ASSISTANT GEOLOGIST, CLASS "C," PROFESSIONAL DIVISION, DEPARTMENT OF WATER SUPPLY.

APPLICATIONS will be received by the Public Service Board from persons, who are eligible and qualified, for appointment to the above-mentioned position.

Yearly Salary.—£449, minimum; £579, maximum, plus £24 cost of living adjustment. The rates are subject to variation in accordance with the rise or fall in the index numbers of the cost of living.

Duties.—To carry out, under direction, the field work associated with the geological examination of sites for water supply dams, and to prepare plans showing geological features. To identify rock and other strata and carry out the necessary laboratory work associated with rock and clay mineral classification. To make comprehensive surveys of underground water resources and to investigate subsoil conditions affecting drainage problems in irrigation districts.

Public Service Act 1928 (No. 3757), Section 66.

THE Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, hereby repeals Chapter III. of the Public Service Regulations, and makes the following Regulations, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

CHAPTER III.

APPOINTMENT OR TRANSFER TO THE CLERICAL DIVISION.

1. The Board shall give, in the *Government Gazette*, two calendar months' clear notice of every examination for appointment to the Clerical Division.

2. Applications must be lodged with the Board at least one calendar month before the first day of examination.

3. A candidate for appointment to the Clerical Division must, on the first day of December in the year in which an examination is held, be between the ages of fifteen and twenty-one years, and must forward to the Board an application, in his own handwriting, on the prescribed form, stating his full name and address, the date and place of his birth, the subjects for which he is entering and the place at which he desires to be examined, together with a certificate satisfactory to the Board of his good moral character and industrious habits. Provided that the above-mentioned provision with regard to age shall not apply to a discharged serviceman.

4. An officer of the General Division who is a candidate must furnish a certificate of good conduct and health from the Permanent Head of his Department.

5. A candidate shall be required to enter for competitive examination in Handwriting and in three of the following subjects as prescribed for the Matriculation Examination and the School Leaving Examination of the University of Melbourne, viz:—

Matriculation Subjects.—English Expression, English Literature, Languages other than English (not more than two may be taken), Pure Mathematics, Calculus and Applied Mathematics, General Mathematics (provided that General Mathematics may not be taken with either Pure Mathematics or Calculus and Applied Mathematics), Physics, Chemistry, Geology, Geography, Botany, Animal Biology, Agricultural Science, Greek and Roman History, European History, British History (not more than two History subjects may be taken), Economics.

School Leaving Subjects.—English, Languages other than English (not more than two may be taken), Mathematics I., II., III., IV. (one, two, or three in number, but not more, may be taken, provided that Mathematics I. may not be taken with either Mathematics II. or Mathematics III.), Physics, Chemistry, Geography, Geology, Biology (provided that Biology may not be taken with either Botany or Animal Biology), Botany, Animal Biology, Greek and Roman History, European History, British History (not more than two History subjects may be taken), Agricultural Science, Commercial Principles, Commercial Practice, Economics, Drawing.

Provided that a candidate may elect to enter for competitive examination in either four or five of the Matriculation or School Leaving subjects prescribed herein, in which case, if he passes in more than three of such subjects, only the three subjects, in which he obtains the highest number of marks shall be counted in determining his aggregate of marks.

A candidate may not enter for the same subject at both the Matriculation and the School Leaving standards.

The maximum number of marks that may be awarded to a candidate shall be:—

Matriculation subjects	..	150 each.
School Leaving subjects	..	100 each.
Handwriting	..	80.

The minimum number of marks required in order to obtain a pass in each subject of examination shall be as determined (a) in the case of Matriculation subjects, by the University of Melbourne, and (b) in the case of Handwriting and School Leaving subjects, by the examiners. Provided that, in any case where a candidate has been passed by either of the two examiners in any subject of the School Leaving examination for which he has entered in accordance with these regulations, he shall be deemed to have obtained a pass in such subject.

In determining the aggregate of marks of any candidate, the marks to be counted in any School Leaving subject shall be the average of the marks awarded by the two examiners in such subject.

The marks obtained by candidates in Matriculation subjects shall be standardized in such manner as determined by the Board.

The marks in any subject in which a candidate fails to obtain a pass shall not be counted in determining his aggregate of marks.

No candidate shall be included in the number to be selected for appointment—

- (a) unless he obtains a pass in Handwriting and in at least three of the Matriculation or School Leaving subjects for which he has entered, and
- (b) unless he is recorded by the University of Melbourne as having passed the School Leaving Examination in English and either the School Leaving Examination in a branch of Mathematics or the School Intermediate Examination in Arithmetic or Mathematics B, or has passed such other examinations as may be deemed by the University of Melbourne as equivalent thereto.

