"Section 1.

#### "Section 1.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity supplied to him, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates per month:—

For energy supplied for lighting purposes—1s. 6d. per

For each unit over 10 units—8d. per unit.

For each unit over 10 units—6d. per unit.

#### Section 3.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule, the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of 9s. per month irrespective of the amount of energy consumed or the purpose for which such supply is given, and exclusive of meter rent."

#### STREAM POLLUTION REGULATIONS 1943.

NDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say) :-

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Stream Pollution Regulations 1943," and shall come into operation upon publication in the Government Gazette.
  - 2. The Stream Pollution Regulations 1936 are hereby repealed.
- 3. These Regulations shall apply throughout the State of Victoria except in the case of the streams set out in the Eighth Schedule of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1928, or in any amendment thereof.
- 4. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter-
  - "Animal" includes bird;
  - "Approval" means approval in writing by the Commission; and
  - "Approved" has a corresponding interpretation;
  - "Bathing place" means any portion of a stream which is com-monly used by numbers of persons for the purpose of bathing;
  - "Commission" means the Commission of Public Health constituted under the Health Act 1928;
  - "Health Acts" means the Health Act 1928 (No. 3697), the Health Act 1931 (No. 4010), the Health Act 1935 (No. 4333), the Health Act 1941 (No. 4867), and any amendment thereof;
  - "Lake" includes lake, lagoon, swamp, marsh, spring, reservoir, well, dam, or waterhole;
  - "Offensive" includes noxious; and
  - "Offensive liquid" means any liquid which is offensive or is likely to become offensive;
  - "Polluting liquid" means any liquid which reduces the purity of the water of any stream into which it is discharged;
  - "Salt lake" means any lake, the waters of which contain such a proportion of saline matter as to render the water unsuitable for domestic use, or as a water supply for stock;
  - "Sewage" means any liquid containing human excreta or urine, domestic waste water, or drainage from any pig-sty, pig-pen, cowshed, cow yard, stable, duck yard, or other place where animals are kept.
  - "Sewerage Authority" means any sewerage authority within the meaning of the Sewerage Districts Act 1928, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust;
  - "Solid matter" does not include particles of matter in suspension in water:
  - "Source of water supply" includes river, creek, stream, watercourse, lake, lagoon, swamp, marsh, spring, reservoir, or well if the water therein or therefrom is or is likely to be used for drinking purposes by man, or for domestic purposes, or for any purpose in connexion with the preparation, manufacture, or sale of food, or in connexion with a dairy farm or dairy.

"Stream" includes river, stream, watercourse, or channel, and also (unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter) includes lake as defined herein.

#### SOLID MATTER.

- 5. No person shall—
  - (a) throw or put, or cause, permit, or suffer to be thrown or put or to fall or pass; or
  - (b) put or cause, permit, or suffer to be put in any position whence it may fall or pass or be carried by any natural means—

into any stream any ashes, dirt, refuse, rubbish, garbage, nightsoil, manure, offal, or any carcass or portion of a carcass of any animal or any other solid matter detrimental to the purity of the water of the said stream.

- 6. No person shall throw or put, or cause, permit, or suffer to be thrown or put into any stream, or in any position whence it may fall or pass, or by any natural means be carried into any stream any sawdust, shavings, bark, or other solid waste from any sawmill or woodworking establishment.
  - 7. No person shall-
    - (a) put or cause, permit, or suffer to be put, or fall or pass;
    - (b) put or cause, permit, or suffer to be put in any position whence it may fall or pass, or be carried by any means whatsoever—

into any stream any grease, fat, oil, tar, or any waste from a gasworks or gas producer.

Provided that a person using oil or tar in the construction, maintenance, or repair of any road or street shall be deemed not to have committed a breach of this regulation by reason only of such oil or tar flowing or passing into a stream if such person proves that he used all reasonable means to prevent such oil or tar flowing or passing as aforesaid.

#### SEWAGE.

- 8. (1) Except as hereinafter in this regulation provided, no person shall-
  - (a) cause, permit, or suffer to flow, fall, or pass; or
  - (b) put or cause, permit, or suffer to be put in any position whence it may fall or pass by any means whatsoever—

into any stream any sewage or the effluent from any septic tank system, sewage treatment works, or sewage farm which sewage or effluent does not comply with the standard and test therefor prescribed by subregulation (2) of this regulation.

