*Land Act 1928.*

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 4185.—BACCHUS MARSH URBAN DIVISION WITHIN THE BACCHUS MARSH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, herein after referred to as "the Commission" in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following for preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the said Commission within the Bacchus Marsh Urban Division within the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply District:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Bacchus Marsh Urban Division within the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply District.

2. During the period commencing with the 22nd day of January, 1945, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1945, no person shall water any garden or other land in the said urban division between the hours of eight o'clock in the forenoon and six o'clock in the afternoon of the same day.

Provided, however, this clause shall not apply to any land vested in, controlled, or managed by any municipality within the said urban division.

3. Every person who shall use, or permit, or suffer water supplied by the Commission to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty, not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Commission.

4. If any person supplied with water by the Commission wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Commission may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof), close or 'cut off' any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Commission to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

THE TOWN OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.  
BY-LAW NO. 4.—PREVENTION OF THE WASTE AND UNDUE  
CONSUMPTION OF WATER.

THE Town of Horsham Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following, for the prevention of the waste and undue consumption of water supplied by the Trust within its district.

1. For the purposes of this By-law, the district supplied with water by the Trust is divided into a northern area and a southern area by a line commencing at a point on the western boundary of the said district situate due west of the centre of Baillie-street west, at its westerly end; and running thence in a due easterly direction to the centre of Baillie-street west, at its westerly end; and thence along the centre of Baillie-street west, Baillie-street, and Baillie-street east, to the eastern end of Baillie-street east; and thence in a due easterly direction to the eastern boundary of the said district.

2. During the period commencing at Three o'clock in the morning of the day following the day on which this By-law shall be published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, and ending at midnight on the thirtieth day of June, 1945 (hereinafter called "the said period"), no person shall:—

- (a) Water any garden or lawn in the said areas supplied by the Trust other than by means of a hose held in the hand, or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand.
- (b) Water any garden or lawn in the said northern area, except during the period of four hours commencing at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Tuesday, a Thursday, or a Saturday, or except during the period of two hours commencing at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Sunday.
- (c) Water any garden or lawn in the said southern area, except during the period of four hours commencing at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Monday, a Wednesday, or a Friday, or except during the period of two hours commencing at 6.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Sunday.

3. No person shall use, or permit, or suffer water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

4. Any person authorized by the Trust in that behalf either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case, may at all reasonable times:—

- (a) Enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting, or may inspect any private service, or any part thereof, or any watering of gardens or lawns in course of execution therein or thereon, and/or
- (b) Enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of superintending the watering of any gardens or lawns in the course of execution therein or thereon, and may give to the owner or occupier of such premises, or any person engaged in executing such watering, any directions or instructions necessary for the purpose of ensuring that all relevant provisions of this By-law shall be duly complied with and observed during and in connexion with, the execution of such watering.

5. Any person who obstructs, hinders, impedes, resists, or opposes or refuses admission to any premises, or fails or neglects to carry out and observe all lawful directions and instructions given him by any person duly authorized in that behalf, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

6. Any person who is guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

7. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or permits, or causes anything to be done in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

Schedule as above, with full particulars, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom the samples will be shown and any information afforded to persons tendering.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, preferably by non-negotiable cheque payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board. The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender. Savings Bank deposit book, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the service may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for——" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. These conditions shall be deemed to include the specifications, and special conditions of tender and contract contained in the Schedule or appended thereto.

2. The contractor shall not sub-let any of the work to be performed under the contract and all such work shall be carried out in the registered factory of the contractor.

3. The contractor shall obtain the cotton duck from the Forests Commission of Victoria only and shall be responsible for the safety of the same. No other such material, whether of like quality or not, shall be used in the manufacture of the tents and flys. All the material supplied to the contractor by the said Commission shall be used solely in the manufacture of the tents and flys contracted for and the contractor shall be responsible for ensuring that such material, or any part thereof, shall not be used or disposed of for any other purpose whatsoever. The Tender Board may require the contractor to furnish a declaration to that effect on completion of the contract.

4. In the event of the said Commission being unable to supply the full quantity of cotton duck or of delay in the supply of same, the contractor shall not be entitled to nor claim any compensation for any damages or loss sustained by

him by reason of such failure or delay, but the contractor shall be granted an extension of time for delivery of the supplies contracted for equal to the period of such delay.