6. The Registrar of the University shall, as soon as practicable after an examination has been held, forward to the Board a return showing the marks in each subject, and the total marks, obtained by every candidate.

7. Any person who is a discharged serviceman shall, if he obtains not less than the minimum number of pass marks in the required subjects of examination, be entitled, irrespective of age and in priority to all persons whomsoever, to be appointed to the Clerical Division.

8. The Board shall cause to be entered in the "Register of Qualified Candidates," in the order of their merit, the names of candidates qualified under the provisions of clause 7, and then, up to but not beyond the published number to be selected for appointment, the names of all other candidates who have passed the examination, including eligible officers of the General Division, provided that thirty per centum (30%) of the published number of places shall be reserved for candidates who, in addition to Handwriting, qualify in School Leaving subjects only, and provided further that, if the number of candidates who so qualify is less than thirty per centum (30%) of the number to be selected for appointment, the number of places reserved shall be reduced accordingly. If two or more successful candidates secure the same total number of marks, their order of merit shall be determined by the number of marks awarded to them in Handwriting, and if these numbers are the same, then by the number of marks in the Matriculation or School Leaving subject in which each of them obtained the highest marks, and, if these numbers are also the same, then by lot.

9. Every candidate who is included in the number selected for appointment, or who is qualified under the provisions of clause 7, shall furnish the Board, within seven days after being required so to do, with a properly certified extract of his birth entry from some official register of births, or other evidence of age satisfactory to the Board, and also a certificate from the Government Medical Officer of sound bodily health and freedom from any physical defect likely to impair his efficiency in the performance of clerical duties.

10. The name of a candidate shall be removed from the "Register of Qualified Candidates"—

- (a) for failure to comply with the provisions of these regulations;
- (b) on his nomination for appointment by the Board; or
- (c) on his attaining the age of twenty-two years—unless he is an officer in the General Division who has served two years in such Division, and who, if appointed after the 1st December, 1912, is not more than thirty years of age, or unless he is a discharged serviceman.

11. In these Regulations "discharged serviceman" means a discharged serviceman as defined in the *Discharged Servicemen's Preference Act 1943*.

STATE COAL MINE INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNAL.

AWARD No. 67 OF 11TH AUGUST, 1944.

Relating to Rates of Pay of Certain Workers at the State
Coal Mine, Wonthaggi.

THE State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *State Coal Mine Industrial Act 1932* (No. 4030), and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

1. That adult male workers included in Part III. of the Schedule to the Act (except those for whom weekly rates are prescribed) shall be paid an adult minimum wage of 17s. 4d. per day when working on a basis of twelve shifts a fortnight, 18s. 11d. per day when working on a basis of eleven shifts a fortnight, and 20s. 10d. per day when working on a basis of ten shifts a fortnight, and in addition the margins prescribed in the appropriate awards in operation.
2. That in lieu of the rates prescribed for workers in the under-mentioned grades in Award No. 66, the following rates shall be substituted, viz:—

RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

AWARD No. 81 OF 4TH AUGUST, 1944.

Relating to Certain Conditions of Employment.

THE Railways Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *Railways Act 1928* (No. 3759), hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

That Award No. 8 be varied as set out hereunder:—

DIVISION 8.—OVERTIME.

By inserting at the end of sub-clause (a) of clause 1 the following proviso:—

“Provided that, for the purpose of calculating overtime on a daily basis, any time worked on any shift by a Guard (Class 2) Goods (or by any employee who may carry out the duties of such Guard on any shift) after ten hours on duty (including travelling, waiting, walking, and/or interval time) shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half up to twelve hours and double time thereafter.”

DIVISION 12.—TRAVELLING AND WAITING TIME.

(1) By inserting at the end of clause 4 the following proviso:—

“Provided that any Guard (Class 2) Goods, travelling as a passenger for part of any shift during which he also works as such Guard, shall for the actual time so travelling as a passenger be paid his ordinary rate of wage up to a maximum of one day's pay.”

(2) By deleting clauses 6 and 6A and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

"6. (a) The following members of the permanent way track force shall commence and finish their track duties at the prescribed hours at their respective tool sheds:—

- (i) Gangers, Class 1 (Metropolitan Yard lengths as constituted from time to time), and members of their gangs.
- (ii) Gangers, Class 3, and members of their gangs in the suburban area on lengths under 4 miles, and also Gangers and members of their gangs on shift work in the Melbourne Yard.
- (iii) Gangers and members of their gangs outside the suburban area on lengths under 2 miles.

