EXEMPTIONS.

BY-LAW No. 4199.—RATES AND CHARGES FOR WATER.—URBAN DISTRICTS AND URBAN DIVISIONS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the respective Urban Districts and Urban Divisions as set out hereunder:—

Lands or tenements situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of such amount in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such lands or tenements as is set down in column 2 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the Schedule hereto: Provided that the total amount of the rate payable annually in respect of any such lands or tenements (other than land on which there is no building) shall be not less than the sum set down in column 3 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule and in respect of any such lands or tenements on which there is no building shall be not less than the sum set down in column 4 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1945, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1946, and shall be payable on the 2nd day of November, 1945, at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, at the place set down in column 6 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule.

3. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied per annum without further charge to properties rated by the Commission shall be the quantity which, if charged for at the amount per 1,000 gallons set down in column 5 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said schedule, would give an amount equal to that payable per annum in respect of the properties so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates.

4. For all water supplied per annum in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in clause 3 of this By-law the charge shall be one shilling per 1,000 gallons.

Such charge shall be payable on demand at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at the place mentioned in column 6 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule.

5. For the supply of water by measure from the pipes of the Commission to lands and tenements (within the respective Urban Districts and Urban Divisions as set out hereunder) which are not liable to any rate made under any By-law of the Commission—

The charge to be paid for water so supplied shall, except in cases of special agreements with the Commission, be such amount per 1,000 gallons as is set down in column 5 opposite the name of such Urban District or Urban Division in column 1 of the schedule hereto: Provided that where any minimum annual charge has been fixed by the Commission, the quantity of water to be supplied for such minimum annual charge in each case shall, except in cases of special agreements with the Commission, be the quantity which, if charged for at the amount per 1,000 gallons set down in column 5 opposite the name of such Urban District or Urban Division in column 1 of the said schedule, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of such minimum annual charge, and for all water supplied in excess of such quantity the charge shall be 1s. per 1,000 gallons.

6. The charges as set out in clause 5 of this By-law are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1945, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1946, and shall be payable on demand at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at the place mentioned in column 6 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said schedule.

7. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water.

- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division as shown coloured red on the aforesaid plans—a Drainage Rate of Two and one-fourth pence in the pound of the unimproved capital value of such lands.
- (3) Of all lands in the Third Division as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plans—a Drainage Rate of One and one-half pence in the pound of the unimproved capital value of such lands.

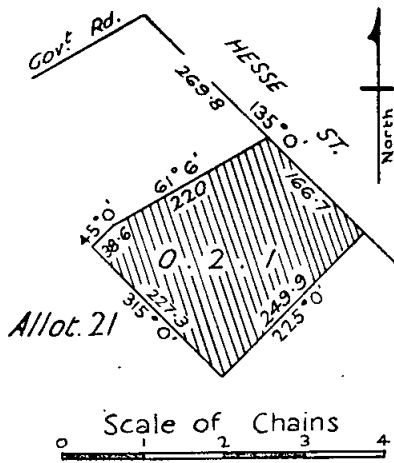

**DIRECTION TO CONTINUE SUPPLY OF WATER TO
MITIAMO URBAN DISTRICT.**

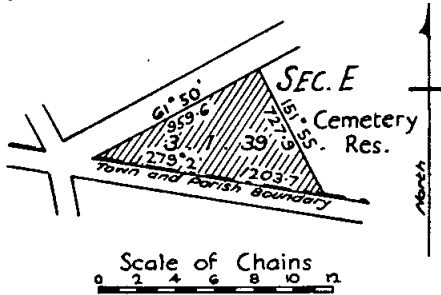

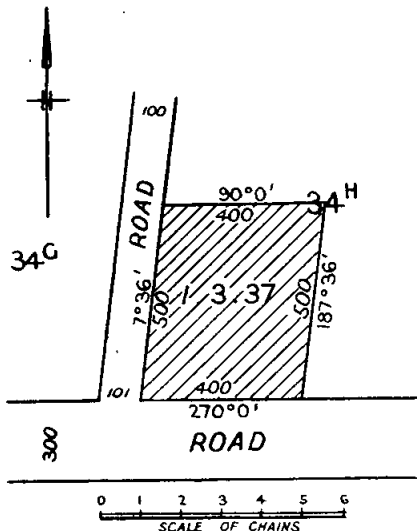

The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender. *Savings Bank deposit book, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits.* Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of one year, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. 1. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedules the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. *The supplies are*

to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary, Education Department, or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

9. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be forwarded by the contractor to the officer authorized to accept delivery, who shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach same to his claim for payment.

