PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 5033. "An Act to continue the operation of certain Provisions of the Stamps Acts relating to the Imposition of Increased Stamp Duties on certain Instruments."

No. 5034. "An Act to make provision with respect to the Exchange of certain Land in the Township of Maribyrnong for certain other Land at Ashburton."

No. 5035. "An Act to further amend Part IV. of the *Financial Emergency Act 1931*."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of November, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and forty-four, and in the eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion

thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the council of the municipal district hereinafter mentioned has requested that the portions of such district enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire district: And whereas a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal district shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly:—

SOUTHERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Bellarine, Parish of Bellarine, County of Grant: Commencing at the most northerly angle of Crown allotment 12, no section, Parish of Bellarine; thence south-easterly by the boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the most southerly angle of allotment 13; thence south-westerly by a road to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 17 of section II.; thence easterly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence southerly by the western boundary of allotment 17 and a line to the north-western angle of allotment 47 of section II.; thence westerly by the southern boundary of a road and a line in production thereof to a road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 5n, no section; thence southerly by the road last mentioned to a road forming the northern boundary of allotment 4 of section IV.; thence westerly by the road last mentioned to a point in line with the eastern boundary of allotment 3, no section; thence northerly by the boundary last mentioned and a line to the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay; thence generally in a north-easterly direction by the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay to the point of commencement.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 41.

1. The Maryborough Waterworks Trust, hereinafter referred to as "the Trust," in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the Trust within the Maryborough Urban District within the Maryborough Waterworks District, and the By-law No. 40 is hereby revoked.

2. This By-law shall come into operation at such time as the Trust from time to time directs by notice published in a newspaper circulating generally within the urban district, and cease to have operation at such time as the Trust from time to time directs by notice so published.

3. No person shall use or permit or suffer to be used or allowed to run any water supplied by the Trust for other than domestic purposes, manufacturing, or fire-fighting purposes, or use a hose for other than fire-fighting purposes.

4. Any person who shall use, or permit, or suffer water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

5. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongly does, or causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water, as provided by the Water Acts.

TONGALA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1945.

THE Tongala Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and three pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Tongala Urban District. Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than One pound four shillings (£1 4s.), and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1945, and shall be payable on the 15th day of January, 1945, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Six pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust. The charge for the supply for watering gardens shall be One pound per tenement.

For water supplied from standpipe or hydrant, the charge for every 1,000 gallons or portion of same to be at the rate of Two shillings and six pence per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum of six pence for any one tank or load.

Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste, or who uses it in an unauthorized manner, or who does not supply a meter

when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises the owner or occupier must pay the sum of One pound to be reconnected to the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of eight (8) o'clock p.m. and six (6) o'clock a.m.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purposes are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

SHIRE OF ELTHAM.

BY-LAW No. 24.

Residential By-law.

A By-law of the Shire of Eltham, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and particularly under and with reference to section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 24, for the purpose of declaring the area prescribed in the Schedule of this By-law a Residential Area.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Eltham, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout that portion of the Shire of Eltham described in the Schedule of this By-law.

2. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

3. No land or erection or building or buildings adapted for the purpose within the prescribed areas shall be used for the purpose of carrying on any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement: Provided always and notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained any person may use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building in any portion of any residential area described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of a school or private hospital, or may use any dwelling-house for the purpose of carrying on the practice, profession, or business of a solicitor, doctor, dentist, architect, or music teacher: Provided further that this By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, re-building, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, re-building, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership, or for such other purpose as the Council thinks reasonable in the circumstances.

4. In the case of any building, erection, or construction, erected, constructed, maintained, continued, or used contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, either in whole or in part, or in case of any work or act to which any of such provisions may apply, begun, done, or omitted in contravention of any of such provisions:—

- (a) The Council may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building, erection, or construction a notice, in writing (the first notice), which may be signed by the municipal clerk on behalf of the Council, requiring such owner or builder, on such day as shall be specified in such notice, being not less than fourteen days from the date of service of such notice, to attend personally, or by an agent duly authorized in that behalf, before the Council, on such day and at such time and place as shall be specified in such notice, to show sufficient cause why such building, erection, or construction should not be pulled down or removed.
- (b) If such owner or builder fail to attend as aforesaid, or in the opinion of the Council, fail to show sufficient cause why such building, construction, or erection should not be pulled down or removed, the Council shall give the owner or builder a second notice, in writing, informing him accordingly, and (notwithstanding any proceedings taken for the imposition or recovery of any penalty), it shall be lawful for the Council through its Surveyor, with a sufficient number of workmen, after a period of fourteen days from the service of the second notice, to demolish and pull down the said building, erection, or construction, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purposes, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and the Council, in its discretion, may sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit, and may reimburse itself from the proceeds of such sale.
- (c) Any expenses incurred by the Council and Surveyor, or either of them, in demolishing and pulling down the said building, or erection, or construction, or any part or parts thereof, or in removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof, may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale.