5. With the exception of the cotton duck, the contractor shall provide everything necessary for the due fulfilment of the contract.

6. The cotton duck supplied to the contractor by the said Commission shall be deemed to remain the property of the Government, provided that the contractor shall be entitled to payment at the contract rate for all tents and flys supplied and accepted under the contract and also to payment for any unused or surplus material returned to the said Commission as provided in clause 14 hereof.

7. The cotton duck will be delivered into contractor's store free of delivery charges on prepayment at the rate of 7s. 6d. per lineal yard net, free of sales tax.

8. All cotton duck supplied to the contractor by the said Commission other than that used in tents and flys manufactured, delivered and accepted in conformity with the contract, or any such material used in excess of the quantity per article stipulated by the contractor in his tender, or any used in the manufacture of rejected supplies shall, subject to the provisions of clause 14 of these conditions, be chargeable against the contractor at the additional rate of 3s. 9d. per lineal yard net, plus sales tax computed on the total rate of 11s. 3d. per lineal yard, and shall be recoverable as provided in clause 18 hereof.

9. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of the supplies will be made by the officer authorized to take delivery.

10. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the supplies have been approved of. If, after delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective supplies may be rejected.

11. Acceptance of supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of same. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any supplies objected to; but, in such event, he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the supplies.

12. The members of Boards of Survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the supplies are not of proper quality they shall be rejected and the survey fees and extra expenses (if any) shall be chargeable against the contractor and recoverable as provided in clause 18 hereof.

13. On rejection of any supplies, the contractor shall, at his own expense, forthwith remove such supplies from the government store at which they are lying. Until so removed, the rejected supplies will be held at the contractor's risk and expense.

14. (a) In the event of failure by the contractor to carry on the contract or on termination or completion of the contract, the contractor shall, on demand by the Tender Board, return forthwith to the said Commission, at his own expense, any unused or surplus material supplied him by the said Commission.

(b) Should such material be, in the opinion of the Tender Board, in as good order and condition as it was when supplied to the contractor, he shall be entitled to payment therefor at the price at which it was so supplied.

(c) Should, however, such material be, in the opinion of the Tender Board, not in as good order and condition as it was when supplied to the contractor, he shall be entitled to payment therefor at the price at which it was so supplied less the amount by which, in the opinion of the Tender Board, it has been depreciated.

15. A refusal to carry on the contract, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or failure to deliver them within reasonable time, of which the Tender Board shall be the sole judge, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount thereof shall be chargeable against the contractor and recoverable as provided in clause 18 hereof. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or failure, to terminate the contract forthwith and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

16. The contractor is not at liberty to transfer his contract under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. Should it be found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract and forfeit the security money.

17. Under no circumstances will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any damages, losses, and expenses which the Government may sustain or incur in consequence of such failure, and such damages, losses, and expenses shall be recoverable under the contract.

18. All damages, losses, and expenses incurred by the Government under the contract and chargeable against the contractor or stated in these conditions to be recoverable under the contract, may be deducted from any money that may then be due or may thereafter become due to the contractor or may have been deposited by him as security, and if the money then due or thereafter becoming due to the contractor or deposited by him as aforesaid is not sufficient for that purpose, the balance remaining unpaid shall be a debt due by the contractor to the Government and may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.

No. 57.—All that piece of land commencing at a point, the north-eastern intersection of the building lines of Albert and Sedgman streets; thence easterly along the northern building line of Albert-street a distance of 140 feet to Cross-street; thence along Cross-street for a distance of 465 feet; thence westerly a distance of 141 feet to the eastern building line of Sedgman-street; thence southerly along the eastern building line of Sedgman-street to the point of commencement.

Residential Areas.

A By-law made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and particularly under and with reference to sections 197-5-b and 228 of the Local Government Act 1928 and numbered 148, for amending By-laws 74 and 140 for prescribing residential areas.

1. SHIRE OF BENALLA.

By-Law No. 42.