10. All orders, duly receipted, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account in the prescribed form for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time to be allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to have been made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to: but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in Clause 7.

13. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

14. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and

Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 15, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in clause 7.

15. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in Clause 7.

16. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

17. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 14 and 15 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the said Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of one year from the date of such disqualification.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the said Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

19. The contracts entered into under these conditions are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for supplies to Technical Schools, or by any article being made at any Government establishment and supplied for the use of the Education Department, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

20. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in Clause 20, will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

22. Should the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being decide to discontinue the use of any book, map, or any other article in the schedule, or to direct that any book, map,

or any other article other than those enumerated therein be taken into use, he shall at any time give six months' notice of such intention or decision to the contractor, and after the expiration of the period of such notice the Education Department shall not be bound to take any further supply of such book, map, or any other article, nor shall the contractor be bound to supply the same, and all books or maps not in the schedule, but which it may be decided to introduce, shall be supplied by the contractor after expiration of such notice at a price to be agreed on between the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being and the contractor.

CITY OF BENDIGO.

BY-LAW No. 65.

A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made under the provisions of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1928 and section 80 of the Health Act 1928, and numbered 65, for suppressing nuisances: for the regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of animals (including birds) in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous, and generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1928 and the Health Act 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—
 "Animal" includes bird.
 "Premises" includes any building and any land.
2. (i) This clause shall apply in respect of any premises whenever—
 (a) At least six persons lodge with the Town Clerk a complaint, in writing, signed by them, in which they state that they are ratepayers residing within hearing of the sound of animals on the premises, and that the noise made by an animal or animals on the premises is a nuisance to persons who reside in the neighbourhood; and
 (b) the Council is satisfied that a prima facie case exists for the suppression of such nuisance; and
 (c) the Town Clerk gives to the occupier or one of the occupiers of the premises a notice stating that under this By-law there has been made a complaint that the noise made by an animal or animals on the premises is a nuisance to persons who reside in the neighbourhood, and calling on the occupier or occupiers of the premises to cause the nuisance to be abated within seven days after the service of the notice.

(ii) After the expiration of seven days from the service of a notice given pursuant to this clause, no persons shall have on the premises, or keep on the premises, or allow to remain on the premises, any animal or animals that make noises so as to be a nuisance to any persons residing in the neighbourhood of the premises.

3. (i) This clause shall apply in respect of any premises whenever—

(a) The Council resolves that, in its opinion, any dog or dogs that are on the premises, or are kept on the premises, or are allowed to remain on the premises, are, or are so kept, as to be offensive or injurious to health or dangerous; and

(b) the Town Clerk gives to the occupier or one of the occupiers of the premises a notice setting out the resolution of the Council, and calling on the occupier or occupiers of the premises, within seven days after service of the notice, to remove all dogs on the premises that are offensive or injurious to health, or dangerous.

(ii) After the expiration of seven days from the service of a notice given pursuant to this clause, no persons shall have on the premises, or keep on the premises, or allow to remain on the premises, any dog to which the resolution of the Council refers.

4. Any notice to an occupier of any premises for the purposes of this By-law shall be deemed to be properly given and served if the notice—

(a) is signed by the Town Clerk, or by any person acting as Town Clerk;

(b) is addressed either to the occupier by name, or to the occupier described as such without his name; and

(c) is left at any dwelling-house on the premises, or at the place of residence of the person who is the occupier, or is sent by registered letter directed to the occupier, either by name or described as such without his name, at the premises or at his place of residence—

and any notice so given and served shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which it is so left, or, if posted, on the day following the day of posting.

5. (i) Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than £5.