5. Notwithstanding any action taken or not taken under the last preceding clause, and apart from and in addition thereto, any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for each day on which the offence is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after a conviction or order of any court (as the case may be). This penalty is in addition to any penalty, not exceeding £20, that may be, and is hereby authorized to be, imposed under section 222 of the *Local Government Act 1928*.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 7 (COUNTRY SHOP ASSISTANTS).

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State *outside and excepting* the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the *Factories and Shops Act* 1928 (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portion of the City of Sandringham as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in or in connexion with a shop as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter," has made the following Determination, viz.:—

1. That as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 5th October, 1944, the last Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination as to the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in or in connexion with a shop as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter, but not including persons subject to the Determinations of the—

Shops Board No. 4 (Butchers, Country).

Shops Board No. 6 (Chemists).

Shops Board No. 13 (Fuel and Fodder, Country), or the

Hotel and Restaurant Board.

OVERTIME.

4. The rate of time and a half shall be paid for all work done—

- (a) Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work;
 (b) Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 46 hours in any week.

TIME WAGES.

5. Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours of an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three per centum, and for each hour worked beyond the one-half aforesaid shall be paid the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rate for an ordinary week's work.

SPECIAL RATES.

6. All work done on Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Saturday (except in localities in which the late trading night is observed on a Saturday), Easter Monday, and the days on which Australia Day, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day are observed as public holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

ANNUAL LEAVE.

7. (a) Any employee on the completion of each twelve months' service with an employer shall be granted twelve consecutive working days annual leave, exclusive of the Holidays mentioned in clause 6, on full pay, and such leave shall be given within three months of the completion of each such twelve months' service.

- (b) Any employee who leaves or is dismissed for any reason other than for a misdemeanour, after having completed not less than six months' service during the first twelve months' qualifying period of service with an employer, shall in lieu of annual leave be given one half days' pay for each complete month of service with such employer.

- (c) Any employee who leaves or is dismissed for any reason other than for a misdemeanour after having completed one or more years of service with an employer but before having completed a further full qualifying twelve monthly period of service with such employer shall, in lieu of annual leave for that period, be given one days' pay for each complete month of service during such further qualifying twelve monthly period.

SICK PAY.

8. (a) Any employee not attending for duty shall lose his or her pay for the actual time lost unless such employee has had not less than twelve months' service with the same employer, and he or she produces or forwards within twenty-four hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health or accident for more than six days in each year.

- (b) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clause (a) hereof, if the full period of sick leave as prescribed above is not taken in any year, such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding 18 days, which shall be the maximum amount of leave to which an employee may be entitled in any year of service without deduction of pay.

MIDDAY MEAL.

9. An interval of one hour shall be allowed for the midday meal between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m.

GARMENT ALLOWANCE.

10. Any employee who wears, when at work, a washable outer-garment, the laundering of which is not paid for by the employer, shall be paid 3s. per week in addition to the ordinary wage. Such laundering shall be done in the town in which is situated the shop or branch shop at which the employee works.

BICYCLE ALLOWANCE.

11. Where an employee is required to use his or her own bicycle in connection with the business of an employer, he or she shall be entitled to an allowance of sixpence, for each day or part thereof upon which he or she is so required to use such bicycle.

PAYMENT OF WAGES.

12. Wages shall be paid not later than Thursday in each week, and must be paid during working hours.

REFERENCE.

13. An employee, on severing his or her connexion with an employer, shall be entitled to and shall receive from such employer a reference in writing, stating his or her period of service and qualifications.

TRANSFER OF EMPLOYEE.

14. Where any employer transfers an employee from one township to another, the employer shall be responsible for and shall pay the whole of the moving expenses, including fares and transport charges, for the employee and his family.

TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

15. Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

RENT OF RESIDENCE.

16. The employer shall not charge any manager or assistant who resides on the premises in connexion with the shop in which the business of such employer is carried on a greater sum as rent for such premises than 10s. per week.

TIME AND WAGES RECORD.