Provided, however, that any sewage or effluent which does not contain more than ten parts per 100,000 of suspended matter, and which does not cause or is not likely to cause any nuisance may be discharged into any stream which is a tidal estuary or a salt lake if the point of discharge be not adjacent to any bathing place or shellfish

- (2) The following standards and tests for sewage or effluent are prescribed for the purposes of sub-regulation (1) of this regulation:—
  - (a) In the case of a stream other than a stream which is a source of water supply-
    - (i) no sample thereof shall contain more than three parts per 100,000 of suspended matter;
    - (ii) no sample thereof shall when tested with its suspended matter included take up at the temperature of 65 deg. Fahrenheit more than two parts per 100,000 of dissolved oxygen in five days.
  - (b) In the case of any stream which is a source of water supply the sewage or effluent in addition to complying with the standard and test prescribed in paragraph (a) of this sub-regulation shall, when tested in amounts of 50 cubic centimetres, be found to be free from pathogenic organisms and from bacillus coli communis.

- (3) If any sewage which does not comply with the standard and test therefor prescribed by this regulation falls, flows, or passes into any stream after passing through or along a sewer drain pipe or channel which is vested in any municipality or sewerage authority no liability shall attach to such municipality or sewerage authority under or by virtue of this regulation if such municipality or authority has taken or is taking all practicable steps (including the carrying out of any necessary works) to prevent such sewage from falling, flowing, or passing into the stream.
- (4) In any case where a sewer drain or channel carries both stormwater and sewage to treatment works the Commission may permit the provision at an approved point or at approved points on the course of such sewer drain or channel of one or more by-passes or leap weirs for the purpose of allowing such sewage to enter a stream without treatment, although it does not comply with the standard and test therefor prescribed by this regulation.

Provided that every such by-pass or leap weir shall be so constructed that it will not operate until the volume rate of flow of sewage in the sewer or drain exceed six times the maximum dry weather rate of flow therein.

#### LIQUID TRADE WASTES.

- 9. No person shall construct or lay or cause to be constructed or laid any channel, drain, sewer, or pipe for the purpose of conveying poisonous, offensive, or polluting liquid from any trade premises to a stream or to a drain sewer or pipe which leads to a stream.
  - 10. No person shall---
    - (a) cause, permit, or suffer to flow or pass; or
    - (b) put or cause, permit, or suffer to be put in any position whence it may fall or pass or be carried by any means whatsoever—

into any stream any poisonous, offensive, or polluting liquid from any trade premises.

11. Liquid which falls, flows, or passes into a stream from trade premises shall not be deemed for the purposes of these Regulations to be poisonous, offensive, or polluting if at all times it is free from offensive odour; does not contain more than four parts per 100,000 of suspended solids, nor with its suspended solids included take up at 65 deg. Fahrenheit more than four parts per 100,000 of dissolved oxygen in five days; does not render the water of the stream harmful to human beings, animals, or fish; and (where the stream is a source of water supply or is used for water supply for domestic animals) does not impart to the water any objectionable taste or colour.

#### GENERAL.

- 12. These Regulations shall not apply to any case where sewage from street drains or channels or effluent from a septic tank system, sewage treatment works, or sewage farm, or liquid from trade premises is discharged into a lagoon, swamp, marsh, or depression, which is used solely as a receptacle for such sewage effluent or liquid, and which does not at any time communicate with or overflow or discharge into any stream or lake unless it is also proved that a nuisance is created in such lagoon, swamp, marsh, or depression by reason of such sewage effluent or liquid being so discharged.
- 13. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by or pursuant to these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds; but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

And the Honorable Edwin Joseph Mackrell, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Where in its opinion any undergrowth, weeds, or grass on any land within any of the said area constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property the Council may, by notice, in writing, addressed to the owner or occupier of such land, require such owner or occupier to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass from such land within such reasonable time as shall be prescribed by such notice.

3. If such owner or occupier, after service on him of a notice to remove undergrowth, weeds, or grass as aforesaid, shall fail to do so within the time prescribed by such notice, the Council may cause such undergrowth, weeds, or grass to be removed from such land, and may recover the cost of such removal from the owner or occupier in default.

4. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than Twenty shillings, and not exceeding Twenty pounds for each dan every offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence under the By-law is continued.

(ii) by shouting, singing, or haranguing.

No person being the owner or occupier of any building or erection shall use or permit such building or erection to be used for making, causing, or permitting or suffering to be made or caused by any of the means hereinbefore referred to such a volume of sound or noise as shall cause annoyance, nuisance, or obstruction to any other person upon any street, road, or footway, or in any premises abutting thereon or adjacent thereto, or shall be likely to cause such annoyance, nuisance, or obstruction. nuisance, or obstruction.

#### BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

BY-LAW No. 42.

- A By-law of the Borough of Wangaratta, made under and in by-law of the borough of wangarder. In that behalf conferred by the Local Government Acts, and numbered 42:—(a) For regulating the market place in the Borough of Wangaratta, and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto; (b) for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor. Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wangaratta (hereinafter referred to as the Council), order as follows:—

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipality of the Borough of Wangaratta, and shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Council of the Borough of Wangaratta, and immediately after its publication in the Victoria Government Gazette.

- 1. The market shall be known as the Wangaratta Municipal Sale Yards, and shall be held at the place and in the building and yards appointed to be used for the purpose of such market situated in the Borough of Wangaratta, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle and other things.
- market shall be used for the sale of cattle and other things.

  2. Market Days.—The Wangaratta Municipal Sale Yards shall be open for the reception, delivery, and sale of animals on a Tuesday and a Thursday to be fixed by the Council, and thereafter on every Thursday and every alternate Tuesday, and a market held on such days shall be called a regular market. The market shall also be open for the reception, delivery, and sale of animals or things as the Borough Council shall permit to be sold therein on such days during the year, and for such hours during each day between sunrise and sunset as the Council may from time to time determine, provided however that no business shall be transacted in the Wangaratta Municipal Sale Yards on any Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Anzac Day. Day.
- 3. Special Sales.—Special sales may be held on any day which is not a regular market day, and the agent first applying shall have prior right to the date, provided that no agent be granted a date for a special sale within seven days prior to a sale already approved by the Council, and in the same week prior to an ordinary sale of similar class of stock. All applications must be accompanied by a deposit of Two pounds, which deposit will be refunded if the sale takes place.
- 4. Times of Sales .- The sale of cattle on regular market days shall be in the following order:-
  - (a) Fat cattle sales shall commence at 11 o'clock a.m., and continue until 12.30 p.m., resuming at 1 p.m.
  - (b) Store cattle sales shall commence at 1.15 p.m.
  - (c) Dairy cattle sales shall commence at 11 a.m., and continue to 12.30 p.m., resuming at 1 p.m.
    (d) Bull sales shall commence at 10.30 a.m.

  - (e) Fat sheep sales shall commence at 10 a.m., and continue until 12.30 p.m., resuming at 1 p.m.
  - (f) Store sheep sales shall commence at 1 p.m.
  - (g) Backfatter pig sales shall commence at 12.30 p.m.

- (h) Fat pig sales immediately following backfatter pig
- (i) Store pig sales commence at 1.15 p.m.
- (j) Bobby calves sales shall commence at 10 a.m., except at certain seasons of the year, when the time may be altered, if necessary, at the discretion of the inspector. All sales must be punctually commenced, and must be continuous and without any breaks or adjournments of such sales until the whole sales or intended sales shall have been fully completed and ended. If and when more than one sale is being conducted at the same time, each sale shall be con-ducted in a separate yard, and in each case as and where the inspector shall direct.
- 5. Sales Before and After Closing of Market.—No person shall offer for private or public sale in any part of the market any stock or thing before the hour of opening or after the hour of closing the market, nor upon any date not fixed by the Council as a day upon which the market will be open, without the sanction, in writing, of the Council, or Mayor thereof, or some person authorized by the Council in that behalf
- 6. Inspector.—There shall be appointed by the Council, if it deems necessary, an inspector for the said markets, whose duty shall be as follows:—
  - (a) To see that the regulations under this By-law, and provisions of the Local Government Acts relating to markets, are duly observed.
  - (b) To preserve order and regularity in the market.

    (c) To demand, receive, and collect in the name and on the behalf of the Council such sums of money as and for tolls and market dues as are for the time being appointed by special order of the Council to be demanded, received, and had in that behalf respectively, and in non-payment thereof respectively to levy the same by distress or to take proceedings before a justice in respect of the same or for the recovery of any penalty in respect of the selling, offering, or exposing for sale any animal or thing without payment of dues or tolls.