A By-law of the Shire of Benalla, made under the provisions of Part VII., Division I., of the Local Government Act 1928, and section 26 of the Local Government Act 1934, and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, and numbered 42, for regulating traffic in that part of the Shire of Benalla within a radius of one mile from the Council Chambers, Benalla, prohibiting the leaving of motor cars or other vehicles standing in certain set parts of certain streets and roads and preventing obstructions to carriage ways and public places and generally for the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Police Offences Act 1928 and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Benalla order as follows:—

1. The driver of a motor car (other than a motor car of one the description referred to in clause 2 hereof) shall not leave his motor car standing attended or unattended in any street otherwise than in a position such that—

- (a) one front wheel of such car is not more than 3 feet from the kerb nearest to the front of such car; and
- (b) the said car is at an angle of 45 degrees to such kerb; and
- (c) in the case of a motor car left in any area where the Council has by white lines on the road surface delineated spaces for standing motor cars alongside the kerb of any street and at an angle of 45 degrees thereto, the said car is, if possible, entirely within one of the said spaces.

2. (i) The driver of any motor car which, together with the load thereon, is of an overall length of more than 20 feet or to which is attached any trailer shall not leave such motor car standing attended or unattended in any street otherwise than in a position that—

- (a) the said motor car is parallel to the kerb on the near side of such motor car; and
- (b) the said motor car is not more than 3 feet from the said kerb at any point on the near side.

(ii) The driver of any motor car to which a trailer is attached shall not leave such trailer standing in any street in such a position that any part thereof is further than 20 feet from the kerb on the near side of the said motor car.

3. The driver of any motor car shall not leave such motor car standing in any street on the same side as and within 20 feet of either side of the main entrance of the buildings and places mentioned in the Schedule hereto, save for the purpose of loading or unloading goods or taking up or setting down passengers if such car is left standing within 3 feet of the kerb.

4. The driver of any motor car shall not leave such car standing in any street—

- (a) at any place indicated by a notice of the Council erected or placed at or near such place prior to the 13th day of November, 1944, and notifying the prohibition of the standing of motor cars thereat.
- (b) Upon the same side of such street as and in front of any vehicular right of way, public or private, abutting on to such street.
- (c) Within 15 feet clear of the building line of any street intersection within the aforesaid area.

5. The driver of any motor car shall not leave such motor car standing in any of that part of Nunn-street, Benalla, being the western side of Nunn-street south of Bridge-street and being that section of Nunn-street, Benalla, between the Benalla Fire Brigade Station and Bridge-street, Benalla.

6. No person being an officer or employee of the Council or otherwise authorized by the Council shall remove or in any other manner interfere with any notice (including any standard or other erection supporting such notice) which has been fixed or placed by the Council upon any street or other public place or upon any verandah or other building.

7. No person not being an officer or employee of the Council or otherwise authorized by the Council shall affix any notice, sign, or other thing to any street or footway or erect, drive, or fix any post, spike, peg, or other thing upon or into any street or footway.

8. The driver of a motor car upon any street shall not, save for justifiable cause, leave such motor car unattended except if it is left in such a position as not to obstruct traffic.

9. Any contravention of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

10. Any person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout that part of the municipal district of the Shire of Benalla having a radius of one mile from the Council Chambers, situate in Nunn-street, Benalla.

12. The person next driving or taking charge of any motor car left unattended in any street shall, until the contrary is proved, be deemed to be the driver of such motor car within the meaning of clauses 1 to 6 hereof.

13. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Benalla. "Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle. "Motor car" means any vehicle propelled by mechanical power. "Street" means every street, highway, and road within the area of application of this By-law not less than 50 feet in width.

#### SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO, CLAUSE 3 HEREOF.

(a) The Benalla Shire Council Chambers situated in Nunn-street, Benalla.

(b) The Soldiers' Memorial Hall situated in Nunn-street, Benalla.

(c) Any garage within the area above mentioned from which petrol is served to the public out of any petrol pump.

The foregoing By-law, being No. 42 of the Shire of Benalla, was passed by the Council of the Shire of Benalla on the 9th day of October, 1944, and confirmed by the said Council by special order on the 13th day of November, 1944.

2. No person shall deposit, place, use, or spread or cause to be deposited, placed, used, or spread on any land within 200 yards of any hospital, church, public, or municipal building any manure, offal, blood, bone dust, or other offensive matter so that the smell therefrom shall be a nuisance to persons using such hospital, church, public, or municipal building.

3. This By-law shall operate through the Central Riding of the Shire of Benalla.
