence generally in a north-easterly direction by the creek afore-mentioned to its junction with the Steavenson River, and continuing generally in a north-westerly direction by the river afore-mentioned to a point in line with the north boundary of allotments 33 and 34 of section 1; thence easterly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary to a road; thence generally in a south-westerly direction by that road to the most westerly angle of allotment 1A of section F; thence north-easterly, south-easterly, and southerly by the last-mentioned allotment and south-easterly by allotments 1, 2, 3, and 4 to the northern boundary of allotment 5; thence north-easterly by allotment 5 to a road; thence generally south-easterly and easterly by that road to the western boundary of the Township of Marysville; thence southerly by the last-mentioned boundary to the point of commencement.

NORTH-EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Numurkah, Parishes of Mundoona and Drumanure. County of Moira: The Town of Wanghnu as defined in the *Government Gazette* of the 12th February, 1875, page 262.

SOUTH-CENTRAL FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Newstead and Mt. Alexander, Town of Newstead, and Parishes of Strangways, Tarrengower, and Sandon, County of Talbot: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 10, section B, Parish of Strangways; thence southerly by the last-mentioned allotment and easterly, southerly, and south-westerly by the boundary of the Town of Newstead to a point in line with the eastern boundary of allotment 19 of

section A, Parish of Strangways; thence southerly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary to the Muckleford Creek; thence north-westerly by the Muckleford Creek and generally in a south-easterly and southerly direction by the Loddon River to a road forming the north boundary of allotment 17 of section 1; thence westerly by that road to the parish boundary; thence northerly by the boundary last mentioned to the south-eastern angle of allotment 11 of section 1, Parish of Sandon; thence generally westerly, north-westerly, north-easterly, and north-westerly by allotments 11, 10, and 9 to the south boundary of allotment 4; thence westerly and northerly by allotment 4 and northerly by allotment 3 and a line to the south boundary of allotment 21 of section XII, Parish of Tarrengower; thence westerly, northerly, and south-easterly by the last-mentioned allotment to a point in line with the west boundary of allotment 20; thence northerly by a line and the boundary last mentioned to the northern boundary of allotment 20; thence generally in a north-easterly, easterly, and south-easterly direction by the boundary last mentioned, and southerly by the eastern boundary of allotment 20 afore-mentioned to a point in line with the south boundary of allotment 4 of section VII; thence easterly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary and continuing easterly by the north boundary of the Town of Newstead, Parish of Strangways, to the most westerly angle of allotment 1 of section B; thence north-easterly by allotment 1 and easterly by the north boundaries of allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, a line, and allotments 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 to the point of commencement.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act* 1928, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act* 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act* 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act* 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

NAGAMBIE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1943.

THE Nagambie Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound (£1) of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Nagambie Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than on land on which there is no building) be less than Thirty shillings (30s.), and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Fifteen shillings (15s.).

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said land and tenements for the year commencing the first day of January, 1943, and shall be payable on 15th April, 1943, at the office of the Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 15,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 346.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the *Railways Act 1928*, do hereby make the following By-law and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith :—

"Sale of Lost or Unclaimed Property."

Any parcel, goods, luggage, or thing of any description whatsoever on railway premises, or stored elsewhere by the Commissioners, which is not claimed and removed by the owner, may be sold by the Commissioners after the expiration of the time hereinafter specified, and, after deducting any amount which may be due thereon for freight, storage, and other charges, including the expenses of sale, the Commissioners will pay the surplus (if any) to the owner on demand—

(a) Any parcel, goods, luggage, or thing likely to deteriorate may be sold forthwith.

(b) All empties may be sold after the expiration of seven days.

(c) All other parcels, goods, luggage, or things may be sold after the expiration of three months."

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of July, 1942, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, declared that on and after the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Proclamation the provisions of section 33 of the *Gas Regulation Act 1933* should have effect: And whereas such Proclamation was published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of July, 1942: And whereas it is provided in the said section that so long as any such Proclamation remains unrevoked the Governor in Council may make such regulations as he thinks fit for or with respect to matters set forth in the said section: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the said State, with the advice of the Executive Council aforesaid, doth hereby make the following regulations under and pursuant to the said section and all other powers thereto enabling him:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Gas Regulation (Emergency Powers) Regulations (No. 2)," and shall take effect on and from the twelfth day of April, 1943.

2. The provisions of the said *Gas Regulation Act 1933* relating to the standard of calorific value shall not apply to the undertaking of the City of Heidelberg.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Sebastopol.

3. Every By-law of the Borough of Sebastopol heretofore made for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence is hereby repealed, and in particular By-law No. 13, By-law No. 14, Regulation No. 5, and Regulation No. 7 are hereby repealed.

4. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