- 7. Interference with Inspector.—Any person wilfully resisting or obstructing or interfering with the inspector or his assistants in the discharge of his or their duties shall, independently of any penalty he or she may incur, for assault or otherwise, be deemed to have committed an offence against this By-law.
- 8. Payment of Ducs.—Any person placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls and dues accruing thereon, and all such tolls and dues chargeable under the special order of the Council for the time being in force shall be payable within 48 hours of the closing of the market unless a surety of One hundred pounds is furnished to the Council, when the account shall be raid fortistical. when the account shall be paid fortnightly,
- 9. Removal of Stock.—No stock shall be taken out of the market without the written authority of the auctioneer selling the same, and any person taking out of the market any such stock without the written authority shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 10. Stock Left in Market After Certain Hour to be Impounded.—Cattle, horses, asses, mules, sheep, or pigs left in the market after 9 o'clock a.m. on the day following a sale, and all bobby calves left in the market after 6 o'clock p.m. on the day of selected the left of selected the standard selected. the day of sale shall be impounded.
- 11. Method of Selling.—On the exhaustion of bidding on any lot, it shall be knocked down to the highest bidder: Provided that the owner of such lot, or his representative, shall. in all cases, have the right to reject the price bid, before the selling of the next lot shall have been completed, but not otherwise. In the event of the owner or his representatives rejecting the price as aforesaid, the lot shall be deemed to have been passed in as unsold; but in the event of the owner or his representative not notifying the auctioneer or selling agent of his refusal to accept the price bid, before the auctioneer shall have completed the sale of the next lot such bid shall be deemed to have been accepted by the owner.
- 12. Lots to be Drawn for Priority of Sale.—At 2.30 p.m. on the day preceding each cattle and sheep market, and at 11.55 a.m. on the day of each pig sale there shail be a drawing of lots by auctioneers desirous of selling in the market for priority of sale. In case any auctioneer shall be absent at the time of any draw, the inspector shall arrange for some person to draw for him. The inspector shall, as soon as

possible after the conclusion of each ballot for priority of sale, post a list in some conspicuous part of the market showing the names of the auctioneers in the several positions of priority. The inspector shall decide which stock are to be offered as fat stock, and his decision shall be final. He shall count all stock before allotting times to agents. Pens of sheep or lambs (excepting flock or stud rams) consisting of sheep or lambs (excepting flock or stud rams) consisting of less than ten head shall not be considered as a pen in allotting the selling time permitted to each agent. The inspector shall have full control over the allotments of pens, and his decision shall be final. shall be final.

13. Time Limit on Sales.—The following limit of times shall be allowed each auctioneer to offer the various classes of stock:-

Fat cattle—120 to the hour. Store cattle—240 to the hour. Dairy cattle—1½ minute per head. Fat sheep—1 minute per pen. Store sheep—2 minutes per pen. Fat pigs—250 head per hour. Store pigs—240 head per hour. Bobby calves—300 per hour.

Provided always that one hour shall be the limit of time permitted each auctioneer for selling each class of stock, and that under no circumstances shall the sale of bobby calves extend after midday. When the time allotted to any auctioneer has elapsed, the inspector shall sound a whistle at the pen where the auctioneer is selling. On finishing the lot under the hammer such auctioneer must cease selling. The inspector shall allow three minutes after one auctioneer ceases selling before another auctioneer commences.

14. Stock Brought to Market for Purpose of Sale.—All stock shall be yarded on the day of sale prior to the times shown below, otherwise such stock shall not be offered until all other stock of similar class have been offered:—

Fat Sheep-before 11 a.m. Store sheep—before 2 p.m. Cattle—before 11.30 a.m. Calves—before 10.30 a.m. Swine—before 11.45 a.m.

Provided always that if sufficient notice has been given to the inspector by an auctioneer of the late arrival of a stock train the inspector may, at his discretion, modify the time of receiving such stock.

15. Auctioneers Failing to Complete in Time Allotted .- In the event of any auctioneer failing to complete in the Allottea.—In the event of any auctioneer failing to complete his sales in the allotted time, he shall be allowed half time for the remainder of his stock; such time will be allotted for each class of stock after all auctioneers have completed the time allowed them for each such class, and the order of priority shall be the same

allowed them for each such class, and the order of priority shall be the same.

16. Auctioneers Not Proceeding On Time.—Any auctioneer not present and proceeding with his sale when his time arrived to commence selling shall, besides being guilty of a breach of this By-law, forfeit his priority of right to sell, and shall be placed at the foot of the list of auctioneers entitled to sell.

17. Disputes.—All disputes with reference to or affecting the time, order, and otherwise of conducting the sales in the market by the auctioneers shall be referred to the inspector,

time, order, and otherwise of conducting the sales in the market by the auctioneers shall be referred to the inspector, and his decision shall be final.

18. Vehicles and Stock Left in Yards.—No vehicles or stock will be permitted to remain in the main yard, except for the purpose of being offered for sale.

