PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, do hereby proclaim as a Township, under the designation of Betley, the Crown lands in the Parish of Dunolly comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Parish of Dunolly, County of Gladstone: Commencing on the left bank of Bet Bet Creek where the east boundary of allotment 31, section 2, Parish of Dunolly, abuts thereon; bounded thence by that boundary, a line, and a road bearing north to a point in line with the south boundary of allotment 23, section 1; by a line and a road bearing east 2,703 links: by a road and a line bearing south to Bet Bet Creek; and thence by that creek bearing south-westerly and north-westerly to the point of commencement.—(D.125 (5) (C.89184).

NATIONAL SECURITY (FEMALE MINIMUM RATES) REGULATIONS.

NOTICE.

IN pursuance of Regulation 5 of the above Regulations, the Minister of State for Labour and National Service has referred to the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration for inquiry and determination certain questions in respect of the vital industries and occupations within a vital industry specified in the Schedule hereto.

An employer or an organization of employers or of employees desiring to obtain leave to appear in pursuance of Regulation 7 of the above Regulations shall, on or before the 2nd day of September, 1944, file in the Registry of the said Court at the under-mentioned address, six copies of a submission in writing—

- (a) stating which vital industry or occupation within a vital industry with respect to which leave to appear is desired;
- (b) specifying and annexing the awards, orders, determinations, and industrial agreements in force on the 28th day of July, 1944, in respect of which the minimum rates of pay prescribed for females are alleged to be unreasonably low;
- (c) specifying the minimum rates (stating the respective amounts, classifications, and occupations in each case) which are alleged to be unreasonably low;

- (d) specifying the rates (stating the respective amounts, classifications, and occupations in each case and annexing the award, order, determination, or industrial agreement by which prescribed) in comparison with which it is alleged that the rates specified in accordance with paragraph (c) hereof are unreasonably low;
- (e) specifying the minimum rate or rates or the additional amount or amounts (stating in each case the classification and occupation) which it is submitted should be determined, pursuant to Regulation 5 (c) and the period in respect of which the rate or rates or amount or amounts should be paid;
- (f) setting out the facts and grounds upon which it is alleged—
- that leave to appear should be granted,
 - that the rates specified in accordance with paragraph (c) hereof are unreasonably low,
 - that the said rates are comparable with the rates specified in accordance with paragraph (d) hereof,
 - that it is in the national interest and fair and just to increase the rates specified in accordance with paragraph (c) hereof;
- (g) the full name of the applicant and its address for service.

In clauses 11 (a), 13 (b), 13 (c), and 50 (a) for the words "School Leaving Honours" there shall be substituted the word "Matriculation".

In paragraph (ii) of sub-clause (c) of clause 13 for the words "8 or 6 points" there shall be substituted the words "8, 6, or 4 points."

Paragraph (iii) of sub-clause (c) of clause 13 shall be deleted.

Sub-clause (d) of clause 13 shall be deleted.

In sub-clause (e) of clause 13 the words "at the Honours stage" shall be deleted.

In sub-clause (g) of clause 13 after the words "The Board shall take into consideration" there shall be inserted the words "the number of times the candidates have presented for the Matriculation examination, and".

In the paragraph *Day Courses* in clause 39 the words "Applied Science" shall be substituted for the words "Applied Physics"; the word "Aeronautical" shall be inserted before the word "Automotive"; and the words "Public Analyst" shall be deleted.

In the paragraph *Evening Courses (Professional)* in clause 39 the word "(Analytical)" and the words "Public Analyst" shall be deleted.

Sub-clause (a) of clause 56 to be rescinded and remade as follows:—

56. (a) (i) If the Minister considers the circumstances warrant it, he may grant an allowance for maintenance up to £104 per annum to holders of Senior scholarships under clause 9 (a) or (b) or (c), to holders of Senior Technical scholarships under clause 34 (a) or (d), to holders of free places under clause 43 (a) or (b) or (c), and to holders of free places under clause 43 (d) who have been granted studentships in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate in order to undertake the first year of the course for the Degree of Bachelor of Education, provided that the allowance for maintenance to such students shall be reduced by the amount of the allowance granted under clause 25 of Regulation XV. (A), and may in addition grant an allowance up to £39 per annum to those holders of the scholarships and the free places named herein who, in the opinion of the Director, are required to live away from home.

(ii) In consideration of any allowance granted under paragraph (i) of this sub-clause, the Minister may require all such holders of scholarships and free places to serve the State for three years after the completion or cessation of their University or Technical School courses.

Amend clause 57 by deleting sub-clause (a) and by making the present sub-clauses (b), (c) and (d), (a), (b), and (c) respectively.

In sub-clause (d) (hereafter to be known as sub-clause (c)) of clause 57 for the words—

"The allowances mentioned in sub-clauses (a) and (b)" there shall be substituted the words—

"The allowance mentioned in sub-clause (a)".

In clause 5 of Schedule I, of Schedule III, and of Schedule IV., after the word "female" delete the word "and" and substitute the words—

"who after commencing service as a teacher",

and to the end of the clause in each case add the following words:—

"And provided further that, if the student is a female who either before the termination of the course of training and study or after the expiration thereof but before commencing service as a teacher resigns or retires in order to marry, the sum other than the amount of any advances payable by such student to the Minister under this clause shall, if the Minister so directs, be reduced by an amount equal to one-seventh part of such sum".

- (1) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of manufacturing or preparing carbon dioxide or other industrial gases for trade or sale in gas, liquid or solid form.
- (2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of four members and a chairman, two of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and two as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of manufacturing or preparing carbon dioxide or other industrial gases for trade or sale in gas, liquid or solid form.

Also that such Wages Board may, in any Regulation, Determination, Order, instrument or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Industrial Gases Board, and the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

And the Honorable Thomas Tuke Hollway, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
