BY-LAW No. 4079.—RATE.—WATERWORKS DISTRICT OF THE LODDON UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council bearing date the 5th April, 1943, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of 7th April, 1943, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rate is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Loddon United Waterworks Trust, except within any Urban District thereof:—

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

2. Regulation 28 of the Building Regulations 1937 is hereby amended by adding to clause (b) the words "and the length of any individual rope at the side of an aisle shall not exceed that necessary to reach from the back of one seat to the back of the seat next in front of it."

36. The proprietor shall cause all exit doors to be thrown open at the conclusion of every performance, entertainment, or meeting.

(g) any bolt having a handle in the form of a hook unless the width of the hook at right angles to the face of the door is at least two inches.

90a. The proprietor of every public building shall keep the building at all times in a proper state of repair, and shall repaint all external painted surfaces as often as may be necessary to protect the underlying material from deterioration.

6. After Regulation 92 of the Building Regulations 1937 there shall be inserted a new Regulation numbered 92A, and reading as follows:—

92A. In every theatre and in every concert hall or other building where four or more performers or members of an orchestra are usually or frequently employed the proprietor shall provide in positions readily accessible from the dressing-rooms and/or the orchestra-room closets and urinals to the number required by the Commission.

7. Regulation 96 of the Building Regulations 1937 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor :—

96. (1) Every building which is used at night shall be provided with approved means for artificially lighting every room compartment passage and stair therein and every exit and passage or other way therefrom to a public thoroughfare.

(2) Where electric power is available the lighting of every new building shall be by means of electricity except where otherwise required by the Building Regulations 1937.

(3) The proprietor shall keep lighted every part of the building to which the public is admitted together with all passages stairs exits passage and other ways therefrom so as to render all aisles gangways passages and stairs in the building and all exits and passage or other ways from the building to a public thoroughfare or thoroughfares readily visible during the whole time the premises are open to the public.

(4) The proprietor shall not cause permit or suffer any darkening for any purpose whatsoever of any portion of the building used by the public so as to render any aisle gangway passage stair or exit or any passage or other way from an exit to a public thoroughfare not readily visible.

8. Regulation 130 of the Building Regulations 1937 is hereby amended by the addition of the words—

“Provided that the Commission may approve of the erection of a theatre with the level of the floor of the stalls at the principal entrance thereto more than 3 feet but not more than 15 feet above the level of the said street or more than 12 feet but not more than 18 feet below the level of such street conditionally on the provision of exits at least 25 per cent. greater in aggregate width than the exits by Regulation 145.”

9. Regulation 155 of the Building Regulations 1937 is hereby amended by—

(a) adding to the second paragraph of clause (1) the words “or by an officer authorized by him”;

(b) deleting clause (2) and substituting therefor the following—

(2) One approved chemical hand fire extinguisher of two Imperial gallons capacity and of a type approved by the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria shall be provided and placed on a strong bracket or suspended from a hook near each fire hydrant and in such other positions as the Commission may require; and

(c) deleting from clause (4) the words “or hand fire-buckets”.

10. Regulation 158 of the Building Regulations 1937 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

158. (1) In the succeeding clauses of this Regulation, notwithstanding the interpretation in Regulation 3:—

“Theatre” means a theatre in which there is an entertainment of the stage involving the use of movable or inflammable scenery; and

“Cinematograph hall” includes all other theatres.

(2) Every proprietor shall during the whole time the theatre or cinematograph hall is occupied by the public cause a fireman or firemen as the case may require in accordance with the following scale to be in attendance on the premises, viz.:—

Seating Capacity.	Number of Firemen.	
	Theatre.	Cinematograph Hall.
501 to 1,000 persons ..	1	1
1,001 to 2,000 persons ..	2	1
2,001 to 3,000 persons ..	3	2
Over 3,000 persons ..	As shall be specially determined by the Commission in each case.	

(3) In every theatre wherever situated and in every cinematograph hall within that portion of the City of Melbourne bounded by Latrobe, Spring, Flinders, and Spencer streets, a fireman or firemen as required by the foregoing table shall be employed at every session.

(4) In every cinematograph hall not within that portion of the City of Melbourne described in the preceding clause, a fireman or firemen as required by the foregoing table shall be employed at every evening session and at every day session on Saturdays and public holidays.

(5) In every case where in the opinion of the Commission the circumstances so require the number of firemen in attendance and the number of sessions during which a fireman or firemen shall be in attendance shall be increased or decreased by the proprietor accordingly.