(b) The following members of the permanent way track force shall be allowed the time immediately following the prescribed hour of commencing their track duties and also immediately preceding the prescribed hour of finishing such duties as set out hereunder:—

- (i) Gangers, Class 2, and members of their gangs in the suburban area (but outside Metropolitan Yard lengths as constituted from time to time)—

On lengths under 8 miles ... 10 minutes
On lengths 8 miles and over ... 12 minutes

- (ii) Gangers, Class 3, and members of their gangs in the suburban area on lengths of 4 and under 5 miles—10 minutes.

(c) Gangers, Class 3, and members of their gangs in the suburban area on lengths of 5 miles and over; and Gangers and members of their gangs outside the suburban area on lengths 2 miles and over shall—

- (i) Commence their track duties at the prescribed time at the point of the length at which they would, in the ordinary course of such duty, mount a track vehicle, or, if it is the employee's custom to enter upon the railway at a point outside his own length at the end of such length nearest to that point; and
- (ii) finish such duties as follows:—

If the work point be—
within the length—at the work point;
outside the length—at the nearest point on the length—
earlier than the prescribed time of finishing such duties to the extent shown in the following scale:—

(d) A member of the permanent way track force performing patrol duties on any length shall commence such duties at the prescribed hour at which he is obliged, in the ordinary course of such duties, to enter the length and shall finish such duties as prescribed for his length under sub-clauses (a) or (b) or (c) (whichever is applicable) of this clause.

(e) (i) For the purpose of this clause all lengths shall be fixed by the Commissioners.

(ii) The mileage of any length shall be deemed to be the maximum distance between any two points within such length.

(iii) Travel on duty outside such lengths shall be done in departmental time (in addition to any time allowed under sub-clauses (b) and (c) hereof).

6A. (a) Any employee camped out and required to travel to or from his point of work shall do so in his own time up to the distances shown in the second column of the table hereunder.

If the distance between the camp and the work be greater than that specified in the said second column he shall be allowed the time shown in the third column of the said table immediately following the prescribed time of commencing, and also immediately preceding the prescribed time of finishing duty:—

Means of Travel between the Camp and the Work.	Distance between the Camp and the Work (to be travelled in the Employee's own Time).	Time Allowance for Travelling any Distance exceeding that shown in the Preceding Column at the rate of—

(b) In column 3 of the table—

Each additional mile shall be calculated as under:—

Any portion of a mile less than half a mile shall be disregarded and half a mile or more shall be regarded as a mile.

Any portion of a half-mile less than a quarter of a mile shall be disregarded, and one-quarter of a mile up to half a mile shall be regarded as half a mile.

BRIDGEWATER WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1944.

THE Bridgewater Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Seventeen pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Bridgewater Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than lands on which there is no building), be less than Fifty-one shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building be less than Fifteen shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1944, and shall be payable on the 30th day of August, 1944, at the office of the said Trust.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 10,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

BY-LAW No. 147.

Regulating the Conduct of Persons at or within Chelsworth Park.

A By-law of the City of Heidelberg, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1928, sections 197 (1) (xiii), 767, and 228, and numbered 147, for altering and amending By-law No. 105 for regulating the conduct of persons at or within the Chelsworth Park.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. That insofar as clause 3, By-law 105, prohibits any person bringing a horse into the city reserves, that clause shall not hereafter apply to that portion of Chelsworth Park between the Ivanhoe Golf Links and the River Yarra.

2. Between the hours of sunrise and sunset, any person may ride but not otherwise bring a horse into that part of the Chelsworth Park described in clause 1 hereof, for the purpose of riding exercise and enjoyment only, and shall conduct such exercises in a careful and reasonable manner without damage to Council property, and having in mind the enjoyment and safety of other equestrians or pedestrians using the park.

3. It shall be competent for any officer of the Heidelberg City Council or any honorary inspector or vigilance officer appointed by the Council or any police constable to direct any rider forthwith to desist from any rough or dangerous riding or practices he considers dangerous to the public. Should any rider fail to comply immediately with such direction he may be ordered to leave the park.

4. Any rider failing to comply with direction to desist shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, similarly any rider failing to comply with an order to leave the park shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable for a first offence to a penalty of not more than £5, and for a second or subsequent offence to a penalty of not more than £20.
