PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria hereunder described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be

unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*:—

CONSTITUTION OF MEAT AREAS.

PROCLAMATION

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, NORMAN A. BY-LAW No. 4136.—URBAN DISTRICT SUPPLIED WITH WATER FROM THE COLIBAN SYSTEM OF WATERWORKS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District supplied with water from the Coliban system of waterworks, for the supply of water for domestic purposes:—

A Regulation of the City of South Melbourne, numbered 360, made under section 26 of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1928*, in force in the city by virtue of a By-law of the said city, numbered 311, for amending Regulation 335 of the said city.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the Regulation and order as follows:—

1. That Regulation No. 335 of the said city shall be amended as follows:—

(a) For section 5 there shall be substituted the following section:—

“5. Every crossing across or over any footway shall be built or constructed to such level, inclination, and shape as the city engineer directs.”

(b) For paragraph (c) of “The Schedule of Specifications of Crossings” there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(c) *Kerbing of Crossings.*

Notwithstanding anything contained in clauses (a) and (b) of this Schedule:—

(i), within the factory area of the Municipal District of the City of South Melbourne as defined by the Building By-laws of the city—bluestone kerbing only shall be used in the building or construction of open-pitched or open concrete crossings.

(ii) within all other areas of the Municipal District of the City of South Melbourne—bluestone kerbing only shall be used in the building or construction of open-pitched or open concrete crossings in any street in which bluestone kerbing exists at or adjacent to the site of the crossing.”

(c) For the words “City Surveyor” wherever occurring there shall be substituted the words “City Engineer.”

(a) The area bounded on the north by Spring-street; on the south by Autumn-street; on the east by Bailey-street; and on the west by Francis-street; and being Pinnacle Estate and Kinnon's subdivision.

(b) The area bounded on the north by Spring-street; on the south by the southern boundary of the Mont Bel Estate; on the east by Francis-street; and on the west by Torquay-road.

(c) The area bounded on the north by Dorothy-avenue; on the south by Settlement-road; on the east by Torquay-road; and on the west by Prince's Highway.

(d) The area bounded by a line commencing at a point being the north-east angle of lot 18 of the Bona Vista Estate; thence south-westerly by the Prince's Highway to its junction with Colac-grove west at the southern point of lot 41 of the Premier Estate; thence northerly by Colac-grove west and a line being a northerly continuation of the eastern side of Colac-grove west to West-street; and by West-street to its junction with Laura-avenue; thence east by Laura-avenue to the point of commencement.

(e) The area bounded by a line commencing at a point being the junction of White-street and West-street; thence west by White-street and a line being a westerly continuation of White-street to the intersection of such line with Kardinia Creek; northerly by Kardinia Creek to its intersection with Barrabool-road; thence north-easterly and easterly by the Barrabool-road to its intersection with McKenzie-street; thence south by McKenzie-street to Mt. Pleasant-road; thence west by Mt. Pleasant-road to its intersection with Roberts-road; thence south by Roberts-road to its intersection with Roslyn-road; thence west by Roslyn-road to its intersection with West-street; thence south by West-street to the point of commencement.

2. No persons shall use or permit to be used any land or building or erect (or adapt for use) any building within the above described area for the purpose of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement, without the written consent of the Council.

3. Any person who wilfully offends against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £20.
