Forests Act 1928 (No. 3685).

"PROCLAIMED PERIOD" AND "PROCLAIMED AREAS"
WHERE SERIOUS DANGER FROM FIRES EXISTS.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Forests Commission with respect to the period of twelve months commencing on the fifteenth day of January, 1944, has reported to the Minister of Forests that, owing to climatic conditions, serious danger of fire exists in the parts of Victoria specified in the schedule hereunder: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare—

- (a) The period from the eighteenth day of January, 1944, to the fifteenth day of March, 1944, both days inclusive, to be a "proclaimed period," and
- (b) the areas of Victoria specified in the schedule hereunder to be "proclaimed areas."

SCHEDULE.

Such parts of the counties enumerated hereunder as—

- (1) Are not situate in a city or in a town, or in a township of more than one thousand inhabitants: and
- (2) are not Mallee country within the meaning of the *Land Act 1928*.

Cronjngolong. Dargo. Tambo.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-four, and in the eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Sixth.

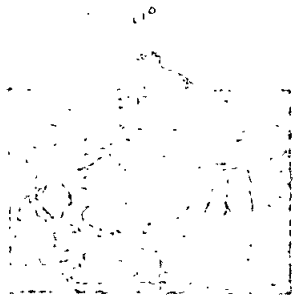

DETERMINATION OF THE INDUSTRIAL APPEALS COURT.

IN THE INDUSTRIAL APPEALS COURT:

IN THE MATTER of a Determination of the Ice Board published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of Tuesday, 23rd November, No. 225 of 1943, at page 2859

and

IN THE MATTER of an Appeal against certain provisions of the said Determination.

(Before His Honour Judge Stretton, Mr. C. H. Grant, and Mr. J. V. Stout.)

Friday the 24th day of December, 1943.

HAVING HEARD the abovementioned Appeal THIS COURT DOETH ORDER AND DETERMINE that the abovementioned Determination be amended in the manner following:—

1. That for clause 4 (b) of the said determination there shall be substituted the following:—

“Employees not on shift-work shall work ordinary hours between the times appearing hereunder:—

The ordinary hours of shift-workers shall be those prescribed by clause 4 (a).”

2. There shall be inserted in the said Determination the following provision:—

“The employer shall fix the starting and finishing times for each employee and shall not alter either of such times unless he shall have given the employee one week's notice of the altered time or times.”

3. That for clause 4 (c) there shall be substituted the following:—

“The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by an employee—

(i) before or after his shift;

(ii) outside the times of starting and finishing work or more than 8 hours within those times on full days or 4 hours on half days;

shall be time and a half.”

4. The foregoing amending provisions shall come into force on the 7th day of January, 1944.

STATE OF VICTORIA.

GLASS PROTECTION ORDER.

ORDER No. 54.

WHEREAS by Regulation 35A of the Commonwealth National Security (General) Regulations it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Premier of any State may, after consultation with the Minister of State for Home Security or an officer of the Department of Home Security authorized by that Minister to act on his behalf and with the Commander of a Lines of Communication Area or an officer authorized by the Minister of State for the Army to act on behalf of such Commander, by Order make such provision as he deems necessary to protect the persons and property of the civil population in that State or any part thereof in case of emergency:—

Now therefore I, Albert Arthur Dunstan, Premier of the State of Victoria, having duly held such consultations, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Glass Protection Order (Victoria) Citation No. 3.

2. The Glass Protection Order (Victoria) is amended by inserting after clause 1 the following clause:—

“1A. (1) During the continuance in operation of this clause none of the provisions of this Order (except this clause) shall have any force effect or operation.

(2) This clause shall continue in operation until such time as the Premier by notice published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* declares that this clause is no longer in operation.”