11. Regulation 159 of the Building Regulations 1937 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

159. (1) Every such fireman aforesaid shall be a skilled fireman and a member of a “Brigade” within the meaning of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* or a person thereto authorized whether generally or specifically by a “Chief Officer” within the meaning of that Act.

(2) Every such fireman shall commence duty at least 15 minutes before the building is opened to the public and shall remain on duty until the building is vacated by the public or until he is relieved by another fireman and shall wear the uniform of the Fire Brigade whilst on duty.

- (3) It shall be the duty of every such fireman—
- (a) to inspect the building before the commencement of the performance or meeting to ascertain that all fire-extinguishing appliances are in position and ready for use; that there is no accumulation of inflammable material contrary to Regulations 124 and 161; that all exit doors and their fastenings are in good order and unobstructed internally or externally; and that all required auxiliary and external lamps are lighted;
 - (b) to bring under the notice of the manager or person in charge any faults found during such inspection and if such faults are not remedied promptly to report the facts in writing to his superior officer for transmission to the Commission;
 - (c) to report to the manager or person in charge any breach of the Regulations regarding over-crowding or obstruction of aisles gangways or exits and if such breach is not rectified immediately to report the matter forthwith to an authorized officer or a member of the Police Force;
 - (d) to prevent smoking (except where such smoking forms part of the play or performance) on over or under the stage and in the dressing-rooms or store-rooms;
 - (e) to patrol the theatre during the performance as may be necessary and when not so patrolling to take up a position such that he can readily observe and approach any outbreak of fire; provided that in the case of an entertainment of the stage where there is only one fireman he shall take up his position on the stage when not patrolling the theatre and where there are two or more firemen one shall give his whole attention to the stage and its accessory compartments;
 - (f) generally as far as practicable to prevent the outbreak of fire and in the case of such outbreak to take prompt steps to control it; and
 - (g) to report in writing to his superior officer for transmission to the Commission the occurrence on the premises of any fire or any alarm of fire with all particulars which afford information as to the cause of the fire or alarm and of the means used for extinguishing the fire.

12. Regulation 164 of the Building Regulations 1937 is hereby amended by the addition to clause 4 thereof of the words—

“In every cabin which is constructed or enlarged after the coming into operation of the Amending Building Regulations 1942 every door of the cabin which opens into the auditorium shall have between such door and the auditorium a smoke-lock compartment not less than 10 square feet in area lined and ceiled with fire-resisting material and having a bell-mouthed upcast outlet ventilator at least 6 inches in diameter and otherwise complying with clause (8) of this Regulation. The door from every smoke-lock to the auditorium shall comply with the requirements of this clause concerning doors from cabins”.

13. Regulation 169 of the Building Regulations 1937 is hereby amended by inserting at the beginning of the second paragraph the words “At every performance which includes any entertainment of the stage”.

14. Regulation 170 of the Building Regulations 1937 is hereby amended by inserting after the word “programmes” in the fourth line the words—

“and every proprietor of a cinematograph hall shall cause to be projected on the picture screen for a period of fully five minutes immediately before the first picture is shown and during the interval”.

2. Regulation 12 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

12. (a) Every registration shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year, but may be renewed subject to the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) hereof.

(b) Every application for renewal of registration shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee and the certificate of registration for endorsement.

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of Regulation 16, the Board may at any time after the 31st day of January in any year direct the removal from the register (after the giving of fourteen days' notice) of the name of any person who has not applied for renewal of his registration, and when any name has been so removed it shall not be restored to the register until a new application for registration has been made to the Board and the Board has approved of such application.

3. Paragraph (d) of Regulation 20 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

(d) For annual renewal of registration—Two shillings and six pence, which shall be lodged with the application for renewal; provided that if such renewal is not applied for within one month after the previous registration has expired an additional fee of Two shillings and six pence shall be payable.

If any refuse or rubbish deposited or left on any such land reserved as aforesaid be offensive or likely to become offensive, the person depositing or leaving such refuse or rubbish shall, if directed by an officer of the Council, cover such refuse or rubbish with a layer of clean soil or other innocuous material after such refuse or rubbish has been deposited or left on such reserved land.

5. The owner or occupier of any land shall remove or destroy all refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under the *Health Acts 1928*).

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Traralgon.

7. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall for every act or default, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