17. The employer shall keep a time and wages record showing the name of each worker, the number of hours worked each week, and the wages and overtime paid each week. Such record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Federation of Australia or of the Victorian Storekeepers' Association.

DETERMINATION TO BE AVAILABLE.

18. A copy of this Determination shall be kept in a conspicuous place on each floor of a building in which work covered by this Determination is done. Such Determination shall be readily available for inspection at any time.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 23 (ELECTRICAL AND RADIO GOODS).

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District and the Geelong District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and the Order in Council thereunder extending such Metropolitan District, such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included within the said Metropolitan District, the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Warrnambool, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

On the 18th May, 1932, the Shops Board No. 18 (Miscellaneous Shops) was deprived of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the business of a seller of—

(a) Electrical goods;

(b) Wireless (radio) sets, parts, or accessories;

and such power was conferred exclusively on the Shops Board No. 23 (Electrical and Radio Goods).

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the business of a seller of—

(a) Electrical goods;

(b) Wireless (radio) sets, parts, or accessories"—

has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 7th October, 1944, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

Time and a half shall be paid for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Melbourne Cup Day (Metropolitan District only), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or after 12.30 p.m. on Show Day (in localities mentioned in the *Public Service Act 1928*). If any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the abovenamed holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

8. Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

ALLOWANCE.

9. When, in conformity with the custom of the trade, an employee wears, when at work, a washable outer garment the laundering of which is not paid for by the employer, such employee shall be paid 2s. 6d. per week in addition to the ordinary rate.

TEA MONEY.

10. Any employee whose weekly rate is not more than 121s. who is required to work overtime in excess of two hours on any one day, shall receive an allowance of 2s. 6d. as tea money in addition to the rates provided in Clause 6.

NOTICE TO WORK OVERTIME.

11. At least 24 hours' notice shall be given when overtime is required to be worked.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RATION.

12. Where an employer, owing to slackness of trade, desires to ration his employees, he shall give at least 24 hours' notice to each employee of his intention to ration such employee.

ANNUAL LEAVE.

13. Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted, in each year, annual leave on full pay (exclusive of the holidays mentioned in Clause 7), as shown hereunder, viz. :—

On completing 1st year's service	Six consecutive working days
„ 2nd year's service	Twelve consecutive working days
„ each additional year's service	Twelve consecutive working days

Such leave shall be given within three months of the completion of each year's service.

Should the services of an employee, who has served at least twelve months with the same employer, be terminated at any time thereafter he shall be entitled to *pro rata* holidays on full pay, but, should such employee be dismissed at any time for misconduct, he shall not be entitled to any such *pro rata* holidays.

SICK PAY.

14. (a) Any employee not attending for duty who has had not less than twelve months' service with the same employer shall lose his or her pay for the actual time lost unless such employee produces or forwards within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health or accident for more than six days in each year.

(b) If the full period of sick leave as proscribed above is not taken in any year, such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding eighteen days, which shall be the maximum amount of leave to which an employee may be entitled in any year of service without deduction of pay.

TIME AND WAGES RECORDS.

15. An employer shall keep time and wages records showing the name of each employee, the hours worked each week by, and the wages and overtime paid to each employee.

PAYMENT OF WAGES, ETC.

16. Payment of all wages, overtime, special rates, and allowances due, shall be made during working hours not later than Thursday each week.

REFERENCE.

17. An employee, on severing his or her connexion with an employer, shall be entitled to and shall receive from such employer a reference in writing, stating his or her period of service and qualifications. This provision shall only apply in the case of an employee who has been employed continuously for three months or more.

TRANSPORT ALLOWANCE.

18. (a) When an employee, by arrangement with his employer, uses his own car in the service of the employer he shall be paid an allowance of not less than 4d. per mile; provided that the total allowance payable shall not be less than 40s. per week and shall not exceed 20s. for any one day or £3 for any one week.

(b) When an employee, by arrangement with his employer, uses his own motor cycle or motor cycle and side-car in the service of the employer he shall be paid an allowance of not less than 2d. per mile; provided that the total allowance payable shall not be less than 15s. per week and shall not exceed 7s. 6d. for any one day or 30s. for any one week.

(c) Where a bicycle is provided by an employee and is required to be used in connexion with his employer's business, an allowance of 3s. 6d. per week in addition to the ordinary wage shall be paid to such employee.

POSTING OF DETERMINATION.

19. A copy of this Determination shall be kept posted at or near the entrance to any shop or place to which it applies.