(ii) Any person who wilfully continues an offence in respect of a breach of any provisions of this By-law, after a conviction or order of the Court in respect of a breach of the same provisions, shall be liable, on conviction, to a further penalty of not more than £1 for each day on which the offence is so continued.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Bendigo.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council on the 10th day of September, 1945, and confirmed on the 22nd day of October, 1945.

CITY OF MALVERN.

BY-LAW No. 117.

A By-law of the City of Malvern, made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and numbered 117, for determining, applying, or dispensing with, or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said City of Malvern under the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Malvern order as follows:—

Brick Areas.

1. The areas set out and described in the Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas and no person shall in any such area construct or cause to be constructed any building the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone, or concrete.

Limit of Two Storeys.

2. The whole of the municipal district is hereby prescribed as an area in which buildings of Classes II, and III, occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than two storeys, including the ground storey, and no person shall in such area construct a building of Class II, or III, occupancy to contain more than two storeys including the ground storey.

Minimum Area, Depth, and Width of Frontage.

3. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in Column 3 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations) are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building of Classes I, or II, shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district.

Distance from Street Alinement.

4. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building of Classes I, or II, occupancy from the street alinement of any land is hereby specified as 25 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building of Class I, or Class II, occupancy closer to the street alinement of any land than 25 feet.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations any person may—

(a) construct a building of Class I, occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in Column 3 of Table 803 of the Regulations, or in Clause 4 of this By-law (as the case may be) or—

(b) construct a building of Class III, V, VI, VII, or VIII, occupancy or a building to which a building of Class IV, occupancy is attached on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in Clause 809 of the Regulations, in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

Rear Access.

6. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of Clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.

7. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect as on and from the 1st day of November, 1945.

SCHEDULE.

1. All that area within the City of Malvern, commencing at the intersection of Kooyong-road and Gardiner's Creek and bounded by Gardiner's Creek to Warrigal-road, Warrigal-road to Waverley-road, Waverley-road to Dandenong-road, Dandenong-road to Kooyong-road, and Kooyong-road to Gardiner's Creek.

2. All that area within the City of Malvern, commencing at the intersection of Dandenong-road and Waverley-road and bounded by Waverley-road to Burke-road, Burke-road to Dandenong-road, and Dandenong-road to Waverley-road.

3. All that area within the City of Malvern, commencing at the intersection of Darling-road and Waverley-road and bounded by Waverley-road to Chadstone-road, Chadstone-road to Dandenong-road, Dandenong-road to Darling-road, and Darling-road to Waverley-road.

4. All that area within the City of Malvern, being the land abutting on the south side of Waverley-road between Burke-road and Darling-road to a depth of 150 feet, abutting on the west side of Darling-road between Waverley-road and Dandenong-road to a depth of 150 feet, abutting on the north side of Dandenong-road between Darling-road and Burke-road to a depth of 150 feet, and abutting on the east side of Burke-road between Dandenong-road and Waverley-road to a depth of 150 feet.

5. All that area within the City of Malvern, being the land abutting on the south side of Waverley-road between Chadstone-road and Warrigal-road to a depth of 150 feet, abutting on the west side of Warrigal-road between Waverley-road and Dandenong-road to a depth of 150 feet, abutting on the north side of Dandenong-road between Warrigal-road and Chadstone-road to a depth of 150 feet, and abutting on the east side of Chadstone-road between Dandenong-road and Waverley-road to a depth of 150 feet.

CITY OF OAKLEIGH.

BY-LAW No. 69.

A By-law of the City of Oakleigh, made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and numbered 69, for determining, applying, dispensing with or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said City under the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Oakleigh order as follows:—

Brick Areas.

1. The areas set out and described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas, and no person shall in any such area construct or cause to be constructed any building the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone, or concrete.

Minimum Area, Depth, and Width of Frontage.

2. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in Column 3 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations) are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district.

Distance from Street Alinement.

3. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building of Classes I. or II. occupancy from the street alinement of any land is hereby specified as 25 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building of Classes I. or II. occupancy closer to the street alinement of any land than 25 feet.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations any person may:—

(a) construct a building of Class I. occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in Column 3 of Table 803 of the Regulations, or in Clause 3 of this By-law, or—

(b) construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV. occupancy is attached, on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in Clause 809 of the Regulations,

in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.