19. Gates Not to be Opened, &c.—No person shall remove any stock from one part of the market to another part of the market without the consent of the inspector, nor shall any person wilfully open any gate or lock or fastening of any gate, or open or break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, nor drive nails or tacks into the yard rails nor cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear or use any indecent language or be guilty of any indecent or gross conduct within the said market or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

20. Offences.—Any auctioneer or agent wilfully not proceeding with his sale as and at the time provided herein shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law. Any person offering stock for sale in the market which are not sold, who shall afterwards sell the same privately, and who fails to pay the proper dues, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

- 2. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter "Cattle"

asses, mutes, sucep, ewes, wetters, rams, ramos, goace and swine.

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Maffra.

"Township of Maffra" means any area for the time being defined and purporting to be the Township of Maffra defined and purporting to be the lownship of Maura in any official plan from time to time issued by the Department of Lands and Survey or other competent authority.

"Occupier" includes the owner or occupier of any land

ceupier" includes the owner or occupier of any land enclosed by a substantial fence within the Township of Maffra on which there is erected a building which is being bona fide and continuously occupied by such owner or occupier as a dwellinghouse and also includes the owner or occupier of any land enclosed by a substantial fence and outside the Township of Maffra but within the Shire of Maffra which said land is being hora fide and continuously occupied by land is being bona fide and continuously occupied by such owner or occupier.

In the case of two or more persons being joint owners or occupiers in respect of any land as aforesaid, only one of them shall for the purposes of this By-law be deemed an

5. The conditions, limitations, and restrictions applying to such registration as aforesaid shall be as follows:—

(a) An occupier whose land is situate within the Township of Maffra shall not register or have registered at any one time milking cows or milking heifers exceeding in all two in number, and such milking cows or milking heifers shall not during the period for which such registration is in force as aforefor which such registration is in force as aforesaid be seized for trespass as aforesaid by or under the direction of the Council or any of its officers for the purpose of impounding the same between the hours of eight o'clock in the forenoon and four o'clock in the afternoon of any day during and between any period commencing on the first day of April and ending on the thirtieth day of September following in any year and between the hours of seven o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock in the afternoon during and between any period commencing on the first day of October in any year and ending on the thirty-first day of March following.

(c) A muster of cattle registered as aforesaid shall be held once in each half year on a date or dates and at a place or places of which notice shall be given in a newspaper circulating in the Shire of Maffra and any occupier requiring re-registration for the half year thence following is required to present such cattle at the muster and complete such reregistration.

(f) In the event of an occupier desiring so to do, he may

(f) In the event of an occupier desiring so to do, he may with the consent of the Council or one of its officers appointed for the purpose cancel registration as to each head of cattle and substitute another for it during the unexpired term of such registration.

6. Notwithstanding anything herein appearing to the contrary, the Council reserves unto itself the right either generally or in particular cases to vary, restrict, or extend all or any of the provisions of this By-law.

7. This By-law shall come into operation on the first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three.

# SUPPLEMENTARY REGISTER OF MIDWIVES

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1942

Midwives Act 1928.

## NURSES BOARD.

N accordance with the provisions of the Midwives Act, the following copy of the Supplement to the Midwives Register as at 31st December, 1942, is hereby published.

Sections 14 (a) and 15 (1a) indicate that the midwife holds a certificate in midwifery from the Women's Hospital, Melbourne, or such other certificate as is approved by the Board.

Section 14 (b) indicates that the midwife had been in bona fide practice, in Australia or New Zealand, for at least two years prior to December, 1915.

Section 14 (b2) indicates that the midwife has been in bona fide midwifery practice, in some part of His Majesty's Dominions, for at least one year prior to December, 1915, and had passed such examinations as the Board requires.

Sections 14 (c) and 15 (1c) indicate that the midwife had completed the prescribed course of training and passed the prescribed examination.

Sections 15 and 16 (1) indicate that the midwife has been trained and registered in some part of His Majesty's Dominions in which there is in force an Act for the registration of midwives, or that she is enrolled or certificated by any Institution or Association in existence where the training and examination is in the opinion of the Board substantially equivalent to that prescribed under the Midwives Act, Victoria.

e . Section 16 (2) indicates that the midwife had passed an examination required by the Board or undergone supplementary training.

Section 3, Nurses Registration Act, and section 4, Nurses Acts, indicate that in a locality where a hospital approved by the Nurses Board under the Midwives Act for the training of midwives was not available, a woman, being a registered nurse, had, under the direction of a medical practitioner, attended in childbirth not less than 50 women, and had, in the presence of a medical practitioner, personally conducted not less than twenty cases of childbirth, and had passed the prescribed examination.
